A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled
"The state school aid act of 1979,"

 3 RETIREMENT SYSTEM UNDER THE PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT ACT
 4 OF 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 TO 38.1408, AND THAT REPORTS
 5 EMPLOYEES TO THE MICHIGAN PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT

22 Sec. 203. Unless otherwise specified, a community college
 23 ~~receiving~~ **THAT RECEIVES** appropriations in section 201 and the
 24 workforce development agency shall use the ~~Internet~~ **INTERNET** to
 25 fulfill the reporting requirements of this article. This
 26 requirement may include transmission of reports via electronic mail
 27 to the recipients identified for each reporting requirement or it

1 may include placement of reports on an ~~Internet~~**INTERNET** or
2 ~~Intranet~~**INTRANET** site.

3 Sec. 204. Funds appropriated in section 201 shall not be used
4 for the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
5 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
6 services, or both, are available. Preference should be given to
7 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
8 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable
9 quality. In addition, preference should be given to goods or
10 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan
11 businesses **THAT ARE** owned and operated by veterans, if they are
12 competitively priced and of comparable quality.

13 Sec. 205. The principal executive officer of each community
14 college ~~receiving~~**THAT RECEIVES** appropriations in section 201 shall
15 take all reasonable steps to ensure businesses in deprived and
16 depressed communities compete for and perform contracts to provide
17 services or supplies, or both. Each principal executive officer
18 shall strongly encourage ~~firms~~**BUSINESSES** with which the community
19 college contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in
20 depressed and deprived communities for services or supplies, or
21 both.

 14 **AT LEAST 10 DAYS BEFORE WITHHOLDING FUNDS FROM ANY COMMUNITY**

16 Sec. 207. (1) A community college shall pay the employer's
 17 contributions to the Michigan public school employees' retirement
 18 system created by the public school employees retirement act of
 19 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 to 38.1408. ~~as~~ **THIS PAYMENT IS** a
 20 condition of receiving funds appropriated under this article.

21 (2) A community college shall not pay an employer's
 22 contribution to more than 1 retirement fund providing benefits for
 23 an employee.

24 Sec. 208. ~~Money~~ **A COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL NOT USE MONEY**
 25 appropriated in section 201 ~~shall not be used~~ to pay for the
 26 construction or maintenance of a self-liquidating project. A
 27 community college shall comply with the current use and finance

1 requirements of the joint capital outlay subcommittee (JCOS) for
2 any construction, renovation, or other capital outlay projects
3 pursuant to JCOS policy. The appropriation in section 201 for a
4 community college that fails to comply with JCOS requirements shall
5 be reduced by 1% for each violation.

7 CARD DEMONSTRATING THE COLLEGE'S PERFORMANCE IN SEVERAL "BEST
8 PRACTICE" MEASURES. THE DASHBOARD OR REPORT CARD SHALL INCLUDE AT

2 Sec. 210. (1) Recognizing the critical importance of education
3 in strengthening Michigan's workforce, the legislature encourages
4 ~~the state's public community colleges~~ **EACH COMMUNITY COLLEGE** to
5 explore ways of increasing collaboration and cooperation with 4-
6 year universities, particularly in the areas related to training,
7 instruction, and program articulation.

8 (2) Recognizing the central role of community colleges in
9 responding to local employment needs and challenges, community
10 colleges shall develop and continue efforts to collaborate with
11 local employers and students to identify local employment needs and
12 strategies to meet them.

13 (3) Community colleges are encouraged to collaborate with each
14 other on innovations to identify and meet local employment needs.

15 Sec. 212. It is the intent of the legislature to encourage
16 community college districts to evaluate and pursue efficiency and
17 cost-containment measures that maximize state funding. Community
18 colleges shall identify practices that increase efficiencies,
19 including, but not limited to, establishing joint ventures,
20 consolidating services, utilizing program collaborations,
21 maximizing educational benefits through optimal class sizes and
22 frequency of course offerings, increasing web-based instruction,
23 eliminating low-enrollment and high-cost instructional programs,
24 using self-insurance, practicing energy conservation, and utilizing
25 group purchasing. ~~Efficiency efforts~~ **COMMUNITY COLLEGES** shall also
26 ~~include reviewing~~ **REVIEW** proposed capital outlay projects to
27 increase coordination and utilization of new facilities, renovation

1 projects, and technology improvements.

2 Sec. 213. It is the intent of the legislature that community
3 colleges work with public universities in the state to implement
4 statewide reverse transfer agreements to increase the number of
5 students that are awarded credentials of value upon completion of
6 the necessary credits. ~~In doing so, the institutions should work~~
7 ~~collaboratively and cooperatively to remove administrative barriers~~
8 ~~that result in understating the academic attainment of Michigan's~~
9 ~~citizens. It is the intent of the legislature that by August 1,~~
10 ~~2012, THESE statewide agreements be in place between community~~
11 ~~colleges and public universities that SHALL enable students who~~
12 have earned a significant number of credits at a community college
13 and transfer to a baccalaureate-granting institution before
14 completing a degree to ~~transfer~~ **TRANSFERRED** the credits earned at
15 the baccalaureate institution back to the community college in
16 order to be awarded a credential of value.

17 Sec. 217. Unless otherwise **SPECIFICALLY** stated, all data items
18 used in determining state aid in this article are as defined in the
19 "2001 Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, Michigan Public
20 Community Colleges", which shall be the basis for reporting data,
21 and the "Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan
