Whereas, The Michigan House of Representatives and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency are supporting efforts to encourage Americans to test their homes for radon, mitigate elevated levels of radon, and build new homes with radon-resistant materials and features; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the members of this legislative body declare January 2012 as Radon Action Month in the state of Michigan.

 - (i) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2013, 5 OR MORE.
 - (ii) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2014, 4 OR MORE.
 - (iii) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2015, 3 OR MORE.".

- (ii) BEGINNING 2 YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, 4 OR MORE.
- (iii) BEGINNING 3 YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT THAT ADDED THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, 3 OR MORE.".
