**SENATE BILL No. 204** 

"An act to provide for the apportionment of county boards of commissioners; to prescribe the size of the board; to provide for appeals; to prescribe the manner of election of the members of the county board of commissioners; to provide for compensation of members; to prescribe penalties and provide remedies; and to repeal acts and parts of acts,"

by amending section 12 (MCL 46.412), as amended by 1982 PA 504.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 12. When a vacancy occurs in the office of commissioner
  - by death, resignation, removal from the district, or removal from
- office, the vacancy shall be filled by appointment within 30 days
- by the county board of commissioners of a resident and registered
- 5 voter of that district. A person who has been convicted of a
  - violation of section 12a(1) of Act No. 370 of the Public Acts of

- 1 1941, being section 38.412a of the Michigan Compiled Laws, 1941 PA
- 2 370, MCL 38.412A, shall not be eligible for appointment to the
- 3 office of county commissioner for a period of 20 years after
- 4 conviction. The person appointed to fill a vacancy which occurred
- 5 in an odd numbered year shall serve until the vacancy is filled in
- 6 a special election. That special election shall be called by the
- 7 county board of commissioners. The person appointed to fill a
- 8 vacancy which occurs in a year which is an election year for the
- 9 office of county commissioner shall serve for the remainder of the
- 10 unexpired term. If the county board of commissioners does not fill
- 11 the vacancy by appointment within 30 days, that vacancy shall be
- 12 filled by a special election. regardless of whether the year is an
- 13 election year or an odd year.
