HOUSE BILL No. 5636

May 15, 2012, Introduced by Rep. Shaughnessy and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

by amending section 1277 (MCL 380.1277), as amended by 1997 PA 179; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1277. (1) Considering criteria established by the state

board, in addition to the requirements specified in section 1280

for accreditation under that section, if the board of a school

district wants all of the schools of the school district to be

accredited under section 1280, the board shall adopt and implement

and, not later than September 1 each year, shall make available to

the department a copy of a 3- to 5-year school improvement plan and

continuing school improvement process for each school within the

- 1 school district. The school improvement plans shall include, but
- 2 are not limited to, a mission statement, goals based on student
- 3 academic objectives for all students, curriculum alignment
- 4 corresponding with those goals, evaluation processes, staff
- 5 development, development and utilization of community resources and
- 6 volunteers, the role of adult and community education, libraries
- 7 and community colleges in the learning community, and building
- 8 level decision making. School board members, school building
- 9 administrators, teachers and other school employees, pupils,
- 10 parents of pupils attending that school, and other residents of the
- 11 school district shall be invited and allowed to voluntarily
- 12 participate in the development, review, and evaluation of the
- 13 district's school improvement plans. Upon request of the board of a
- 14 school district, the department and the intermediate school
- 15 district shall assist the school district in the development and
- 16 implementation of district school improvement plans. Educational
- 17 organizations may also provide assistance for these purposes.
- 18 School improvement plans described in this section shall be updated
- 19 annually by each school and by the board of the school district.
- 20 (2) School improvement plans shall include at least all of the
- 21 following additional matters:
- (a) Goals centered on student academic learning.
- 23 (b) Strategies to accomplish the goals.
- 24 (c) Evaluation of the plan.
- 25 (d) Development of alternative measures of assessment that
- 26 will provide authentic assessment of pupils' achievements, skills,
- 27 and competencies.

- 1 (e) Methods for effective use of technology as a way of
- 2 improving learning and delivery of services and for integration of
- 3 evolving technology in the curriculum.
- 4 (f) Ways to make available in as many fields as practicable
- 5 opportunities for structured on-the-job learning, such as
- 6 apprenticeships and internships, combined with classroom
- 7 instruction.
- 8 (3) Each intermediate school board shall adopt and implement
- 9 and, not later than September 1 each year, shall make available to
- 10 the department a copy of a 3- to 5-year intermediate school
- 11 district school improvement plan and continuing school improvement
- 12 process for the intermediate school district. Constituent and
- intermediate school board members, school building administrators,
- 14 teachers and other school employees, pupils, parents of pupils, and
- 15 residents of the intermediate school district shall be invited and
- 16 allowed to voluntarily participate in the development, review, and
- 17 evaluation of the intermediate school district's school improvement
- 18 plan. Upon request of the intermediate school board, the department
- 19 shall assist the intermediate school district in the development
- 20 and implementation of an intermediate school district school
- 21 improvement plan. An intermediate school district school
- 22 improvement plan described in this section shall be updated
- 23 annually by the intermediate school board. An intermediate school
- 24 district school improvement plan shall include at least all of the
- 25 following:
- 26 (a) Methods to assist districts in improving pupils' academic
- 27 learning.

- 1 (b) Assurance that all pupils have reasonable access to all
- 2 programs offered by the intermediate school district, including,
- 3 but not limited to, transportation if necessary.
- 4 (c) A plan for professional development that supports academic
- 5 learning.
- 6 (d) Methods to assist school districts in integrating applied
- 7 academics and career and employability skills into all curricular
- 8 areas.
- 9 (e) Ways to make available in as many fields as practicable
- 10 opportunities for structured on-the-job learning, such as
- 11 apprenticeships and internships, combined with classroom
- 12 instruction.
- 13 (f) Collaborative efforts with supporting agencies that
- 14 enhance academic learning.
- 15 (q) Long-range cost containment measures, including additional
- 16 services that might be provided at reduced costs by the
- 17 intermediate school district or through cooperative programs, and
- 18 cost reduction programs such as interdistrict cooperation in
- 19 special education and other programs and services.
- 20 (h) To the extent that it would improve school effectiveness,
- 21 specific recommendations on consolidation or enhanced interdistrict
- 22 cooperation, or both, along with possible sources of revenue.
- (i) Evaluation of the plan.
- 24 (4) The state board shall annually review a random sampling of
- 25 school improvement plans. Based on its review, the state board
- 26 shall annually submit a report on school improvement activities
- 27 planned and accomplished by each of the school districts and

- 1 intermediate school districts that were part of the sampling to the
- 2 senate and house committees that have the responsibility for
- 3 education legislation.
- 4 Enacting section 1. Section 761 of the revised school code,
- 5 1976 PA 451, MCL 380.761, is repealed.
