## **SENATE BILL No. 208**

March 2, 2011, Introduced by Senator HUNE and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1988 PA 466, entitled "Animal industry act,"

by amending section 14 (MCL 287.714), as amended by 2002 PA 458.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 14. (1) If the director determines that the control or
- 2 eradication of a disease or condition of livestock warrants entry
- 3 onto property where livestock or domestic animals are located, the
- 4 director shall ISSUE AN order the entry onto AUTHORIZING A PERSON
- 5 TO ENTER THE property where livestock or domestic animals are
- 6 located and authorize seizure, slaughter, destruction, SEIZE,
- 7 SLAUGHTER, DESTROY, or other disposition OTHERWISE DISPOSE of
- 8 individual livestock or domestic animals or the entire herd, flock,
- or school. If the director has signed an order for the slaughter,

- 1 destruction, or other disposition of livestock or domestic animals,
- 2 the director shall notify the attorney general and the house and
- 3 senate appropriations committees and the department of TECHNOLOGY,
- 4 management, and budget on the issue of indemnity under this
- 5 section. The director may approve facilities and procedures for the
- 6 orderly disposal of animals, animal products, and animal feeds for
- 7 the purpose of controlling or preventing the spread of an
- 8 infectious, contagious, or toxicological disease. The director may
- 9 select a site or method for the disposal with the advice of the
- 10 director of the department of environmental quality.
- 11 (2) The director may, under rules promulgated by the
- 12 department, allow indemnification for the slaughter, destruction,
- 13 or other disposition of livestock or domestic animals due to
- 14 livestock diseases or toxicological contamination. If the director
- 15 has signed an order for the slaughter, destruction, or other
- 16 disposition of livestock or domestic animals, the owner OF THE
- 17 LIVESTOCK OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS may apply for indemnification. The—IF
- 18 THE OWNER APPLIES FOR INDEMNIFICATION, THE director shall appraise
- 19 and inventory the condemned livestock or domestic animals. The
- 20 appraisals and inventories shall be on forms approved by the
- 21 director. The director shall use agricultural pricing information
- 22 from commercial livestock or domestic animal auction markets and
- 23 other livestock or domestic animal market information as determined
- 24 by the director to determine the value of condemned livestock or
- 25 domestic animals.
- 26 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5),
- 27 indemnification for individual livestock or domestic animals within

- 1 a herd, flock, or school shall be based upon 100% of the fair
- 2 market value of that type of livestock or domestic animal on the
- 3 date of the appraisal and marketable for the purpose for which the
- 4 livestock or domestic animal was intended. , not to exceed
- 5 \$4,000.00 for each livestock or domestic animal. The appraisal
- 6 determination shall not delay the slaughter, destruction, or
- 7 disposition of the livestock or domestic animals. The
- 8 indemnification amount under this subsection shall include a
- 9 deduction for any compensation received, or to be received, from
- 10 any other source including, but not limited to, indemnification by
- 11 the United States department of agriculture, insurance, salvage
- 12 value, or any monetary value obtained to encourage disposal of
- 13 infected or exposed livestock or domestic animals in accordance
- 14 with a disease control or eradication program. The owner OF THE
- 15 LIVESTOCK OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS shall furnish to the department all
- 16 records indicating other sources of indemnity. An affidavit signed
- 17 by the owner attesting to the amount of compensation for the
- 18 livestock received or to be received from any other source shall
- 19 accompany the appraisal certificate AND SHALL BE SUBMITTED before
- 20 indemnification IS PAID under this section.
- 21 (4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5),
- 22 indemnification for entire herd, flock, or school depopulations of
- 23 livestock or domestic animals shall be based upon 100% of the fair
- 24 market value of that type of animal on the date of the appraisal
- 25 and marketable for the purpose for which the livestock or domestic
- 26 animal was intended. , not to exceed an average of \$4,000.00 per
- 27 animal in the flock, herd, or school. The appraisal determination

- 1 shall not delay depopulation. The indemnification amount under this
- 2 section shall include a deduction for any compensation received, or
- 3 to be received, from any other source including, but not limited
- 4 to, indemnification by the United States department of agriculture,
- 5 insurance, salvage value, or any monetary value obtained to
- 6 encourage disposal of infected or exposed livestock or domestic
- 7 animals in accordance with a disease control or eradication
- 8 program. The owner OF THE LIVESTOCK OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS shall
- 9 furnish to the department all records indicating other sources of
- 10 indemnity. An affidavit signed by the owner attesting to the amount
- 11 of compensation for the livestock or domestic animals received, or
- 12 to be received, from any other source shall accompany the appraisal
- 13 certificate prior to AND SHALL BE SUBMITTED BEFORE indemnification
- 14 IS PAID under this section.
- 15 (5) The department may provide for indemnity pursuant to this
- 16 section not to exceed \$100,000.00 per order, from any line item in
- 17 the annual budget for the department in the applicable STATE fiscal
- 18 year. Any agreement greater than \$100,000.00 entered into between
- 19 the department and an owner of livestock OR DOMESTIC ANIMALS shall
- 20 contain a provision indicating that, notwithstanding the terms of
- 21 the agreement, indemnification shall be subject to specific
- 22 appropriations by the legislature and not be paid from department
- 23 funds.
- 24 (6) Acceptance of compensation under this act constitutes a
- 25 full and complete release of any claim the owner has against the
- 26 state of Michigan, its departments, agencies, officers, employees,
- 27 agents, and contractors to the extent these persons were acting on

- 1 behalf of the state, within the scope of their employment with the
- 2 state or under the direction of the state, its departments,
- 3 agencies, officers, or employees, arising out of testing, purchase,
- 4 removal, slaughter, destruction, and other disposition of the
- 5 owner's animals.
- 6 (7) The right to indemnity from the state for animals
- 7 condemned and ordered slaughtered, destroyed, or otherwise disposed
- 8 of by the director applies only to native livestock and native
- 9 domestic animals. Indemnification shall DOES not apply to livestock
- 10 or domestic animals determined by the department to be imported
- 11 without meeting import requirements such as official interstate
- 12 health certificate or official interstate certificate of veterinary
- 13 inspection, required testing, required vaccination, or for
- 14 livestock or domestic animals determined by the department to have
- 15 been illegally moved within this state. An owner is not entitled to
- 16 indemnity from the state for an animal that comes into the
- 17 possession of the owner with the owner's knowledge that the animal
- 18 is diseased or is suspected of having been exposed to an
- 19 infectious, contagious, or toxicological disease. In addition, the
- 20 director shall not indemnify an owner for animals that have been
- 21 exposed to an animal that comes in to the possession of the owner
- 22 with the owner's knowledge that the animal is diseased or is
- 23 suspected of having been exposed to an infectious, contagious, or
- 24 toxicological disease.
- 25 (8) A premises that has been depopulated shall be cleaned and
- 26 disinfected as prescribed by the director.
- 27 (9) Repopulation of the premises, except as approved by the

- 1 director, shall not confer eligibility for future indemnity under
- 2 this section.
- 3 (10) The department may cooperate and coordinate with the
- 4 secretary of the United States department of agriculture or the
- 5 secretary's authorized representative or other governmental
- 6 departments or agencies regarding indemnification under this
- 7 section.
- 8 (11) Not less than annually, within WITHIN 60 days after the
- 9 close of the EACH STATE fiscal year, the director shall make SUBMIT
- 10 a written report to the standing committees of the house of
- 11 representatives and senate having jurisdiction on agricultural and
- 12 farming issues. The report will SHALL include ALL OF the following:
- 13 (a) The amount expended by the department for bovine
- 14 tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal year.
- 15 (b) An explanation of the expenditures made by the department
- 16 for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal
- **17** year.
- 18 (c) The status of bovine tuberculosis eradication efforts in
- 19 Michigan.
- 20 (12) Not less than annually, within WITHIN 60 days after the
- 21 close of the EACH STATE fiscal year, the director of the department
- 22 of natural resources shall make-SUBMIT a written report to the
- 23 standing committees of the house of representatives and senate
- 24 having jurisdiction on agricultural and farming issues. The report
- 25 will SHALL include ALL OF the following:
- 26 (a) The amount expended by the department of natural resources
- 27 for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the preceding fiscal

- 1 year.
- 2 (b) An explanation of the expenditures made by the department
- 3 of natural resources for bovine tuberculosis eradication during the
- 4 preceding fiscal year.
