HOUSE BILL No. 4996

September 20, 2011, Introduced by Rep. Meadows and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending section 648 (MCL 257.648).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 648. (1) The driver OPERATOR of a vehicle or bicycle upon a highway, before stopping or turning from a direct line, shall first see DETERMINE that the stopping or turning can be made in safety and shall give a signal as required in this section.

(2) A—EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (4), A signal required in—UNDER this section shall be given either by means of the hand and arm in the manner specified in this section, or by a mechanical or electrical signal device which—THAT conveys an intelligible signal or warning to other highway traffic. , except

- 2 (3) When a signal is given by means of the hand and arm, the
- 3 driver OPERATOR shall indicate his or her intention to stop or turn
- 4 by extending his hand and arm from and beyond the left side of the
- 5 vehicle and signal as follows:
- 6 (a) Left FOR A LEFT turn, THE OPERATOR SHALL EXTEND HIS
- 7 OR HER LEFT hand and arm extended horizontally.
- 8 (b) Right FOR A RIGHT turn, THE OPERATOR SHALL EXTEND
- 9 HIS OR HER LEFT hand and arm extended upward OR, IF THE PERSON IS
- 10 OPERATING A BICYCLE, EITHER SHALL EXTEND HIS OR HER LEFT ARM UPWARD
- 11 OR SHALL EXTEND HIS OR HER RIGHT ARM HORIZONTALLY.
- 12 (c) Stop—TO STOP or decrease speed, THE OPERATOR SHALL
- 13 EXTEND HIS OR HER LEFT hand and arm extended downward.
- 14 (4) (3)—A commercial motor vehicle, other than those—A
- 15 COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE in transit from a manufacturer to a
- 16 dealer, in use on a highway shall be equipped with, and required
- 17 signal shall be given by, a signal lamp or mechanical signal device
- 18 when the distance from the center of the top of the steering post
- 19 to the left outside limit of the body, cab, or load of the
- 20 commercial motor vehicle exceeds 24 inches, or when the distance
- 21 from the center of the top of the steering post to the rear limit
- 22 of the body or load of the commercial vehicle exceeds 14 feet. The
- 23 measurement from steering post to rear limit shall apply APPLIES to
- 24 a single vehicle or combination of vehicles.
- 25 (5) (4)—A person who violates this section is responsible for
- 26 a civil infraction.
