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HOUSE BILL No. 5785

July 18, 2012, Introduced by Reps. MacMaster, Agema, McMillin, Huuki, Shirkey, Daley, Johnson, McBroom, Foster, Opsommer and Franz and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to prohibit this state and its political subdivisions from adopting or implementing certain policy recommendations of the United Nations; to prohibit adopting or implementing a law or plan of action that would infringe on or restrict private property rights without due process; and to prohibit certain transactions with certain entities that assist in implementing United Nations Agenda 21.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. As used in this act:

- (a) "Agenda 21" means Agenda 21 adopted at the United Nations conference on environment and development held in Brazil in June 1992.
 - (b) "Michigan governmental entity" means any of the following:

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- $\mathbf{1}$ (i) This state, including a department, board, agency, or
- 2 commission of this state or an authority created by any of these.
- 3 (ii) A city, village, township, county, school district,
- 4 community college, or intermediate school district, or an authority
- 5 created by any of these.
- 6 (iii) A private-public partnership involving an entity described
- 7 in subparagraph (i) or (ii).
- 8 Sec. 2. (1) A Michigan governmental entity shall not adopt or
- 9 implement policy recommendations that infringe or restrict private
- 10 property rights without due process and that are required by policy
- 11 recommendations originating in or traceable to Agenda 21 or any
- 12 other international law or ancillary plan of action that
- 13 contravenes the constitution of the United States or the state
- 14 constitution of 1963.
- 15 (2) Since the United Nations has accredited and enlisted
- 16 numerous nongovernmental and intergovernmental organizations to
- 17 assist in the implementation of its policies relative to Agenda 21
- 18 around the world, a Michigan governmental entity shall not enter
- 19 into a contract for services with, pay any money to, or receive
- 20 money from those nongovernmental and intergovernmental
- 21 organizations as defined in Agenda 21.
- 22 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect 90 days after the
- 23 date it is enacted into law.
