## **HOUSE BILL No. 5175**

November 10, 2011, Introduced by Rep. Foster and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Tourism, and Outdoor Recreation.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled "Natural resources and environmental protection act," by amending sections 72114 and 72115 (MCL 324.72114 and 324.72115), as added by 2010 PA 45.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 72114. (1) Within 1 year after receiving recommendations

from the advisory council under subsection (4), the THE department shall establish a plan for a statewide trail network that includes Michigan trailways, pack and saddle trailways, and other recreational use trails. The plan for a statewide trail network shall be designed to accommodate a variety of public recreation uses and shall specify the types of uses that are allowed on each trail segment. The plan for a statewide trail network shall be in conformance with section 72115 and the determinations made under section 72115. THE PLAN FOR A STATEWIDE TRAIL NETWORK SHALL ASSURE

- 1 THAT THERE WILL NOT BE A CUMULATIVE NET LOSS OF PACK AND SADDLE
- 2 TRAILWAYS ON STATE-OWNED LANDS FROM THE NUMBER OF PACK AND SADDLE
- 3 TRAILWAYS AND THE AMOUNT OF TRAILWAY MILES THAT EXISTED ON PACK AND
- 4 SADDLE TRAILWAYS ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE 2011 AMENDATORY ACT
- 5 THAT AMENDED THIS SECTION. Prior to the department establishing the
- 6 plan for a statewide trail network, the commission shall hold a
- 7 public meeting to receive testimony from the general public.
- 8 (2) After the plan for a statewide trail network is
- 9 established under subsection (1), if the department is informed
- 10 that additional trails should be added to the plan or that uses on
- 11 particular trail segments should be modified, the department may
- 12 modify the plan to include additional trails or to modify the uses
- 13 on particular trails. However, any ANY modifications TO THE
- 14 STATEWIDE TRAIL NETWORK shall be in conformance with section 72115
- 15 and determinations made under section 72115. IN ADDITION, BY
- 16 JANUARY 1, 2022, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL MODIFY THE PLAN FOR A
- 17 STATEWIDE TRAIL NETWORK TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF TRAILWAY MILES
- 18 FOR PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS BY AT LEAST 15% FROM THE NUMBER OF
- 19 TRAILWAY MILES THAT EXISTED ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE 2011
- 20 AMENDATORY ACT THAT AMENDED THIS SECTION.
- 21 (3) Upon establishment of a plan for a statewide trail network
- 22 under subsection (1), the department shall make the plan available
- 23 on the department's website. If the department modifies the plan
- 24 for a statewide trail network, the department shall make the
- 25 updated plan available on the department's website. THE DEPARTMENT
- 26 SHALL INCLUDE ON THE WEBSITE THE TRAIL RATING FOR PACK AND SADDLE
- 27 TRAILWAYS AS PROVIDED FOR IN SECTION 72115.

- 1 (4) Within 1 year after receiving recommendations from the 2 equine trailways subcommittee under section 72110a, the advisory council shall review recommendations from the equine trailways 3 4 subcommittee as well as other interested trailway users and shall 5 make recommendations to the department for the establishment of a plan for a statewide trail network. If the advisory council does 6 not submit recommendations to the department as provided for in 7 this subsection, within 2 years after the effective date of the 8 9 amendatory act that added this section, the department shall review 10 the recommendations of the equine trailways subcommittee under 11 section 72110a and recommendations of other interested trail users 12 and shall establish a plan for a statewide trail network as
- Sec. 72115. (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3), pack and saddle animals shall be allowed to access pack and saddle trailways on public land managed by the department as follows:

- 17 (a) Access on land of the state forest system is allowed
  18 unless restricted by statute, deed restriction, land use order, or
  19 other legal mechanism, in effect on the effective date of the
  20 amendatory act that added this section APRIL 2, 2010.
  - (b) Access on land of the state park system or state game area system is prohibited unless authorized by land use order or other legal mechanism in effect on the effective date of the amendatory act that added this section APRIL 2, 2010.
- 25 (c) Access on other land managed by the department is allowed 26 according to the specific authorization or restriction applicable 27 to the land.

- 1 (2) Access by pack and saddle animals may only be restricted
- 2 on lands described in subsection (1) after the effective date of
- 3 the amendatory act that added this section APRIL 2, 2010, if
- 4 conditions are not suitable for pack and saddle animals because of
- 5 public safety concerns, necessary maintenance, or for reasons
- 6 related to the mission of the department. Restrictions related to
- 7 the mission of the department shall be supported, to the greatest
- 8 extent practicable, by a written science-based rationale that is
- 9 supported with documentation that is made available to the public.
- 10 Prior to determining that access by pack and saddle animals be
- 11 restricted, the department shall make every effort to resolve any
- 12 public safety or maintenance concerns. Subject to subsection (3),
- 13 the department shall not restrict pack and saddle animals from
- 14 lands described in subsection (1) unless all of the following
- 15 conditions are met:
- 16 (a) The commission, upon request of the department, holds a
- 17 public meeting on a proposal to restrict access by pack and saddle
- 18 animals on pack and saddle trailways to receive testimony from the
- 19 general public. The commission shall invite the advisory council,
- 20 the equine trailways subcommittee created in section 72110a, and
- 21 the Michigan horse council to attend the meeting.
- 22 (b) The department, after considering testimony at the
- 23 commission meeting under subdivision (a), provides a specific
- 24 rationale for its determination to restrict access by pack and
- 25 saddle animals.
- (c) Any decision by the department to restrict access by pack
- 27 and saddle animals shall not take effect for a period of time set

- 1 by the department, but not less than 60 days. However, if the
- 2 director determines that a restriction must be imposed because of
- 3 user conflicts or due to an imminent threat to public health,
- 4 safety, welfare, or to natural resources or the environment, the
- 5 director may issue a temporary order restricting access by pack and
- 6 saddle animals for 30 days or until the threat or user conflict is
- 7 abated. A temporary order under this subdivision may be reissued if
- 8 the threat or user conflict persists.
- 9 (d) A written statement shall be posted at the trailhead in
- 10 which the restriction is imposed stating the cause and estimated
- 11 duration of the closure.
- 12 (e) A list of pack and saddle trailways on which the
- 13 department has restricted access for pack and saddle animals,
- 14 including temporary orders, shall be posted on the department's
- 15 website and notification shall be provided to the equine trailways
- 16 subcommittee created in section 72110a.
- 17 (3) Any restrictions described in subsection (1) on access by
- 18 pack and saddle animals that were in effect on the effective date
- 19 of the amendatory act that added this section shall remain in
- 20 effect until those restrictions are reviewed using the process
- 21 outlined in subsection (2). For the following areas, the department
- 22 shall review the restrictions on access by pack and saddle animals
- 23 previously imposed by the department according to the following
- 24 timelines:
- 25 (a) Not later than June 15, 2010, the Pigeon river country
- 26 state forest.
- 27 (b) Not later than January 1, 2011, the Lapeer state game area

- 1 and the Gladwin field trial area.
- 2 (c) Not later than January 1, 2012, the Lost Nation state game
- 3 area and the Blueberry Ridge pathway.
- 4 (4) A person shall not use pack and saddle animals on state-
- 5 owned land except on pack and saddle trailways that are open for
- 6 access by pack and saddle animals.
- 7 (5) THE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH CRITERIA FOR A RATING
- 8 SYSTEM TO EVALUATE THE CONDITIONS OF PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS. THE
- 9 RATING SYSTEM SHALL PROVIDE FOR AN "EXCELLENT" RATING, A "GOOD"
- 10 RATING, AND A RATING FOR PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS THAT DO NOT
- 11 SATISFY CRITERIA FOR DESIGNATION AS BEING IN EXCELLENT OR GOOD
- 12 CONDITION. UPON ADOPTION OF CRITERIA FOR A RATING SYSTEM FOR PACK
- 13 AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE COMMISSION SHALL
- 14 SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE THAT DESCRIBES THE CRITERIA, THE
- 15 RATING SYSTEM, AND A RATIONALE FOR THE DETERMINATIONS OF THE
- 16 COMMISSION. THE COMMISSION SHALL ANNUALLY REVIEW THE RATING SYSTEM
- 17 ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, AND IF IT UPDATES THE RATING SYSTEM,
- 18 THE COMMISSION SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE THAT
- 19 DESCRIBES THE UPDATED CRITERIA, THE RATING SYSTEM, AND THE
- 20 RATIONALE FOR THE UPDATED RATING SYSTEM.
- 21 (6) UPON ADOPTION OF CRITERIA FOR A RATING SYSTEM TO EVALUATE
- 22 THE CONDITIONS OF PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS OR UPON THE UPDATE OF
- 23 CRITERIA, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL, USING THE CRITERIA, EVALUATE THE
- 24 CONDITIONS OF ALL PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS ON STATE-OWNED LANDS
- 25 AND PROVIDE A RATING FOR THOSE PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS. IF
- 26 CONDITIONS AT PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS ARE NOT RATED AS EXCELLENT
- 27 OR GOOD, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL, WITHIN 2 YEARS AFTER ORIGINALLY

- 1 RATING THE TRAILWAYS OR WITHIN 2 YEARS AFTER THE CRITERIA HAVE BEEN
- 2 UPDATED, MAKE IMPROVEMENTS TO THE PACK AND SADDLE TRAILWAYS THAT
- 3 WILL RESULT IN A RATING OF EXCELLENT OR GOOD.
