More importantly, however I believe that with these tremendous natural resources comes great responsibility - that we, as public servants in this state, must act as vigilant stewards of the environment, always working to ensure that we are able to hand down to the next generation Michigan's legacy of health, history, and exceptional beauty.

As Chair of the House Committee on Great Lakes and the Environment, I believe that House Bill 4446 and the severe cuts it inflicts upon the Departments of Natural Resources and Environmental Quality flies in the very face of this stewardship.

While I am well aware of the dire financial constraints we are under in the state of Michigan, I cannot, in good conscience, vote for a budget that eliminates our Wetlands Regulatory Program and makes such significant cuts to critical programs like the landmark Water Withdrawal Assessment Program, the Radiological Protection Program, Aquatic Nuisance Control Program, Pollution Prevention/Compliance Assistance Program, On-Site Wastewater Program and the Hazardous Waste Management Program.
