HOUSE BILL No. 5610

May 9, 2012, Introduced by Rep. Darany and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 721 (MCL 257.721), as amended by 2000 PA 154.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 721. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5),
- 2 a PERSON SHALL NOT OPERATE A passenger vehicle or a pickup truck
- 3 shall not be driven upon a highway drawing or having attached to
- 4 the passenger vehicle or pickup truck more than 1 vehicle or
- 5 trailer.
- 6 (2) The drawbar or other connection between 2 vehicles, 1 of
 - which is towing or drawing the other on a highway, shall not exceed
 - 15 feet in length from 1 vehicle to the other. If the connection
 - consists of a chain, rope, or cable, there shall be displayed upon

- 1 the connection a red flag or other signal or cloth not less than 12
- 2 inches both in length and width.
- 3 (3) A vehicle or trailer towed or drawn by a vehicle shall be
- 4 attached to the vehicle with forms of coupling devices in a manner
- 5 so that when the combination is operated in a linear alignment on a
- 6 level, smooth, paved surface, the movement of the towed or drawn
- 7 vehicle or trailer does not deviate more than 3 inches to either
- 8 side of the path of the towing vehicle that tows or draws it. The
- 9 vehicle or trailer shall also be connected to the towing vehicle by
- 10 suitable safety chains or devices, 1 on each side of the coupling
- 11 and at the extreme outer edge of the vehicle or trailer. Each chain
- 12 or device and connection used shall be of sufficient strength to
- 13 haul the vehicle or trailer when loaded. In the case of an
- 14 implement of husbandry with a gross vehicle weight rating or gross
- 15 combination weight rating of 10,000 pounds or less, the safety
- 16 chains or devices required under this subsection shall conform to
- 17 the federal motor carrier safety regulations requirements contained
- 18 in 49 C.F.R. 393.70(d)(5).49 CFR 393.70(D)(5).
- 19 (4) A pickup truck with a fifth wheel assembly shall not tow a
- 20 semitrailer unless the fifth wheel assembly conforms to the
- 21 standards prescribed in the motor carrier safety act of 1963, 1963
- 22 PA 181, MCL 480.11 to 480.22.480.25.
- 23 (5) Notwithstanding subsection (1), a pickup truck with a
- 24 towing rating equal to, or greater than, the weight being towed,
- 25 equipped with a fifth wheel assembly that conforms with the
- 26 standards prescribed in the motor carrier safety act of 1963, 1963
- 27 PA 181, MCL 480.11 to 480.22 480.25, towing attached with a

- 1 semitrailer designed for recreational living purposes may tow an
- 2 additional trailer or semitrailer under the following conditions:
- 3 (a) The additional trailer or semitrailer shall be attached
- 4 pursuant to AS PRESCRIBED IN subsection (3). The safety chains
- 5 described in subsection (3) shall be securely attached at the
- 6 extreme outer edge of the attached trailer or semitrailer with a
- 7 locking mechanism. The towing vehicle hitch shall be of substantial
- 8 material and shall be attached in a proper and skillful manner to
- 9 the frame of the towing vehicle.
- 10 (b) The total length of the pickup truck, semitrailer designed
- 11 for recreational living purposes, and additional trailer or

- 15 towed or drawn shall not exceed the empty weight of the pickup
- 16 truck or the empty weight of the semitrailer.
- 17 (6) For the purposes of this section, a pickup truck towing a
- 18 semitrailer and additional trailer shall be—IS considered a
- 19 passenger vehicle and shall comply with the speed limit
- 20 requirements of section 627(5).
- 21 (7) A PERSON SHALL NOT OPERATE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON A HIGHWAY
- 22 WITH TEMPORARY TOWING DEVICES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, A
- 23 BALL AND HITCH, ATTACHED TO THE VEHICLE UNLESS THE MOTOR VEHICLE IS
- 24 BEING USED FOR TOWING PURPOSES.
- 25 (8) (7)—A person who violates this section is responsible for
- 26 a civil infraction.
