HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 623

A bill to amend 2000 PA 258, entitled "Career and technical preparation act,"

by amending section 3 (MCL 388.1903), as amended by 2005 PA 181.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. (1) As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Career and technical preparation program" means a program
- 3 that teaches a trade, occupation, or vocation and that is operated
- 4 by an eligible postsecondary educational institution located in
- 5 this state.
- 6 (b) "Community college" means a community college established
- 7 under the community college act of 1966, 1966 PA 331, MCL 389.1 to
- 8 389.195, or under part 25 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451,

- 1 MCL 380.1601 to 380.1607, or a federal tribally controlled
- 2 community college located in this state that is recognized under
- 3 the tribally controlled community college COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES
- 4 assistance act of 1978, 25 USC 1801 to 1852, and is determined by
- 5 the department to meet the requirements for accreditation by a
- 6 recognized regional accrediting body.
- 7 (c) "Department" means the department of labor and economic
- 8 growth.EDUCATION.
- 9 (d) "Eligible charges" means tuition and mandatory course
- 10 fees, material fees, and registration fees required by a career and
- 11 technical preparation program for enrollment in an eligible course.
- 12 Eligible charges also include any late fees charged by a career and
- 13 technical preparation program due to the school district's OR
- 14 DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY'S failure to make a required payment
- 15 according to the timetable prescribed under this act. Eligible
- 16 charges do not include transportation or parking costs or activity
- 17 fees.
- (e) "Eligible course" means a course offered by a career and
- 19 technical preparation program THAT IS OFFERED FOR POSTSECONDARY
- 20 CREDIT OR IS PART OF A NONCREDIT OCCUPATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM
- 21 LEADING TO AN INDUSTRY-RECOGNIZED CREDENTIAL; that is not offered
- 22 through the school district, intermediate school district, or area
- 23 vocational-technical education program, OR STATE APPROVED NONPUBLIC
- 24 SCHOOL in which the eligible student is enrolled, or that is
- 25 offered through the school district, intermediate school district,
- 26 or—area vocational-technical education program, OR STATE APPROVED
- 27 NONPUBLIC SCHOOL but is determined by its governing board to not be

- 1 available to the eligible student because of a scheduling conflict
- 2 beyond the eligible student's control; that is a career and
- 3 technical preparation course not ordinarily taken as an activity
- 4 course; that is a course that the career and technical preparation
- 5 program normally applies toward satisfaction of certificate,
- 6 degree, or program completion requirements; and that is not a hobby
- 7 craft or recreational course. FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL ELIGIBLE STUDENT,
 [UNLESS THERE IS A WRITTEN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S
 SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE CAREER AND TECHNICAL PREPARATION PROGRAM TO WAIVE
 THESE LIMITS,]
- 8 A COURSE DESCRIBED IN THIS SUBDIVISION IS NOT AN ELIGIBLE COURSE IF
- 9 THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S ENROLLMENT IN, AND THE PAYMENT OF ELIGIBLE
- 10 CHARGES UNDER THIS ACT FOR, THE COURSE WOULD EXCEED THE FOLLOWING
- 11 LIMITS:
- 12 (i) NOT MORE THAN 10 COURSES OVERALL. THIS LIMIT AND THE LIMITS
- 13 UNDER SUBPARAGRAPHS (ii) TO (iv) DO NOT APPLY TO A COURSE IF THE
- 14 ELIGIBLE STUDENT DOES NOT RECEIVE TUITION AND FEE SUPPORT UNDER
- 15 THIS ACT FOR THAT COURSE.
- 16 (ii) IF THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT FIRST ENROLLS IN A COURSE UNDER
- 17 THIS ACT WHEN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT IS IN GRADE 9, NOT MORE THAN 2
- 18 COURSES DURING EACH ACADEMIC YEAR IN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S FIRST,
- 19 SECOND, OR THIRD ACADEMIC YEAR OF ENROLLMENT UNDER THIS ACT IN A
- 20 CAREER AND TECHNICAL [PREPARATION] PROGRAM AND NOT MORE THAN 4 COURSES
- 21 DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR IN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S FOURTH ACADEMIC
- 22 YEAR OF ENROLLMENT UNDER THIS ACT IN A CAREER AND TECHNICAL
- 23 [PREPARATION] PROGRAM.
- 24 (iii) IF THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT FIRST ENROLLS IN A COURSE UNDER
- 25 THIS ACT WHEN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT IS IN GRADE 10, NOT MORE THAN 2
- 26 COURSES DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR IN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S FIRST
- 27 ACADEMIC YEAR OF ENROLLMENT UNDER THIS ACT IN A CAREER AND

- 1 TECHNICAL [PREPARATION] PROGRAM, NOT MORE THAN 4 COURSES DURING THE
- 2 ACADEMIC YEAR IN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S SECOND ACADEMIC YEAR OF
- 3 ENROLLMENT UNDER THIS ACT IN A CAREER AND TECHNICAL [PREPARATION]
- 4 PROGRAM, AND NOT MORE THAN 4 COURSES DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR IN
- 5 THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S THIRD ACADEMIC YEAR OF ENROLLMENT UNDER THIS
- 6 ACT IN A CAREER AND TECHNICAL [PREPARATION] PROGRAM.
- 7 (iv) SUBJECT TO THE OVERALL COURSE LIMIT UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH
- 8 (i), IF THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT FIRST ENROLLS IN A COURSE UNDER THIS
- 9 ACT WHEN THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT IS IN GRADE 11 OR 12, NOT MORE THAN 6
- 10 COURSES DURING EITHER OF THOSE ACADEMIC YEARS OF ENROLLMENT IN A
- 11 CAREER AND TECHNICAL [PREPARATION] PROGRAM.
- 12 (f) "Eligible postsecondary educational institution" means a
- 13 state university, community college, or independent nonprofit
- 14 degree-granting college or university that is located in this state
- 15 and that chooses to comply with this act.
- 16 (g) "Eligible student" means a student enrolled in at least 1
- 17 high school class in at least grade 11 in a school district OR
- 18 STATE APPROVED NONPUBLIC SCHOOL in this state, except a foreign
- 19 exchange pupil enrolled in a school district under a cultural
- 20 exchange program OR A STUDENT WHO DOES NOT HAVE AT LEAST 1 PARENT
- 21 OR LEGAL GUARDIAN WHO IS A RESIDENT OF THIS STATE. Until the 2006-
- 22 2007 school year, to be an eligible student a student must have
- 23 achieved state endorsement in all subject areas under section 1279
- of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.1279, and,
- 25 HOWEVER, subject to subsection (2), the student shall not have been
- 26 enrolled in high school for more than 4 school years including the
- 27 school year in which the student seeks to enroll in an eligible

- 1 course under this act. However, if the student has not achieved
- 2 state endorsement in all subject areas under that section, the
- 3 student is an eligible student if the student achieves state
- 4 endorsement in mathematics and a qualifying score on a nationally
- 5 or industry recognized job skills assessment test as determined by
- 6 the department. Beginning with eligibility to participate under
- 7 this act during the 2006-2007 school year, to TO be an eligible
- 8 student, a student who has not taken the Michigan merit examination
- 9 must have achieved a qualifying score in all subject areas on a
- 10 readiness assessment and a student who has taken the Michigan merit
- 11 examination must have achieved a qualifying score in all subject
- 12 areas on the Michigan merit examination, and, subject to subsection
- 13 (2), the student shall not have been enrolled in high school for
- 14 more than 4 school years including the school year in which the
- 15 student seeks to enroll in an eligible course under this act.
- 16 However, if the student has not achieved a qualifying score in all
- 17 subject areas on a readiness assessment or the Michigan merit
- 18 examination, as applicable for the student, the student is an
- 19 eligible student if the student achieves a qualifying score in
- 20 mathematics and a qualifying score on a nationally or industry
- 21 recognized job skills assessment test as determined by the
- 22 superintendent of public instruction. For the purposes of
- 23 determining the number of years a pupil has been enrolled in high
- 24 school, a pupil who is enrolled in high school for less than 90
- 25 days of a school year due to illness or other circumstances beyond
- 26 the control of the pupil or the pupil's parent or guardian is not
- 27 considered to be enrolled in high school for that school year.

- 1 (h) "Intermediate school district" means that term as defined
- 2 in section 4 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.4.
- 3 (i) "Michigan merit examination" means that examination
- 4 developed under section 1279g of the revised school code, 1976 PA
- **5** 451, MCL 380.1279g.
- 6 (j) "Qualifying score" means a score on a readiness assessment
- 7 or on a nationally or industry recognized job skills assessment
- 8 test that has been determined by the superintendent of public
- 9 instruction to indicate readiness to enroll in a course under this
- **10** act.
- 11 (k) "Readiness assessment" means assessment instruments that
- 12 are aligned with state learning standards; that are used nationally
- 13 to provide high school students with an early indication of college
- 14 readiness proficiency in English, mathematics, reading, social
- 15 studies, and science and may contain a comprehensive career
- 16 planning program; and that are approved by the superintendent of
- 17 public instruction for the purposes of this act.
- 18 (1) "School district" means that term as defined in section 6
- 19 of the revised school code, 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.6, a local act
- 20 school district as defined in section 5 of the revised school code,
- 21 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.5, or a public school academy organized under
- 22 AS DEFINED IN SECTION 5 OF the revised school code, 1976 PA 451,
- 23 MCL 380.1 to 380.1852.380.5.
- 24 (M) "STATE APPROVED NONPUBLIC SCHOOL" MEANS THAT TERM AS
- 25 DEFINED IN SECTION 6 OF THE REVISED SCHOOL CODE, 1976 PA 451, MCL
- 26 380.6.
- 27 (N) (m)—"State university" means a state institution of higher

- 1 education described in section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the
- 2 state constitution of 1963.
- 3 (2) The department, in consultation with the superintendent of
- 4 public instruction, shall promulgate rules establishing criteria
- 5 and procedures under which a student who has been enrolled in high
- 6 school for more than 4 years but not more than 5 years may be
- 7 considered to be an eligible student. The rules shall address
- 8 special circumstances under which a student may qualify to be
- 9 considered an eligible student under this subsection and may limit
- 10 the number of courses in which a student who qualifies under this
- 11 subsection may enroll. For the purposes of determining the number
- 12 of years a pupil has been enrolled in high school, a pupil who is
- 13 enrolled in high school for less than 90 days of a school year due
- 14 to illness or other circumstances beyond the control of the pupil
- 15 or the pupil's parent or guardian is not considered to be enrolled
- 16 for that school year.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect July 1,
- **18** 2012.
- 19 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 20 unless all of the following bills of the 96th Legislature are
- 21 enacted into law:
