HOUSE BILL No. 5920

September 19, 2012, Introduced by Rep. Lipton and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1917 PA 273, entitled

"An act to regulate and license pawnbrokers in certain governmental units of this state; and to prescribe certain powers and duties of certain local governmental units and state agencies,"

by amending sections 1, 3, and 18 (MCL 446.201, 446.203, and 446.218), sections 1 and 3 as amended by 2006 PA 292.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. (1) A person , corporation, or firm shall not conduct

 business as a pawnbroker DO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING in any of the

 governmental units of this state without having first obtained

 OBTAINING from the chief executive officer of that governmental

 unit a license under this act: that authorizes that person,

 corporation, or firm to conduct that business. This subsection
 - (A) CONDUCT BUSINESS AS A PAWNBROKER.
 - (B) INCLUDE THE WORD "PAWN" OR "PAWNBROKER" IN THE NAME OF THE BUSINESS.

- 1 (C) ADVERTISE OR OTHERWISE REPRESENT THAT THE PERSON IS A
- 2 PAWNBROKER.
- 3 (2) SUBSECTION (1) does not require an internet drop-off store
- 4 complying THAT COMPLIES with subsection (3) (4), or a person
- 5 engaged in the sale, purchase, consignment, or trade of personal
- 6 property or other valuable thing for himself or herself, to obtain
- 7 a license under this act.
- 8 (2) Licensure under either or both of the following acts does
- 9 not exempt a person from obtaining a license under this act:
- 10 (3) (a) The REGISTRATION UNDER THE precious metal and gem
- 11 dealer act, 1981 PA 95, MCL 445.481 to 445.492, DOES NOT EXEMPT A
- 12 PERSON FROM OBTAINING A LICENSE UNDER THIS ACT.
- 13 (b) LICENSURE UNDER 1917 PA 350, MCL 445.401 to 445.408, DOES
- 14 NOT EXEMPT A PERSON FROM OBTAINING A LICENSE UNDER THIS ACT.
- 15 (4) (3)—An internet drop-off store in compliance THAT COMPLIES
- 16 with the following conditions is exempt from licensure as a
- 17 pawnbroker under this act:
- 18 (a) Has a fixed place of business within this state except
- 19 that he or she exclusively transacts all purchases or sales by
- 20 means of the internet and the purchases and sales are not
- 21 physically transacted on the premises of that fixed place of
- 22 business.
- 23 (b) Has the personal property or other valuable thing
- 24 available on a website, for viewing by photograph, if available, by
- 25 the general public at no charge, which website shall be AND THAT IS
- 26 searchable by zip code or state, or both. The website viewing shall
- 27 include, as applicable, serial number, make, model, and other

- 1 unique identifying marks, numbers, names, or letters appearing on
- 2 the personal property or other valuable thing.
- 3 (c) Maintains records of the sale, purchase, consignment, or
- 4 trade of the personal property or other valuable thing for at least
- 5 2 years. , which THE records shall contain a description, including
- 6 a photograph, if available, and, if applicable, serial number,
- 7 make, model, and other unique identifying marks, numbers, names, or
- 8 letters appearing on the personal property or other valuable thing.
- 9 (d) Provide the local police agency with any name under which
- 10 it conducts business on the website and access to the business
- 11 premises at any time during normal business hours for purposes of
- 12 inspection.
- (e) Within 24 hours after a request from a local police
- 14 agency, provide an electronic copy of the seller's or consignor's
- 15 name, address, telephone number, driver license number and issuing
- 16 state, the buyer's name and address, if applicable, and a
- 17 description of the personal property or other valuable thing as
- 18 described in subdivision (c). The provision of STORE SHALL PROVIDE
- 19 THE information shall be in a format acceptable to the local police
- 20 agency but shall at least be in a legible format and in the English
- 21 language.
- (f) Provide that payment for the personal property or other
- 23 valuable thing is executed by means of check or other electronic
- 24 payment system , so long as the payment is not made AND NOT in
- 25 cash. No THE STORE SHALL NOT PROVIDE payment shall be provided to
- 26 the seller until the item is sold.
- 27 (g) Immediately remove the personal property or other valuable

- 1 thing from the website if the local police agency determines that
- 2 the personal property or other valuable thing is stolen.
- 3 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Chief executive officer" means any of the following:
- 5 (i) For a city, the mayor.
- 6 (ii) For a village, the village president.
- 7 (iii) For a township or charter township, the township
- 8 supervisor.
- 9 (iv) For a county, the county executive or, if there is no
- 10 county executive, the person designated by a resolution of the
- 11 county board of commissioners.
- 12 (b) "Governmental unit" means a city, township, charter
- 13 township, county, or incorporated village.
- 14 (c) "Internet drop-off store" means a person , corporation, or
- 15 firm that contracts with other persons , corporations, or firms to
- 16 offer its personal property or other valuable thing for sale,
- 17 purchase, consignment, or trade through means of an internet
- 18 website and meets the conditions described in section $\frac{1(3).1(4)}{.}$.
- 19 (d) "Local police agency" means the police agency of the city,
- 20 village, or township, or if none, the county sheriff of the county
- 21 in which the AN internet drop-off store conducts business.
- (e) "Pawnbroker" means a person , corporation, or member, or
- 23 members of a copartnership or firm, who loans THAT DOES ANY OF THE
- 24 FOLLOWING:
- 25 (i) LOANS money on deposit, or pledge of personal property, or
- 26 other valuable thing, other than securities or printed evidence of
- 27 indebtedness. , or who deals

- 1 (ii) DEALS in the purchasing of personal property or other
- 2 valuable thing on condition of selling the same back again at a
- 3 stipulated price.
- 4 (F) "PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, A GENERAL PARTNER, OR A
- 5 CORPORATION, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY, PARTNERSHIP, OR OTHER LEGAL
- 6 ENTITY.
- 7 Sec. 18. Any person who shall violate A PERSON THAT VIOLATES
- 8 any of the provisions of this act, whether as owner, or as A clerk,
- 9 agent, servant, or employe EMPLOYEE OF A PERSON, shall be IS guilty
- 10 of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof in any court of
- 11 competent jurisdiction be fined not less than 25 dollars nor more
- 12 than 100 dollars, or PUNISHABLE by imprisonment in the county jail
- 13 FOR not less FEWER than 10 days nor OR more than 3 months, 90 DAYS
- OR A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$25.00 OR MORE THAN \$100.00, or by both.
- 15 such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court. HOWEVER,
- 16 IF THE VIOLATION IS A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION OF SECTION
- 17 1(1), THE PERSON IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY
- 18 IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT FEWER THAN 10 DAYS OR MORE THAN 90 DAYS OR A
- 19 FINE OF NOT LESS THAN \$1,000.00 OR MORE THAN \$2,500.00, OR BOTH.
- 20 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
