## **SENATE BILL No. 1341**

October 17, 2012, Introduced by Senators CASPERSON, PAVLOV, GREEN, BOOHER, PROOS and PAPPAGEORGE and referred to the Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 73109 and 73110 (MCL 324.73109 and 324.73110), as amended by 1998 PA 546.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 73109. The owner of property on which a violation of this part is committed, or his or her lessee, may bring a cause of action against a person—AN INDIVIDUAL who violates this part for \$250.00 \$750.00 or actual property damages, whichever is greater, and actual and reasonable attorney fees.

Sec. 73110. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a person AN INDIVIDUAL who violates this part is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of not less than \$100.00 \$250.00 or more than \$500.00, \$750.00, or both.

- 1 (2) A person AN INDIVIDUAL convicted of a second or subsequent

- 14 section 40119. However, the value of fish shall be determined as
