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HOUSE BILL No. 5873

September 11, 2012, Introduced by Rep. Forlini and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1996 PA 195, entitled
"Police officer's and fire fighter's survivor tuition act,"
by amending the title and sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 (MCL 390.1241, 390.1242, 390.1243, 390.1244, and 390.1245).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

An act to provide for a waiver of tuition GRANT PROGRAM at state public institutions of higher education for children and surviving spouses of Michigan police officers and fire fighters killed in the line of duty; TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THAT TUITION GRANT PROGRAM; TO PRESCRIBE CERTAIN POWERS AND DUTIES OF STATE OFFICERS, AGENCIES, AND DEPARTMENTS; and to provide for an appropriation.

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the

- 1 "police officer's and fire fighter's survivor tuition GRANT act".
- 2 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 3 (A) "ACADEMIC YEAR" MEANS THE PERIOD FROM SEPTEMBER 1 OF A
- 4 CALENDAR YEAR TO AUGUST 31 OF THE NEXT CALENDAR YEAR.
- 5 (B) (a)—"Child" means an individual who is a natural or
- 6 adopted child of a deceased Michigan police officer or deceased
- 7 Michigan fire fighter and who was under the age of 21 at the time
- 8 of the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire fighter's death.
- 9 (C) (b)—"Department" means the department of state
- 10 police.TREASURY.
- 11 (D) "ELIGIBLE STUDENT" MEANS A CHILD OR SURVIVING SPOUSE OF A
- 12 MICHIGAN POLICE OFFICER OR MICHIGAN FIRE FIGHTER WHO WAS OR IS
- 13 KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.
- 14 (E) (c) "Killed" means that the Michigan police officer's or
- 15 Michigan fire fighter's death is the direct and proximate result of
- 16 a traumatic injury incurred in the line of duty.
- 17 (F) (d)—"Line of duty" means an action that a Michigan police
- 18 officer or Michigan fire fighter is obligated or authorized to
- 19 perform by rule, regulation, condition of employment or service, or
- 20 law, including, but not limited to, a social, ceremonial, or
- 21 athletic function that the Michigan police officer or Michigan fire
- 22 fighter is assigned to or compensated for by the public agency he
- 23 or she serves.
- (G) (e) "Michigan police officer" means a sheriff or sheriff's
- 25 deputy of a sheriff's department in this state; village or township
- 26 marshal of a village or township in this state; officer of the
- 27 police department of any city, village, or township in this state;

- 1 officer of the Michigan state police; or any other police officer
- 2 or law enforcement officer trained and certified pursuant to the
- 3 Michigan law enforcement officers training council act of 1965, Act
- 4 No. 203 of the Public Acts of 1965, being sections 28.601 to 28.616
- 5 of the Michigan Compiled Laws. UNDER THE COMMISSION ON LAW
- 6 ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS ACT, 1965 PA 203, MCL 28.601 TO 28.616.
- 7 (H) (f) "Michigan fire fighter" means a member including
- 8 volunteer members and members paid on call of a fire department, or
- 9 other organization that provides fire suppression and other fire-
- 10 related services, of a city, township, village, or county who is
- 11 responsible for or is in a capacity that includes responsibility
- 12 for the extinguishment of fires. Michigan fire fighter does not
- 13 include a person whose job description, duties, or responsibilities
- 14 do not include direct involvement in fire suppression.
- (I) (g) "Occupational disease" means a disease that routinely
- 16 constitutes a special hazard in, or is commonly regarded as
- 17 concomitant of, the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire
- 18 fighter's occupation.
- 19 (J) (h) "State institution of higher education" means a public
- 20 community or junior college established under section 7 of article
- 21 VIII of the state constitution of 1963 or part 25 of the revised
- 22 school code, Act No. 451 of the Public Acts of 1976, being sections
- 23 380.1601 to 380.1607 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, 1976 PA 451,
- 24 MCL 380.1601 TO 380.1607, or a state university described in
- 25 section 4, 5, or 6 of article VIII of the state constitution of
- **26** 1963.
- 27 (K) "SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT" MEANS A TUITION GRANT AWARDED

- 1 TO AN ELIGIBLE STUDENT UNDER THIS ACT.
- 2 (1) (i) "Traumatic injury" means a wound or the condition of
- 3 the body caused by external force, including, but not limited to,
- 4 an injury inflicted by bullet, explosive, sharp instrument, blunt
- 5 object or other physical blow, fire, smoke, chemical, electricity,
- 6 climatic condition, infectious disease, radiation, or bacteria, but
- 7 excluding an injury resulting from stress, strain, or occupational
- 8 disease.
- 9 (M) (j) "Tuition" means tuition at the rate charged for
- 10 residents TO A RESIDENT of this state BY A STATE INSTITUTION OF
- 11 HIGHER EDUCATION.
- 12 Sec. 3. (1) THE POLICE OFFICER'S AND FIRE FIGHTER'S SURVIVOR
- 13 TUITION PROGRAM IS CREATED, TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 14 (2) (1) Beginning in the 1996-1997-2012-2013 academic year,
- 15 and subject to the limitations in subsections (2), (3), and (4), a
- 16 state institution of higher education shall waive tuition for each
- 17 child and surviving spouse of a Michigan police officer or Michigan
- 18 fire fighter who has been or is killed in the line of duty if the
- 19 child or surviving spouse meets (3), (4), AND (5) AND SECTION 4(4),
- 20 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT IN AN
- 21 AMOUNT DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO EACH ELIGIBLE STUDENT IF all
- 22 of the following requirements ARE MET:
- 23 (a) Applies, THE STUDENT APPLIES, qualifies, and is admitted
- 24 as a full-time, part-time, or summer school student in a program of
- 25 study leading to a degree or certificate AT A STATE INSTITUTION OF
- 26 HIGHER EDUCATION.
- 27 (b) Is THE STUDENT IS a legal resident of the state for at

- 1 least the 12 consecutive months immediately preceding his or her
- 2 application. For an individual who is a dependent of his or her
- 3 parent, residency status shall be determined by the parent's
- 4 residency. For an individual who is not a dependent, residency
- 5 status shall be IS determined in the same manner as under title IV
- of the higher education act of 1965, Public Law 89-329, 79 Stat.
- 7 1232.20 USC 1070 TO 1070H.
- 8 (c) Applies THE STUDENT APPLIES to the department for A
- 9 SURVIVOR'S tuition waiver GRANT under this act and provides
- 10 evidence satisfactory to the department that he or she is the child
- 11 or the surviving spouse of a Michigan police officer or Michigan
- 12 fire fighter who was killed in the line of duty, AN ELIGIBLE
- 13 STUDENT, that the course or courses for which he or she is seeking
- 14 a SURVIVOR'S tuition waiver GRANT meet the requirements of
- 15 subsection $\frac{(2)}{(2)}$, and that he or she meets the other
- 16 requirements of this section.
- 17 (d) For IF THE STUDENT IS a child of a Michigan police officer
- 18 or Michigan fire fighter who was killed in the line of duty, HE OR
- 19 SHE applies FOR A SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT under subdivision (c)
- 20 for the first time before the age of 21.
- 21 (e) Is certified by the THE financial aid officer at the state
- 22 institution of higher education as needing the CERTIFIES TO THE
- 23 DEPARTMENT THAT THE STUDENT NEEDS THE SURVIVOR'S tuition waiver
- 24 GRANT in order to meet recognized educational expenses TUITION
- 25 EXPENSES; CERTIFIES THE AMOUNT THAT THE STUDENT NEEDS FOR THOSE
- 26 TUITION EXPENSES; AND CERTIFIES THAT THE TUITION RATE OR RATES USED
- 27 TO DETERMINE THE AMOUNT OF THOSE EXPENSES DO NOT EXCEED THE RATE OR

- 1 RATES CHARGED TO RESIDENTS OF THIS STATE. If the child's or
- 2 surviving spouse's ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S family income, excluding any
- 3 income from death benefits attributable to the Michigan police
- 4 officer's or Michigan fire fighter's death, is below 400% of
- 5 poverty level under federal poverty guidelines published by the
- 6 United States department of health and human services, THE
- 7 INSTITUTION SHALL NOT INCLUDE income from any death benefits
- 8 accruing to the child or surviving spouse ELIGIBLE STUDENT as a
- 9 result of the Michigan police officer's or Michigan fire fighter's
- 10 death shall not be counted as family income in determining
- 11 financial need under this subdivision.
- 12 (f) Maintains THE STUDENT MAINTAINS satisfactory academic
- 13 progress, as defined by the state institution of higher education,
- 14 for each term or semester in which he or she is enrolled. The
- 15 satisfactory progress definition used by an institution for federal
- 16 student assistance programs under title IV of the higher education
- 17 act of 1965 20 USC 1070 TO 1070H is acceptable for the purposes of
- 18 this act.
- 19 (q) Has not achieved THE STUDENT HAS NOT RECEIVED a bachelor's
- 20 degree and has received tuition reimbursement ASSISTANCE under this
- 21 act for $\frac{less}{less}$ FEWER than 124 semester credits or 180 term credits at
- 22 an institution of higher education.
- 23 (3) (2) A state institution of higher education shall waive
- 24 tuition under this act THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A SURVIVOR'S
- 25 TUITION GRANT only for courses that are applicable toward the
- 26 degree or certificate requirements of the program in which the
- 27 child or surviving spouse ELIGIBLE STUDENT is enrolled.

- 1 (4) (3) A child or surviving spouse of a Michigan police
- 2 officer or Michigan fire fighter who was killed in the line of duty
- 3 AN ELIGIBLE STUDENT is eliqible for A SURVIVOR'S tuition waiver
- 4 under this section GRANT for not more than a total of 9 semesters
- 5 or the equivalent number of terms or quarters.
- 6 (5) (4) Tuition shall be waived only to the extent that the
- 7 tuition THE AMOUNT OF A SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT IS LIMITED TO THE
- 8 AMOUNT OF THE ELIGIBLE STUDENT'S TUITION THAT is not covered or
- 9 paid by any scholarship, trust fund, statutory benefit, or any
- 10 other source of tuition coverage available to the person eligible
- 11 for a waiver under this act. ELIGIBLE STUDENT. THE DEPARTMENT MAY
- 12 REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF A SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT IF IT DETERMINES
- 13 THAT THE TUITION RATE OR RATES USED TO DETERMINE THE AMOUNT THAT
- 14 THE STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION CERTIFIES UNDER
- 15 SUBSECTION (2) (E) THAT THE STUDENT NEEDS EXCEED THE TUITION RATE OR
- 16 RATES CHARGED BY THE INSTITUTION IN THAT ACADEMIC YEAR TO RESIDENTS
- 17 OF THIS STATE.
- 18 Sec. 4. (1) Beginning in the 1996-1997 2012-2013 academic
- 19 year, upon receiving IF IT RECEIVES an application under section
- 20 3(c), 3(2)(C) AND SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (4), the department shall
- 21 determine whether the applicant and the courses for which A
- 22 SURVIVOR'S tuition waiver GRANT is sought meet the requirements of
- 23 section 3 and, if so, shall approve the application and notify the
- 24 state institution of higher education that IT HAS APPROVED the
- 25 application. has been approved.
- 26 (2) Beginning in the 1996-1997 academic year, upon application
- 27 by the state institution of higher education, the department

- 1 annually shall reimburse each state institution of higher education
- 2 for the total amount of tuition waived during the immediately
- 3 preceding fiscal year under section 3. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY
- 4 IF THE DEPARTMENT APPROVES A SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT UNDER
- 5 SUBSECTION (1):
- 6 (A) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DISBURSE THE SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT
- 7 MONEY TO THE STATE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT THE STUDENT
- 8 ATTENDS, ACCORDING TO A PAYMENT PROCEDURE ESTABLISHED BY THE
- 9 DEPARTMENT.
- 10 (B) THE INSTITUTION SHALL ONLY APPLY MONEY RECEIVED UNDER
- 11 SUBDIVISION (A) ON A STUDENT'S BEHALF TO THE STUDENT'S OUTSTANDING
- 12 INDEBTEDNESS FOR TUITION.
- 13 (3) The department annually shall report to the legislature
- 14 the number of individuals for whom tuition has been waived at each
- 15 state institution of higher education and the total amounts to be
- 16 paid under this act for that fiscal year.WHO RECEIVED SURVIVOR'S
- 17 TUITION GRANTS IN THE PRECEDING ACADEMIC YEAR AND THE TOTAL AMOUNT
- 18 OF THOSE GRANTS; WHICH STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION THOSE
- 19 STUDENTS ATTENDED; AND THE TOTAL AMOUNT DISBURSED TO EACH
- 20 INSTITUTION.
- 21 (4) IF IT RECEIVES AN APPLICATION UNDER SECTION 3(2)(C), THE
- 22 DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT THE EVIDENCE PROVIDED BY THE APPLICANT THAT
- 23 HE OR SHE IS AN ELIGIBLE STUDENT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE
- 24 FOR A DETERMINATION OF WHETHER THE MICHIGAN POLICE OFFICER'S OR
- 25 MICHIGAN FIRE FIGHTER'S DEATH WAS THE DIRECT AND PROXIMATE RESULT
- 26 OF A TRAUMATIC INJURY INCURRED IN THE LINE OF DUTY. THE DEPARTMENT
- 27 SHALL NOT AWARD A SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT UNLESS THE DEPARTMENT OF

- 1 STATE POLICE DETERMINES THAT THE DEATH WAS THE DIRECT AND PROXIMATE
- 2 RESULT OF A TRAUMATIC INJURY INCURRED IN THE LINE OF DUTY.
- 3 Sec. 5. (1) The department shall provide the necessary DO ALL
- 4 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 5 (A) ADMINISTER THE SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT PROGRAM.
- 6 (B) VERIFY THE TUITION RATES CERTIFIED BY STATE INSTITUTIONS
- 7 OF HIGHER EDUCATION UNDER SECTION 3(2)(E).
- 8 (C) DEVELOP AND PROVIDE forms and applications and shall
- 9 cooperate FOR USE BY SURVIVOR'S TUITION GRANT APPLICANTS, STATE
- 10 INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE,
- 11 AND THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS ACT.
- 12 (D) COOPERATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE AND with the
- 13 state institutions of higher education in developing efficient
- 14 procedures for implementing the purposes of this act.
- 15 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SHALL DEVELOP APPROPRIATE
- 16 PROCEDURES FOR MEETING ITS RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER SECTION 4. THE
- 17 DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SHALL CONSULT WITH THE DEPARTMENT IN
- 18 DEVELOPING THOSE PROCEDURES.
