- 1 SEC. 2212C. (1) EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2012, EACH INSURER
- 2 ISSUING AN EXPENSE-INCURRED HOSPITAL, MEDICAL, OR SURGICAL POLICY
- 3 OR CERTIFICATE, HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATION, OR HEALTH CARE
- 4 CORPORATION OPERATING PURSUANT TO THE NONPROFIT HEALTH CARE
- 5 CORPORATION REFORM ACT, 1980 PA 350, MCL 550.1101 TO 550.1704,
- 6 SHALL REQUIRE AND ACCEPT THE STANDARD PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FORM
- 7 DEVELOPED UNDER SUBSECTION (3) WHEN REQUIRING PRIOR AUTHORIZATION
- 8 FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUG BENEFITS FOR ANY POLICY, CERTIFICATE, OR
- 9 CONTRACT THAT REQUIRES PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUG

- 1 HEALTH CARE CORPORATION FAILS TO REQUIRE, FAILS TO ACCEPT, OR FAILS
