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## **SENATE BILL No. 119**

February 9, 2011, Introduced by Senators COLBECK, GREEN, MOOLENAAR, WALKER, NOFS, EMMONS, CASPERSON, PROOS and PAVLOV and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code,"

(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1167.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 1167. (1) THE WEEK OF VETERAN'S DAY, NOVEMBER 11, EACH
- 2 YEAR IS DESIGNATED AS "CELEBRATE FREEDOM WEEK" TO BE OBSERVED BY
- 3 ALL PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS AND PUPILS AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.
- 4 OBSERVATION OF CELEBRATE FREEDOM WEEK UNDER THIS SECTION IS IN
  - ADDITION TO THE COMMEMORATIVE EXERCISE IN OBSERVANCE OF VETERAN'S
  - DAY REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 1175.
- 7 (2) THE BOARD OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF A
- 8 PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL ENSURE THAT, DURING CELEBRATE FREEDOM
- 9 WEEK OR DURING ANOTHER FULL SCHOOL WEEK AS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD
- 10 OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS, EACH SOCIAL STUDIES CLASS SHALL INCLUDE

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- 1 APPROPRIATE INSTRUCTION CONCERNING THE INTENT, MEANING, AND
- 2 IMPORTANCE OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE AND THE UNITED STATES
- 3 CONSTITUTION, INCLUDING THE BILL OF RIGHTS, IN THEIR HISTORICAL
- 4 CONTEXTS. THE STUDY OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE SHALL
- 5 INCLUDE THE STUDY OF THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE IDEAS EXPRESSED IN
- 6 THAT DOCUMENT TO SUBSEQUENT AMERICAN HISTORY, INCLUDING THE
- 7 RELATIONSHIP OF ITS IDEAS TO THE RICH DIVERSITY OF THE AMERICAN
- 8 PEOPLE AS A NATION OF IMMIGRANTS, THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION, THE
- 9 FORMULATION OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION, AND THE ABOLITIONIST
- 10 MOVEMENT, WHICH LED TO THE EMANCIPATION PROCLAMATION AND THE
- 11 WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE MOVEMENT.
- 12 (3) EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS SUBSECTION, THE BOARD
- 13 OF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL
- 14 ACADEMY SHALL ALSO ENSURE THAT, DURING CELEBRATE FREEDOM WEEK OR
- 15 DURING THE OTHER FULL SCHOOL WEEK DETERMINED UNDER SUBSECTION (2),
- 16 ALL PUPILS IN GRADES 3 TO 12 ARE REQUIRED TO STUDY AND RECITE THE
- 17 FOLLOWING TEXT FROM THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE: "WE HOLD THESE
- 18 TRUTHS TO BE SELF-EVIDENT, THAT ALL MEN ARE CREATED EQUAL, THAT
- 19 THEY ARE ENDOWED BY THEIR CREATOR WITH CERTAIN UNALIENABLE RIGHTS,
- 20 THAT AMONG THESE ARE LIFE, LIBERTY AND THE PURSUIT OF HAPPINESS--
- 21 THAT TO SECURE THESE RIGHTS, GOVERNMENTS ARE INSTITUTED AMONG MEN,
- 22 DERIVING THEIR JUST POWERS FROM THE CONSENT OF THE GOVERNED.".
- 23 A BOARD OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL EXCUSE FROM THE RECITATION
- 24 REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION A PUPIL WHO MEETS ANY OF THE
- 25 FOLLOWING:
- 26 (A) THE PUPIL'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN SUBMITS TO THE SCHOOL
- 27 DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY A WRITTEN REQUEST THAT THE PUPIL

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- 1 BE EXCUSED FROM THE RECITATION.
- 2 (B) THE PUPIL HAS A CONSCIENTIOUS OBJECTION TO THE RECITATION,
- 3 AS DETERMINED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY.
- 4 (C) THE PUPIL IS THE CHILD OF A REPRESENTATIVE OF A FOREIGN
- 5 GOVERNMENT TO WHOM THE UNITED STATES GOVERNMENT EXTENDS DIPLOMATIC
- 6 IMMUNITY.
