A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code,"

(MCL 333.1101 to 333.25211) by adding section 20135.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 20135. (1) BEGINNING JUNE 1, 2012, A DIALYSIS CENTER
- 2 OPERATING IN THIS STATE SHALL HAVE A BACKUP EMERGENCY GENERATOR
- 3 WITH SUFFICIENT CAPACITY TO PROVIDE ELECTRICITY NECESSARY TO
- 4 SUSTAIN DIALYSIS TREATMENTS WHILE ALSO MAINTAINING WATER PRESSURE
- 5 LEVELS REQUIRED TO OPERATE ITS DIALYSIS TREATMENT SYSTEM. A
- 5 DIALYSIS CENTER SHALL MAINTAIN ENOUGH FUEL ON THE PREMISES TO
- 7 MAINTAIN THE OPERATION OF THE BACKUP EMERGENCY GENERATOR FOR AT
- 8 LEAST 48 HOURS. A DIALYSIS CENTER SHALL TEST ITS BACKUP EMERGENCY
- 9 GENERATOR BY MAKING IT OPERATIONAL FOR AT LEAST 1/2 HOUR EVERY
- 10 MONTH.

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(2) THE DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS SHALL

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- 1 DEVELOP GUIDELINES FOR DIALYSIS CENTERS TO FOLLOW REGARDING THE
- 2 INSTALLATION, CAPACITY, TESTING, AND USE OF BACKUP EMERGENCY
- 3 GENERATORS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION. THE DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING
- 4 AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS MAY PROMULGATE RULES FOR DIALYSIS CENTERS TO
- 5 FOLLOW REGARDING THE INSTALLATION, CAPACITY, TESTING, AND USE OF
- 6 BACKUP EMERGENCY GENERATORS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 7 (3) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2013, THE DEPARTMENT OF LICENSING
- 8 AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE
- 9 IDENTIFYING EACH DIALYSIS CENTER OPERATING IN THIS STATE AND THE
- 10 LEVEL OF COMPLIANCE BY THOSE CENTERS WITH THIS SECTION.
- 11 (4) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 12 (A) "DIALYSIS" MEANS A PROCESS BY WHICH DISSOLVED SUBSTANCES
- 13 ARE REMOVED FROM A PATIENT'S BODY BY DIFFUSION FROM 1 FLUID
- 14 COMPARTMENT TO ANOTHER ACROSS A SEMIPERMEABLE MEMBRANE. DIALYSIS
- 15 INCLUDES HEMODIALYSIS AND PERITONEAL DIALYSIS.
- 16 (B) "DIALYSIS CENTER" MEANS A NONHOSPITAL OUTPATIENT DIALYSIS
- 17 UNIT THAT PROVIDES DIALYSIS TREATMENT ON AN OUTPATIENT BASIS OR
- 18 TRAINING FOR HOME DIALYSIS.
- 19 (C) "DIALYSIS TREATMENT" MEANS EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 20 (i) CHRONIC DIALYSIS GIVEN TO END-STAGE RENAL DISEASE PATIENTS.
- 21 (ii) ACUTE DIALYSIS GIVEN TO PATIENTS WHO REQUIRE DIALYSIS
- 22 BECAUSE OF TEMPORARY KIDNEY FAILURE.
- 23 (D) "END-STAGE RENAL DISEASE" MEANS THAT STATE OF RENAL
- 24 IMPAIRMENT THAT APPEARS IRREVERSIBLE AND PERMANENT AND REQUIRES A
- 25 REGULAR COURSE OF DIALYSIS OR KIDNEY TRANSPLANTATION TO MAINTAIN
- 26 LIFE.
