HOUSE BILL No. 5065

October 13, 2011, Introduced by Rep. Geiss and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 224 (MCL 257.224), as amended by 2006 PA 177.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 224. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act
 regarding tabs or stickers, upon registering a vehicle, the
 secretary of state shall issue to the owner 1 registration plate.
 - (2) A registration plate shall display the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which the registration plate is issued; the name of this state, which may be abbreviated; and when the registration plate expires, which may be shown by a tab or sticker furnished by the secretary of state.
 - (3) A registration plate issued for motor vehicles owned and operated by this state; a state institution; a municipality; a

- 1 privately incorporated, nonprofit volunteer fire department; or a
- 2 nonpublic, nonprofit college or university of this state shall not
- 3 expire at any particular time but shall be renewed when the
- 4 registration plate is worn out or is illegible. This registration

- 6 applicable fee and may be used on any eligible vehicle titled to

- 4 (6) The registration plate and the required letters and
- 5 numerals on the registration plate shall be of sufficient size to
- 6 be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during daylight.
- 7 The secretary of state may issue a tab or tabs designating the
- 8 month and year of expiration.
- 9 (7) The secretary of state shall issue for every passenger
- 10 motor vehicle rented without a driver the same type of registration
- 11 plate as the type of registration plate issued for private
- 12 passenger vehicles.
- 13 (8) A person shall not operate a vehicle on the public
- 14 highways or streets of this state displaying a registration plate
- 15 other than the registration plate issued for the vehicle by the
- 16 secretary of state, except as provided in this chapter for
- 17 nonresidents, and by assignment provided in subsection (3).
- 18 (9) The registration plate displayed on a vehicle registered
- 19 on the basis of elected gross weight shall indicate the elected
- 20 gross weight for which the vehicle is registered.
- 21 (10) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2012, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT RENEW
- 22 A GREAT LAKES SPLENDOR REGISTRATION PLATE OR AN AUTO CENTENNIAL
- 23 REGISTRATION PLATE.
