## **SENATE BILL No. 1122**

February 19, 2008, Introduced by Senators PATTERSON, GLEASON, GILBERT, JELINEK, BIRKHOLZ, BARCIA, ALLEN, VAN WOERKOM, CROPSEY and HARDIMAN and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1996 PA 376, entitled "Michigan renaissance zone act,"

by amending section 8a (MCL 125.2688a), as amended by 2006 PA 476.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 8a. (1) Except as provided in subsections (2), (3), and

(4), the board shall not designate more than 9 additional renaissance zones within this state under this section. Not more than 6 of the renaissance zones shall be located in urban areas and not more than 5 of the renaissance zones shall be located in rural areas. For purposes of determining whether a renaissance zone is located in an urban area or rural area under this section, if any part of a renaissance zone is located within an urban area, the entire renaissance zone shall be considered to be located in an urban area.

- 1 (2) The board of the Michigan strategic fund described in
- 2 section 4 of the Michigan strategic fund act, 1984 PA 270, MCL
- 3 125.2004, may designate not more than 13-18 additional renaissance
- 4 zones within this state in 1 or more cities, villages, or townships
- 5 if that city, village, or township or combination of cities,
- 6 villages, or townships consents to the creation of a renaissance
- 7 zone within their boundaries. The board of the Michigan strategic
- 8 fund may designate not more than 1-6 of the 13-18 additional
- 9 renaissance zones described in this subsection as an alternative
- 10 energy zone. An alternative energy zone shall promote and increase
- 11 the research, development, testing, and manufacturing of
- 12 alternative energy technology, alternative energy systems, and
- 13 alternative energy vehicles, as those terms are defined in the
- 14 Michigan next energy authority act, 2002 PA 593, MCL 207.821 to
- 15 207.827. An alternative energy zone shall have a duration of
- 16 renaissance zone status for a period not to exceed 20 years as
- 17 determined by the board of the Michigan strategic fund. NOT FEWER
- 18 THAN 5 OF THE ALTERNATIVE ENERGY ZONES SHALL FOCUS PRIMARILY ON THE
- 19 PRODUCTION OF CELLUOSIC ETHANOL. Not later than April 16, 2004, the
- 20 board of the Michigan strategic fund may designate not more than 1
- 21 of the 13-18 additional renaissance zones described in this
- 22 subsection as a pharmaceutical renaissance zone. A pharmaceutical
- 23 renaissance zone shall promote and increase the research,
- 24 development, and manufacturing of pharmaceutical products of an
- 25 eligible pharmaceutical company. The board of the Michigan
- 26 strategic fund may designate not more than 8 of the additional 13
- 27 18 renaissance zones described in this subsection as a

- 1 redevelopment renaissance zone. A redevelopment renaissance zone
- 2 shall promote the redevelopment of existing industrial facilities
- 3 or the development of property for industrial purposes. Before
- 4 designating a renaissance zone under this subsection, the board of
- 5 the Michigan strategic fund may enter into a development agreement
- 6 with the city, township, or village in which the renaissance zone
- 7 will be located and the owner or developer of the facility or
- 8 property located in the renaissance zone. The development agreement
- 9 for a redevelopment renaissance zone described only in subsection
- 10 (6)(b)(vi) or (vii) may provide for the payment of 1 or more of the
- 11 taxes described in section 9.
- 12 (3) In addition to the not more than 9 additional renaissance
- 23 zones described in subsection (1), the board may designate
- 14 additional renaissance zones within this state in 1 or more
- 15 qualified local governmental units if that qualified local
- 16 governmental unit or units contain a military installation that was
- 17 operated by the United States department of defense and was closed
- 18 in 1977 or after 1990.
- 19 (4) Land owned by a county or the qualified local governmental
- 20 unit or units adjacent to a zone as described in subsection (3) may
- 21 be included in this zone.
- 22 (5) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, property
- 23 located in the alternative energy zone that is classified as
- 24 commercial real property under section 34c of the general property
- 25 tax act, 1893 PA 206, MCL 211.34c, and that the authority, with the
- 26 concurrence of the assessor of the local tax collecting unit,
- 27 determines is not used to directly promote and increase the

- 1 research, development, testing, and manufacturing of alternative
- 2 energy technology, alternative energy systems, and alternative
- 3 energy vehicles as those terms are defined in the Michigan next
- 4 energy authority act, 2002 PA 593, MCL 207.821 to 207.827, is not
- 5 eligible for any exemption, deduction, or credit under section 9.
- 6 (6) As used in this section:
- 7 (a) "Eligible pharmaceutical company" means a company that
- 8 meets all of the following criteria:
- 9 (i) Is engaged primarily in manufacturing, research and
- 10 development, and sale of pharmaceuticals.
- 11 (ii) Has not less than 8,499 employees located in this state,
- 12 all of whom are located within a 100-mile radius of each other.
- 13 (iii) Of the total number of employees located in this state,
- 14 has not less than 4,800 engaged primarily in research and
- 15 development of pharmaceuticals.
- 16 (b) "Redevelopment renaissance zone" means a renaissance zone
- 17 that meets 1 of the following:
- 18 (i) All of the following:
- 19 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than 7,500
- 20 and less than 8,500 and is located in a county with a population of
- 21 more than 60,000 and less than 70,000.
- 22 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site of
- 23 200 or more acres.
- 24 (ii) All of the following:
- 25 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than 13,000
- 26 and less than 14,000 and is located in a county with a population
- 27 of more than 1,000,000 and less than 1,300,000.

- 1 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site of
- 2 300 or more contiguous acres.
- 3 (iii) All of the following:
- 4 (A) Is located in a township with a population of more than
- 5 5,500 and is located in a county with a population of less than
- 6 24,000.
- 7 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site of
- 8 more than 850 acres and has railroad access.
- 9 (iv) All of the following:
- 10 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than 40,000
- 11 and less than 44,000 and is located in a county with a population
- 12 of more than 81,000 and less than 87,000.
- 13 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site of
- 14 more than 475 acres.
- 15 (v) All of the following:
- 16 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than 21,000
- 17 and less than 26,000 and is located in a county with a population
- 18 of more than 573,000 and less than 625,000.
- 19 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site of
- 20 less than 45 acres in size.
- 21 (vi) All of the following:
- 22 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than
- 23 190,000 and less than 250,000 and is located in a county with a
- 24 population of more than 573,000 and less than 625,000.
- 25 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site of
- 26 more than 14 acres and less than 16 acres in size.
- (C) Is approved by the board of the Michigan strategic fund on

- 1 or before April 1, 2007.
- 2 (vii) All of the following:
- 3 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than 35,500
- 4 and less than 36,800 and is located in a county with a population
- 5 of more than 157,000 and less than 162,000.
- 6 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site
- 7 comprised of 1 or more adjacent parcels totaling 5 or more acres.
- 8 (C) Is approved by the board of the Michigan strategic fund on
- 9 or before April 1, 2007.
- 10 (viii) All of the following:
- 11 (A) Is located in a city with a population of more than 40,000
- 12 and less than 44,000 and is located in a county with a population
- 13 of more than 81,000 and less than 87,000.
- 14 (B) Contains only all or a portion of an industrial site
- 15 composed of 1 or more adjacent parcels totaling 100 or more acres.
- 16 (C) Is approved by the board of the Michigan strategic fund on
- 17 or before April 1, 2008.
