SENATE BILL No. 641

September 13, 2011, Introduced by Senators KAHN, GREEN, SCHUITMAKER, BRANDENBURG and PAPPAGEORGE and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 224 (MCL 257.224), as amended by 2006 PA 177.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 224. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act
 regarding tabs or stickers, upon registering a vehicle, the
 secretary of state shall issue to the owner 1 registration plate.
 - (2) A registration plate shall display the registration number assigned to the vehicle for which the registration plate is issued; the name of this state, which may be abbreviated; and when the registration plate expires, which may be shown by a tab or sticker furnished by the secretary of state.
 - (3) A registration plate issued for motor vehicles owned and

- 1 operated by this state; a state institution; a municipality; a
- 2 privately incorporated, nonprofit volunteer fire department; or a
- 3 nonpublic, nonprofit college or university of this state shall not
- 4 expire at any particular time but shall be renewed when the
- 5 registration plate is worn out or is illegible. This registration
- 6 plate shall be assigned upon proper application and payment of the
- 7 applicable fee and may be used on any eligible vehicle titled to
- 8 the applicant if a written record is kept of the vehicles upon
- 9 which the registration plate is used. The written record shall

- 11 vehicle. The record shall be open to inspection by a law
- 12 enforcement officer or a representative of the secretary of state.

- 15 40307; a vehicle owned by a nonprofit organization and used to
- 16 transport equipment for providing dialysis treatment to children at
- 17 camp; an emergency support vehicle used exclusively for emergencies
- 18 and owned and operated by a federally recognized nonprofit
- 19 charitable organization; a vehicle owned and operated by a
- 20 nonprofit veterans center; a motor vehicle having a truck chassis
- 21 and a locomotive or ship's body which is owned by a nonprofit
- 22 veterans organization and used exclusively in parades and civic
- 23 events; a vehicle owned and operated by a nonprofit recycling
- 24 center or a federally recognized nonprofit conservation
- organization until December 31, 2000; a motor vehicle owned and
- 26 operated by a senior citizen center; and a registration plate
- 27 issued for buses including station wagons, carryalls, or similarly

- 1 constructed vehicles owned and operated by a nonprofit parents'
- 2 transportation corporation used for school purposes, parochial

- 4 by a nonprofit youth organization or nonprofit rehabilitation

- 6 applicable tax provided in section 801(1)(g) or (h) to the
- 7 applicant for the vehicle identified in the application. The
- 8 vehicle shall be used exclusively for activities of the school or

- 8 be plainly readable from a distance of 100 feet during daylight.
- 9 The secretary of state may issue a tab or tabs designating the
- 10 month and year of expiration.
- 11 (7) The secretary of state shall issue for every passenger
- 12 motor vehicle rented without a driver the same type TYPES of
- 13 registration plate PLATES as the type TYPES of registration plate
- 14 PLATES issued for private passenger vehicles.
- 15 (8) A person shall not operate a vehicle on the public
- 16 highways or streets of this state displaying a registration plate
- 17 other than the registration plate issued for the vehicle by the
- 18 secretary of state, except as provided in this chapter for
- 19 nonresidents, and by assignment provided in subsection (3).
- 20 (9) The registration plate displayed on a vehicle registered
- 21 on the basis of elected gross weight shall indicate the elected
- 22 gross weight for which the vehicle is registered.
