HOUSE BILL No. 5255

January 19, 2012, Introduced by Reps. Lindberg, Constan, Irwin, Cavanagh and Tlaib and referred to the Committee on Redistricting and Elections.

A bill to amend 1973 PA 196, entitled

"An act to prescribe standards of conduct for public officers and employees; to create a state board of ethics and prescribe its powers and duties; and to prescribe remedies and penalties,"

by amending sections 1 and 2 (MCL 15.341 and 15.342), section 1 as amended by 1980 PA 481 and section 2 as amended by 1984 PA 53.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Board" means the board of ethics.
 - (b) "Employee" means an employee, classified or unclassified,of the executive branch of this state. For the purpose of section2b, employee shall include an employee of this state or a political subdivision of this state.
 - (c) "Public officer" means a person appointed by the governor or another executive department official. For the purpose of section—SECTIONS 2(4) AND 2b, public officer shall include—INCLUDES
