THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

An act to license and regulate private security guards,

private security police, private security guard agencies ALARM

- Sec. 2. (1) As used in this act:

- 19 (b) "Department" means the department of energy, labor, and

- 22 department means the department of state police.
- (c) "Governing board" means a board of regents, board of
- 24 trustees, board of governors, board of control, or other governing
- 25 body of an institution of higher education.
- 26 (d) "Licensee" means a sole proprietorship, firm, company,
- 27 partnership, limited liability company, or corporation PERSON

- 1 licensed under this act.
- 2 (E) "PERSON" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, PARTNERSHIP, LIMITED
- 3 LIABILITY COMPANY, CORPORATION, OR OTHER LEGAL ENTITY.
- 4 (F) (e) "Private college security force" means a security
- 5 force created under section 37.
- 6 (f) "Private security guard" means an individual or an
- 7 employee of an employer who offers, for hire, to provide protection
- 8 of property on the premises of another, and includes an employee of
- 9 a private college security force.
- 10 (g) "Private security police" means that part of a business
- 11 organization or educational institution primarily responsible for
- 12 the protection of property on the premises of the business
- 13 organization, but does not include a private college security
- 14 force.
- 15 (G) (h) "Security alarm system" means a detection device or an
- 16 assembly of equipment and devices arranged to signal the presence
- 17 of a hazard requiring THAT REQUIRES urgent attention or to which
- 18 police are expected to respond. Security alarm system includes any
- 19 system that can electronically cause an expected response by a law
- 20 enforcement agency to a premises by means of the activation of an
- 21 audible signal, visible signal, electronic notification, or video
- 22 signal, or any combination of these signals, to a remote monitoring
- 23 location on or off the premises. Security alarm system does not
- 24 include a video signal that is not transmitted over a public
- 25 communication system or a fire alarm system or an alarm system that
- 26 monitors temperature, humidity, or other condition not directly
- 27 related to the detection of an unauthorized intrusion into a

- 1 premises or an attempted robbery at a premises.
- 2 (H) (i) "Security alarm system agent" means a person employed
- 3 by a security alarm system contractor whose duties include the
- 4 altering, installing, maintaining, moving, repairing, replacing,
- 5 selling, servicing, monitoring, responding to, or causing others to
- 6 respond to a security alarm system.
- 7 (I) (j)—"Security alarm system contractor" means a sole
- 8 proprietorship, firm, company, partnership, limited liability
- 9 company, or corporation PERSON engaged in the installation,
- 10 maintenance, alteration, monitoring, or servicing of security alarm
- 11 systems or who responds to a security alarm system. Security alarm
- 12 system contractor does not include a business that only sells or
- 13 manufactures security alarm systems unless the business services
- 14 security alarm systems, installs security alarm systems, monitors
- 15 or arranges for the monitoring of a security alarm system, or
- 16 responds to security alarm systems at the A protected premises.
- 17 (k) "Security business" means a person or business entity
- 18 engaged in offering, arranging, or providing 1 or more of the
- 19 <u>following services:</u>
- 21 alteration, or monitoring.
- 23 <u>(iii) Private security police.</u>
- 24 (2) All businesses furnishing THAT PROVIDE security alarm
- 25 systems for the protection of persons and property AND whose
- 26 employees and security technicians travel on public property and
- 27 thoroughfares in the pursuit of their duties, are subject to this

- 1 act.
- 2 (3) A communications common carrier providing communications
- 3 channels under tariffs for the transmission of signals in
- 4 connection with an alarm system is not subject to this act.
- 5 (4) Railroad policemen appointed and commissioned under the
- 6 railroad code of 1993, 1993 PA 354, MCL 462.101 to 462.451, are
- 7 exempt from this act.
- 8 Sec. 3. (1) Unless licensed under this act, a sole
- 9 proprietorship, firm, company, partnership, limited liability
- 10 company, or corporation PERSON shall not engage in the business of
- 11 security alarm system contractor , private security guard, private
- 12 security police, OR private college security force. , patrol
- 13 service, or an agency furnishing those services. A person , firm,
- 14 company, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation
- 15 shall not advertise its business to be that of security alarm
- 16 system contractor OR security alarm system agent private
- 17 security guard agency, or an agency furnishing those services
- 18 without having UNLESS IT HAS first obtained from the department a
- 19 license to do so for each office and branch office to be owned,
- 20 conducted, managed, or maintained for the conduct of that business.
- 21 (2) A person shall not sell, install, operate, adjust, arrange
- 22 for, or contract to provide a device which upon activation THAT
- 23 WHEN ACTIVATED, either mechanically, electronically, or by any
- 24 other means, initiates the automatic calling or dialing of, or
- 25 makes a connection directly to, a telephone assigned to a public
- 26 service, utility, or police agency, for the purpose of delivering a
- 27 recorded message, without first receiving written permission from

- 2 (3) A person who violates this section is guilty of a felony
- 3 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of
- 4 not more than \$1,000.00, or both.
- 5 Sec. 4. The department may issue separate licenses to security
- 6 alarm system contractors -AND private college security forces. -
- 7 private security police, and private security guard agencies. This
- 8 section does not prevent a private detective or private
- 9 investigator licensed under the professional investigator licensure
- 10 act, 1965 PA 285, MCL 338.821 to 338.851, from performing the
- 11 services of a private security quard or private security police
- 12 except that a private security guard or private security police may
- 13 not perform the services of a private detective or private
- 14 investigator without obtaining a private detective or private
- 15 investigator license WITHIN THE SCOPE OF HIS OR HER PRACTICE THAT
- 16 MAY INVOLVE ACTIVITIES REGULATED BY THIS ACT.
- 17 Sec. 5. The department, upon IF IT RECEIVES A proper
- 18 application and upon being—IS satisfied that the applicant is
- 19 qualified, THE DEPARTMENT shall issue the applicant a license to
- 20 conduct business as an A SECURITY alarm system contractor or a
- 21 private security guard or agency for a period of 2 years from date
- 22 of issuance. Upon the issuance of IF a license to conduct business
- 23 as an A SECURITY alarm system contractor or a private security
- 24 guard or agency, the applicant shall IS ISSUED TO A PERSON, THAT
- 25 LICENSEE IS not be—required to obtain any other license from a

In lieu of a bond, the AN applicant may furnish a 13 14 policy of insurance issued by an insurer authorized to do business in this state naming THAT NAMES the licensee and the state as 15 coinsureds in the amount of \$25,000.00 for property damages DAMAGE, 16 17 \$100,000.00 for injury to or death of 1 person, and \$200,000.00 for 18 injuries to or deaths of more than 1 person arising out of the 19 operation of the licensed activity. The license is valid for 2 20 years but is revocable at all times by the department for cause 21 shown. The bonds shall be taken in the name PAYABLE TO THE 22 DEPARTMENT FOR THE BENEFIT of the people of the THIS state. and a A 23 person injured by the willful, malicious, and wrongful act of the 24 licensee or any of his or her agents or employees may bring an 25 action on the bond or insurance policy in his or her own name to 26 recover damages suffered by reason of the wrongful act. The license

- 23 issued to him or her for use in connection with his or her
- 24 employer's business is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- Sec. 19. (1) The A LICENSEE SHALL NOT WEAR OR ALLOW EMPLOYEES
- 26 TO WEAR A particular type of uniform and insignia worn by a
- 27 licensee or his or her employees must be THAT IS NOT approved by

- 1 the department, and shall not deceive or confuse OR DECEIVES OR
- 2 CONFUSES the public, or be—IS identical with that of a law
- 3 enforcement officer of the federal government, THIS state, or a
