19 **GENERAL SECTIONS**

20 Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of  
 21 article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending  
 22 from state resources in this appropriation act for the fiscal year  
 23 ending September 30, 2012 is \$0 and state appropriations paid to  
 24 local units of government are \$0.

25 Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are

1 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101  
2 to 18.1594.

3 **DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES**

4       Sec. 301. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for state  
5 emergency relief energy services, on a 1-time basis only,  
6 \$62,000,000.00 in federal temporary assistance for needy families  
7 funding under 42 USC 601 to 619 is appropriated to assist needy  
8 families facing emergencies because of circumstances beyond their  
9 control by preventing utility shutoffs, restoring utilities, or  
10 taking other action.
