## HOUSE BILL No. 4324

A bill to amend 1919 PA 339, entitled

"Dog law of 1919,"

by amending section 6 (MCL 287.266), as amended by 2000 PA 438.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 6. (1) The owner of a dog that is 4 or more months old
 shall apply to the treasurer of the county or, except as provided
 in section 14, the treasurer of the township or city where the
 owner resides, or to the treasurer's authorized agent, for a
 license for each dog owned or kept by him or her.

6 (2) Unless the county board of commissioners adopts a
7 resolution under subsection (3), the owner shall apply for a
8 license annually on or before March 1.

9 (3) The county board of commissioners of a county may adopt a10 resolution during the 60-day period before the beginning of the

1 county's fiscal year providing when the owner of a dog that is
2 required to be licensed under subsection (1) must apply for a
3 license. Before adopting the resolution, the county board of
4 commissioners shall obtain the county treasurer's written approval
5 of the resolution. Subject to subsection (4), the resolution shall
6 provide for 1 of the following:

7 (a) That the owner apply for a license by March 1 every year8 or every third year, at the owner's option.

9 (b) That the owner apply for a license by June 1 every year.
10 (c) That the owner apply for a license by June 1 every year or
11 every third year, at the owner's option.

12 (d) That the owner apply for a license by the last day of the13 month of the dog's current rabies vaccination, every year.

14 (e) That the owner apply for a license by the last day of the15 month of the dog's current rabies vaccination, every third year.

16 (f) That the owner apply for a license by 1 of the following,17 at the owner's option:

18 (i) The last day of the month of the dog's current rabies19 vaccination every year.

20 (*ii*) The last day of the month of the dog's current rabies21 vaccination, every third year.

(4) A resolution adopted under subsection (3) shall include
necessary provisions for conversion to a new licensing schedule.
The resolution may extend the effective period of outstanding
licenses but shall not shorten the effective period of outstanding
licenses or prorate license fees.

(5) The application shall state the breed, sex, age, color,

and markings of the dog, and the name and address of the last 1 previous owner. The EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS 2 3 SUBSECTION, THE application for a license shall be accompanied by a 4 valid certificate of a current vaccination for rabies, with a 5 vaccine licensed by the United States department of agriculture, 6 signed by an accredited veterinarian. The certificate for vaccination for rabies shall state the month and year of expiration 7 for the rabies vaccination, in the veterinarian's opinion. IF THE 8 APPLICATION FOR A LICENSE IS SUBMITTED ELECTRONICALLY, THE OWNER OF 9 THE DOG IS NOT REQUIRED TO PROVIDE A VALID CERTIFICATE OF A CURRENT 10 11 VACCINATION FOR RABIES IF THE DOG WAS LICENSED THE PREVIOUS YEAR 12 AND THE DOG'S CURRENT RABIES VACCINATION ON RECORD WITH THE TREASURER OF THE COUNTY OR, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 14, THE 13 TREASURER OF THE TOWNSHIP OR CITY WHERE THE OWNER RESIDES, OR THE 14 TREASURER'S AUTHORIZED AGENT, IS STILL VALID. A license shall not 15 16 be issued under subsection (3)(d), (e), or (f) if the dog's current 17 rabies vaccination will expire more than 1 month before the date on 18 which that license would expire. When applying for a license, the 19 owner shall pay the license fee provided for in the county budget. 20 The county board of commissioners may set license fees in the 21 county budget at a level sufficient to pay all the county's 22 expenses of administering this act as it pertains to dogs. For a 23 spayed or neutered dog, the license fee, if any, shall be set lower 24 than the license fee for a dog that is not spayed or neutered. In 25 addition, the license fee may be set higher for a delinquent 26 application than for a timely application.

(6) If a dog is licensed before it becomes 5 months old and is

subsequently spayed or neutered before it becomes 7 months old, the
 owner of the dog may exchange the license for a license for a
 spayed or neutered dog and receive a refund for the difference in
 the cost of the licenses. The owner shall exchange the license
 before the dog becomes 7 months old.

6 (7) Subsection (6) applies in a county only if the county
7 board of commissioners adopts a resolution to that effect during
8 the 60-day period before the beginning of the county's fiscal year.
9 Before adopting the resolution, the county board of commissioners
10 shall obtain the county treasurer's written approval of the
11 resolution.

12 (8) The owner of a dog that is required to be licensed under
13 this section shall keep the dog currently vaccinated against rabies
14 by an accredited veterinarian with a vaccine licensed by the United
15 States department of agriculture.
