# SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 171

A bill to make appropriations for community colleges and certain state purposes related to education for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2012; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide anticipated appropriations for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013; to establish or continue certain funds, programs, and categories; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments, institutions, agencies, employees, and officers.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

PART 1

| 5  | Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state          |
| 6  | constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources      |
| 7  | under part 1 for fiscal year 2011-2012 is \$285,880,500.00 and state |
| 8  | spending from state resources to be paid to local units of           |
| 9  | government for fiscal year 2011-2012 is \$285,880,500.00. The        |
| 10 | itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which        |
| 11 | spending to local units of government will occur:                    |

| 14 | Sec. 202. The appropriations authorized under this act are           |
| 15 | subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101   |
| 16 | to 18.1594.  |
| 17 | Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for         |
| 18 | the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if               |
| 19 | competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or     |
| 20 | services, or both, are available. Preference should be given to      |
| 21 | goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan     |
| 22 | businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable       |
| 23 | quality. In addition, preference should be given to goods or         |
| 24 | services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan     |
| 25 | businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are               |
| 26 | competitively priced and of comparable quality                       |

- 1 Sec. 210. The principal executive officer of each community 2 college receiving appropriations in part 1 shall take all 3 reasonable steps to ensure businesses in deprived and depressed 4 communities compete for and perform contracts to provide services 5 or supplies, or both. Each principal executive officer shall 6 strongly encourage firms with which the community college contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and deprived 7 communities for services or supplies, or both. 8 9 Sec. 211. The money appropriated in this act is appropriated 10 for community colleges with fiscal years ending June 30, 2012 and 11 shall be paid out of the state treasury and distributed by the 12 state treasurer to the respective community colleges in 11 monthly 13 installments on the sixteenth of each month, or the next succeeding business day, beginning with October 16, 2011. Each community 14 15 college shall accrue its July and August 2012 payments to its 16 institutional fiscal year ending June 30, 2012. However, if a 17 community college fails to submit all verified Michigan community 18 colleges activities classification structure data for school year 2010-2011 to the department of energy, labor, and economic growth 19 20 by November 1, 2011, the monthly installments shall be withheld 21 from that community college until those data are submitted. - Sec. 216. (1) A community college shall pay the employer's contributions to the Michigan public school employees' retirement
- 26 system created by the public school employees retirement act of
- 27 1979, 1980 PA 300, MCL 38.1301 to 38.1408, as a condition of

exceed the net state allocation authorized by this act.

- 1 receiving money appropriated under this act.
- 2 (2) A community college shall not pay an employer's
- 3 contribution to more than 1 retirement fund providing benefits for
- 4 an employee.
- 5 Sec. 217. Money appropriated in part 1 shall not be used to
- 6 pay for the construction or maintenance of a self-liquidating
- 7 project. A community college shall comply with the current use and
- 8 finance requirements of the joint capital outlay subcommittee
- 9 (JCOS) for any construction, renovation, or other capital outlay
- 10 projects pursuant to JCOS policy. The appropriation in part 1 for a
- 11 community college that fails to comply with JCOS requirements shall
- 12 be reduced by 1% for each violation.
- Sec. 224. (1) Recognizing the critical importance of education
- 14 in strengthening Michigan's workforce, the legislature encourages
- 15 the state's public community colleges to explore ways of increasing
- 16 collaboration and cooperation with 4-year universities,
- 17 particularly in the areas related to training, instruction, and
- 18 program articulation.
- 19 (2) Recognizing the central role of community colleges in
- 20 responding to local employment needs and challenges, community
- 21 colleges shall develop and continue efforts to collaborate with
- 22 local employers and students to identify local employment needs and
- 23 strategies to meet them.
- 24 (3) Community colleges are encouraged to collaborate with each
- 25 other on innovations to identify and meet local employment needs.
- 26 Sec. 234. Community colleges shall do the following:
- 27 (a) Undertake active measures to promote equal opportunities,

- 1 eliminate discrimination, and foster a diverse student body and
- 2 administration among all people including, but not limited to,
- 3 women, minorities, seniors, veterans, and people with disabilities.
- 4 (b) Review, analyze, and eradicate activities that may tend to
- 5 discriminate.
- 6 Sec. 247. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used to
- 7 enter into a lease for, or to purchase, a vehicle assembled or
- 8 manufactured outside of the United States if competitively priced
- 9 and comparable quality vehicles made in the state of Michigan or
- 10 elsewhere in the United States of America are available.
- Sec. 249. It is the intent of the legislature to encourage
- 12 community college districts to evaluate and pursue efficiency and
- 13 cost-containment measures that maximize state funding. Community
- 14 colleges shall identify practices that increase efficiencies,
- 15 including, but not limited to, establishing joint ventures,
- 16 consolidating services, utilizing program collaborations,
- 17 maximizing educational benefits through optimal class sizes and
- 18 frequency of course offerings, increasing web-based instruction,
- 19 eliminating low-enrollment and high-cost instructional programs,
- 20 using self-insurance, practicing energy conservation, and utilizing
- 21 group purchasing. Efficiency efforts shall also include reviewing
- 22 proposed capital outlay projects to increase coordination and
- 23 utilization of new facilities, renovation projects, and technology
- 24 improvements.
- 25 Sec. 250. (1) If the combined total of the maximum amount
- 26 appropriated under this act from the state school aid fund for
- 27 fiscal year 2011-2012 and the maximum amounts appropriated under

- 1 the public acts making appropriations for K-12 state school aid and
- 2 higher education for that fiscal year exceeds the amount available
- 3 for expenditure from the state school aid fund for that fiscal
- 4 year, payments under this act are subject to the proration provided
- 5 under this subsection and subsection (2). If proration is
- 6 necessary, state payments under this act from the state school aid
- 7 fund shall be prorated in the manner prescribed in subsection (2)
- 8 as necessary to reflect the amount available for expenditure from
- 9 the state school aid fund for fiscal year 2011-2012. However, if
- 10 the department of treasury determines that proration will be
- 11 required under this section, or if the department of treasury
- 12 determines that further proration is required under this section
- 13 after an initial proration has already been made for a fiscal year,
- 14 the department of treasury shall notify the state budget director,
- 15 and the state budget director shall notify the legislature in the
- 16 manner provided for proration under section 11 of the state school
- 17 aid act, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1611, and the legislature may take
- 18 action to prevent the proration as described in that section.
- 19 (2) If proration is necessary under subsection (1), the
- 20 department of treasury shall calculate the proration in payments
- 21 under this act that is required under subsection (1) as follows:
- 22 (a) The department of treasury shall calculate the percentage
- 23 of total state school aid allocated under this act and the public
- 24 acts making appropriations for K-12 state school aid and higher
- 25 education for the affected fiscal year that is used for payments
- 26 for community colleges under this act.
- 27 (b) The department of treasury shall recover a percentage of

- 1 the total proration amount required under subsection (1) that is
- 2 equal to the percentage calculated under subdivision (a) by
- 3 reducing payments to community colleges under this act on an equal
- 4 percentage basis.
- 5 Sec. 251. A community college shall not take disciplinary
- 6 action against an employee for communicating with a member of the
- 7 legislature or his or her staff.

#### 8 STATE AID - OPERATIONS

- 9 Sec. 301. Unless otherwise stated, all data items used in
- 10 determining state aid in this act are as defined in the "2001
- 11 Manual for Uniform Financial Reporting, Michigan Public Community
- 12 Colleges," which shall be the basis for reporting data, and the
- 13 "Activities Classification Structure Manual for Michigan Community
- 14 Colleges," as amended, which shall be used to document financial
- 15 needs of the community colleges.
- 16 Sec. 302. A community college shall not include in the
- 17 enrollment data reported for determining state aid under this act
- 18 any student credit hours or student contact hours for a student
- 19 incarcerated in a Michigan penal institution. Exclusion of these
- 20 students is intended to avoid the payment of state aid under this
- 21 act for the same individuals for whom reimbursement is provided by
- 22 the state correctional system.
- 23 Sec. 304. It is the intent of the legislature that the
- 24 recommendations and performance measures developed by the
- 25 performance indicators task force formed pursuant to section 242 of
- 26 2005 PA 154 be reviewed and more fully implemented for distribution

- 1 of state funding to community colleges in future years.
- 2 Specifically, it is the intent of the legislature that the
- 3 performance indicators task force review and implement 1 or more
- 4 measurable data items for the local strategic value indicator and
- 5 review and implement 1 or more measurable data items for an
- 6 administrative cost formula component.
- 7 Sec. 405. A community college receiving funds in part 1 shall
- 8 cooperate with the state's efforts to establish a statewide P-20
- 9 education longitudinal data system to comply with the state fiscal
- 10 stabilization fund provisions of the American recovery and
- 11 reinvestment act of 2009, Public Law 111-5.

# 12 REPORTS AND AUDITS

- Sec. 502. (1) The auditor general or a certified public
- 14 accountant appointed by the auditor general may conduct performance
- 15 audits of community colleges as the auditor general considers
- 16 necessary.
- 17 (2) Not more than 60 days after an audit report is released by
- 18 the office of the auditor general, the principal executive officer
- 19 of the community college that was audited shall submit to the house
- 20 and senate appropriations committees, the house and senate fiscal
- 21 agencies, the department of energy, labor, and economic growth, the
- 22 auditor general, and the state budget director a plan to comply
- 23 with audit recommendations. The plan shall contain projected dates
- 24 and resources required, if any, to achieve compliance with the
- 25 audit recommendations, or a documented explanation of the college's
- 26 noncompliance with the audit recommendations concerning the matters

- 1 on which the audited community college and office of the auditor
- 2 general disagree.
- 3 Sec. 504. (1) A community college shall retain certified class
- 4 summaries, class lists, registration documents, and student
- 5 transcripts that are consistent with the taxonomy of courses. For
- 6 each enrollment period during the fiscal year, these certified
- 7 documents shall identify clearly by course the number of in-
- 8 district and out-of-district student credit and contact hours. The
- 9 class summaries and class lists shall be consistent with each other
- 10 and shall include the course prefix and numbers, course title,
- 11 course credit and contact hours, credit and contact hours generated
- 12 by each student, and activity classifications consistent with the
- 13 taxonomy. An auditable process shall be used by the community
- 14 college to determine the unduplicated head count for in-district
- 15 students, out-of-district students, and prisoners for each
- 16 enrollment period during the fiscal year.
- 17 (2) Contracts between the community college and agencies that
- 18 reimburse the community college for the costs of instruction shall
- 19 be retained for audit purposes.
- Sec. 505. Each community college shall have an annual audit of
- 21 all income and expenditures performed by an independent auditor and
- 22 shall furnish the independent auditor's management letter and an
- 23 annual audited accounting of all general and current funds income
- 24 and expenditures including audits of college foundations to the
- 25 members of the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on
- 26 community colleges, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the
- 27 auditor general, the department of energy, labor, and economic

- 1 growth, and the state budget director before November 15, 2011. If
- 2 a community college fails to furnish the audit materials, the
- 3 monthly state aid installments shall be withheld from that college
- 4 until the information is submitted. All reporting shall conform to
- 5 the requirements set forth in the "2001 Manual for Uniform
- 6 Financial Reporting, Michigan Public Community Colleges."
- 7 Sec. 506. (1) Each community college shall report the
- 8 following to the department of energy, labor, and economic growth
- 9 no later than November 1, 2011:
- 10 (a) The number of North American Indian students enrolled each
- 11 term for the previous fiscal year, using guidelines and procedures
- 12 developed by the department of energy, labor, and economic growth
- 13 and the Michigan commission on Indian affairs.
- 14 (b) The number of North American Indian tuition waivers
- 15 granted each term, and the monetary value of the waivers for the
- 16 previous fiscal year.
- 17 (2) Colleges shall use the criteria cited in 1976 PA 174, MCL
- 18 390.1251 to 390.1253, to determine eligibility for tuition waivers,
- 19 and shall grant those waivers to individuals who meet the criteria
- 20 and request tuition waivers.
- Sec. 507. Upon request, a community college shall inform
- 22 interested Michigan high schools of the aggregate academic status
- 23 of its students for the prior academic year, in a manner prescribed
- 24 by the Michigan community college association and in cooperation
- 25 with the Michigan association of secondary school principals.
- 26 Sec. 508. Each community college shall report to the house and
- 27 senate fiscal agencies, the state budget director, and the

- 1 department of energy, labor, and economic growth by August 31,
- 2 2011, the tuition and mandatory fees paid by a full-time in-
- 3 district student and a full-time out-of-district student as
- 4 established by the college governing board for the 2011-2012
- 5 academic year. This report should also include the annual cost of
- 6 attendance based on a full-time course load of 30 credits. Each
- 7 community college shall also report any revisions to the reported
- 8 2011-2012 academic year tuition and mandatory fees adopted by the
- 9 college governing board to the house and senate fiscal agencies,
- 10 the state budget director, and the department of energy, labor, and
- 11 economic growth within 15 days of being adopted.
- Sec. 509. Each community college shall report to the
- 13 department of energy, labor, and economic growth the numbers and
- 14 type of associate degrees and other certificates awarded during the
- 15 previous fiscal year. The report shall be made not later than
- 16 November 15, 2011.

- 18 PROVISIONS CONCERNING ANTICIPATED APPROPRIATIONS
- **19** FOR FISCAL YEAR 2012-2013

## 20 GENERAL SECTIONS

- 21 Sec. 1201. It is the intent of the legislature to provide
- 22 appropriations for the fiscal year ending on September 30, 2013 for
- 23 the line items listed in part 1. The fiscal year 2012-2013
- 24 appropriations are anticipated to be the same as those for fiscal
- 25 year 2011-2012, except that the line items will be adjusted for

- 1 changes in caseload and related costs, federal fund match rates,
- 2 economic factors, and available revenue. These adjustments will be
- 3 determined after the January 2012 consensus revenue estimating
- 4 conference. The January 2012 consensus revenue estimating
- 5 conference shall include estimates for fiscal year 2011-2012,
- 6 fiscal year 2012-2013, and fiscal year 2013-2014 for the following:
- 7 (a) State revenue.
- 8 (b) Prison population and correction expenditures.
- 9 (c) Annual percentage growth in the school aid basic
- 10 foundation allowance.
- 11 (d) Medicaid expenditures.
- 12 (e) Human service caseloads and expenditures.
