

**SUBSTITUTE FOR  
SENATE BILL NO. 466**

A bill to prescribe the senior or vulnerable adult medical alert as the official response to reports of certain missing persons; to provide for the broadcast of information regarding those incidents; and to provide for certain civil immunity.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:**

1       Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the  
2 "Mozelle senior or vulnerable adult medical alert act".

3       Sec. 2. As used in this act:

4       (a) "Missing senior or vulnerable adult" means a resident of  
5 this state who is 1 of the following:

6       (i) At least 60 years of age and is believed to be incapable of  
7 returning to his or her residence without assistance and is  
8 reported missing by a person familiar with that individual.

1           (ii) A vulnerable adult, as that term is defined in section  
2 145m of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145m, who is  
3 reported missing by a person familiar with that individual.

4           (iii) A person who is missing and suffering from senility or a  
5 physical or mental condition that subjects the person or others to  
6 personal and immediate danger.

7           (b) "Person familiar with the missing senior or vulnerable  
8 adult" means a missing senior's or vulnerable adult's guardian,  
9 custodian, or guardian ad litem or an individual who provides the  
10 missing senior or vulnerable adult with home health aid services,  
11 possesses a health care power of attorney for the missing senior or  
12 vulnerable adult, has proof that the missing senior or vulnerable  
13 adult has a medical condition, or otherwise has information  
14 regarding the missing senior or vulnerable adult.

15           Sec. 3. A law enforcement agency that receives notice of a  
16 missing senior or vulnerable adult from a person familiar with the  
17 missing senior or vulnerable adult shall prepare a report on the  
18 missing senior or vulnerable adult. The report shall include the  
19 following:

20           (a) Relevant information obtained from the notification  
21 concerning the missing senior or vulnerable adult, including the  
22 following:

23           (i) A physical description of the missing senior or vulnerable  
24 adult.

25           (ii) The date, time, and place that the missing senior or  
26 vulnerable adult was last seen.

27           (iii) The missing senior's or vulnerable adult's address.

1 (b) Information gathered by a preliminary investigation, if  
2 one was made.

3 (c) A statement by the law enforcement officer in charge  
4 setting forth that officer's assessment of the case based upon the  
5 evidence and information received.

6 Sec. 4. The law enforcement agency shall prepare the report  
7 required by section 3 as soon as practicable after the law  
8 enforcement agency receives notification of a missing senior or  
9 vulnerable adult.

10 Sec. 5. (1) After obtaining the information identified in  
11 section 3, the law enforcement agency shall as soon as practicable  
12 forward that information to all of the following:

13 (a) All law enforcement agencies that have jurisdiction in the  
14 location where the missing senior or vulnerable adult resides and  
15 all law enforcement agencies that have jurisdiction in the location  
16 where the missing senior or vulnerable adult was last seen.

17 (b) All law enforcement agencies to which the person who made  
18 the notification concerning the missing senior or vulnerable adult  
19 requests the report be sent, if the law enforcement agency  
20 determines that the request is reasonable in light of the  
21 information received.

22 (c) All law enforcement agencies that request a copy of the  
23 report.

24 (d) One or more broadcasters that broadcast in an area where  
25 the missing senior or vulnerable adult may be located.

26 (2) Upon completion of the report required by section 3, a law  
27 enforcement agency may forward a copy of the contents of the report

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1 to 1 or more newspapers distributed in an area where the missing  
2 senior or vulnerable adult may be located.

3 (3) After forwarding the contents of the report to a  
4 broadcaster or newspaper under this section, the law enforcement  
5 agency shall request that the broadcaster or newspaper do the  
6 following:

7 (a) Notify the public that there is a [missing] senior or  
8 vulnerable  
9 adult medical alert.

10 (b) Broadcast or publish a description of the missing senior  
11 or vulnerable adult and any other relevant information that would  
12 assist in locating the missing senior or vulnerable adult.

13 Sec. 6. A law enforcement agency shall begin an investigation  
14 concerning the missing senior or vulnerable adult as soon as  
15 possible after receiving notification of a missing senior or  
16 vulnerable adult.

17 Sec. 7. A person familiar with the missing senior or  
18 vulnerable adult who notifies a law enforcement agency concerning a  
19 missing senior or vulnerable adult shall notify the law enforcement  
20 agency when he or she becomes aware that the missing senior or  
21 vulnerable adult has been found.

22 Sec. 8. (1) A broadcaster or newspaper that notifies the  
23 public that there is a [missing] senior or vulnerable adult medical alert  
24 and  
25 broadcasts or publishes to the public information contained in the  
26 report forwarded to the broadcaster or newspaper by a law  
27 enforcement agency, including a description of the missing senior  
or vulnerable adult and any other relevant information that would  
assist in locating the missing senior or vulnerable adult, is

1 immune from civil liability for an act or omission related to the  
2 broadcast or the publication of the newspaper.

3 (2) The civil immunity described in subsection (1) does not  
4 apply to an act or omission that constitutes gross negligence or  
5 willful, wanton, or intentional misconduct.
