HOUSE BILL No. 4574

April 21, 2011, Introduced by Rep. Walsh and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending section 1201 (MCL 339.1201), as amended by 1997 PA 97.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1201. As used in this article:

- (a) "Apprentice" means an individual engaged in learning cosmetology in a cosmetology establishment.
- (b) "Braiding" means providing or offering to the general public for compensation any of the following services solely for development or improvement of physical qualities of the natural hair structure:

- 1 (i) Intertwining in a systematic motion to create patterns in a
- 2 3-dimensional form.
- (ii) Inversion or outversion flat against the scalp along the
- 4 part of a straight or curved row.
- 5 (iii) Twisting in a systematic motion.
- 6 (iv) Extension with natural or synthetic fibers.
- 7 (c) "Cosmetologist" means an individual who renders or offers
- 8 to render cosmetology services.
- 9 (d) "Cosmetology" means 1 of the following services or a
- 10 combination of the following services:
- 11 (i) Hair care services.
- 12 (ii) Skin care services.
- 13 (iii) Manicuring services.
- 14 (iv) Electrology.
- 15 (e) "Cosmetology establishment" means the premises on which
- 16 WHERE cosmetology or 1 or more of its services are rendered or are
- 17 offered to be rendered. Cosmetology establishment does not include
- 18 a school of cosmetology.
- 19 (f) "Electrologist" means an individual who renders or offers
- 20 to render electrology.
- 21 (g) "Electrology" means the permanent removal of hair from the
- 22 body of an individual by the use of electricity.
- 23 (h) "Esthetician" means an individual who renders or offers to
- 24 render skin care services.
- 25 (i) "Hair care services" means arranging, cutting, dressing,
- 26 curling, waving, cleansing, singeing, bleaching, coloring, tinting,
- 27 trimming, styling, relaxing, perming, straightening, or similar

- 1 work upon ON the hair of the AN INDIVIDUAL'S head or a wig that an
- 2 individual is wearing.
- 3 (j) "Instructor" means an individual who teaches or offers to
- 4 teach 1 or more cosmetology services in a school of cosmetology.
- 5 (K) "MAKEUP ARTISTRY" MEANS THE APPLICATION OF COSMETICS OR
- 6 MAKEUP DESIGNED FOR FILM PRODUCTION, TELEVISION BROADCAST, STAGE
- 7 PRODUCTION, FASHION PHOTOGRAPHY, OR OTHER ENTERTAINMENT-RELATED
- 8 INDUSTRIES.
- 9 (l) $\frac{(k)}{(k)}$ "Manicuring services" means the cleansing, filing,
- 10 shaping, buffing, polishing, or beautifying of the nails of the
- 11 hands or feet, and the cleansing, massaging, stimulating,
- 12 exercising, or beautifying of the skin of the hands, arms, and
- 13 feet, manually or with the use of tools, appliances, or cosmetic
- 14 preparations, including the repair of nails, or the creation or
- 15 decoration of artificial nails. Manicuring services do not include
- 16 the practice of podiatric medicine and surgery as defined in
- 17 section 18001 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- **18** 333.18001.
- 19 (M) (l)—"Manicurist" means an individual who renders or offers
- 20 to render manicuring services.
- 21 (N) (m)—"Natural hair cultivation" means techniques that
- 22 result in tension on hair strands such as twisting, wrapping,
- 23 weaving, extending, locking, or braiding of the hair by hand. τ
- 24 which work THE TERM does not include the application of dyes,
- 25 reactive chemicals, or other preparations to alter the color or to
- 26 straighten, curl, or alter the structure of the hair.
- 27 (O) (n) "Natural hair culturist" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL

- 1 engaged in natural hair cultivation but does not include a person
- 2 AN INDIVIDUAL engaged in natural hair cultivation if that activity
- 3 is performed as part of the practice of a recognized religion.
- 4 (P) (o) "Owner" means a person who THAT owns and conducts a
- 5 cosmetology establishment or a school of cosmetology.
- 6 (Q) (p) "School of cosmetology" means the premises where
- 7 cosmetology or 1 or more of its COSMETOLOGY services are taught.
- 8 SCHOOL OF COSMETOLOGY DOES NOT INCLUDE A SCHOOL THAT TEACHES, OR
- 9 OFFERS TO TEACH, MAKEUP ARTISTRY.
- 10 (R) (q) "Skin care services" includes the following services
- 11 or combination of services:
- 12 (i) Beautifying the skin of the body of an individual by the
- 13 use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or
- 14 creams, including body wrapping.
- 15 (ii) Cleansing or stimulating the skin of the body by the use
- 16 of the hands, devices, apparatus, or appliances, with or without
- 17 the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, or
- 18 creams.
- 19 (iii) The temporary removal of hair from the body of an
- 20 individual by the use of depilatories, waxes, razors, scissors,
- 21 clippers, or tweezers.
- 22 (iv) Giving facials, applying removable makeup, applying
- 23 eyelashes, or any other application of a preparation or beauty
- 24 enhancement to the body of an individual but does not include
- 25 applying permanent makeup or the use of tanning equipment.
- 26 (S) (r) "Student" means an individual engaged in learning
- 27 cosmetology or 1 or more of its services in a school of

1 cosmetology.
