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## **SENATE BILL No. 150**

February 16, 2011, Introduced by Senator MEEKHOF and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending section 17015 (MCL 333.17015), as amended by 2006 PA 77.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 17015. (1) Subject to subsection (10), a physician shall not perform an abortion otherwise permitted by law without the patient's informed written consent, given freely and without coercion.
  - (2) For purposes of this section:
  - (a) "Abortion" means the intentional use of an instrument, drug, or other substance or device to terminate a woman's pregnancy for a purpose other than to increase the probability of a live

9 birth, to preserve the life or health of the child after live

- 1 birth, or to remove a dead fetus. Abortion does not include the use
- 2 or prescription of a drug or device intended as a contraceptive.
- 3 (b) "Fetus" means an individual organism of the species homo
- 4 sapiens in utero.
- 5 (c) "Local health department representative" means a person,
- 6 who meets 1 or more of the licensing requirements listed in
- 7 subdivision (f) (G) and who is employed by, or under contract to
- 8 provide services on behalf of, a local health department.
- 9 (d) "Medical emergency" means that condition which, on the
- 10 basis of the physician's good faith clinical judgment, so
- 11 complicates the medical condition of a pregnant woman as to
- 12 necessitate the immediate abortion of her pregnancy to avert her
- 13 death or for which a delay will create serious risk of substantial
- 14 and irreversible impairment of a major bodily function.
- (e) "Medical service" means the provision of a treatment,
- 16 procedure, medication, examination, diagnostic test, assessment, or
- 17 counseling, including, but not limited to, a pregnancy test,
- 18 ultrasound, pelvic examination, or an abortion.
- 19 (F) "MOST TECHNOLOGICALLY ADVANCED ULTRASOUND EQUIPMENT
- 20 AVAILABLE AT THAT LOCATION" MEANS ULTRASOUND IMAGING EQUIPMENT THAT
- 21 MEETS BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:
- 22 (i) IS CAPABLE OF PROVIDING THE MOST VISIBLY CLEAR IMAGE OF THE
- 23 GROSS ANATOMICAL DEVELOPMENT OF THE FETUS.
- 24 (ii) IS PRESENT IN THE CLINICAL AREA WITHIN A BUILDING WHERE
- 25 THE PATIENT COUNSELING, PREOPERATIVE PROCEDURES, AND ABORTION ARE
- 26 TO BE PERFORMED AND THAT IS UNDER THE SUPERVISION AND DISCRETION OF
- 27 THE ATTENDING PHYSICIAN OR QUALIFIED PERSON ASSISTING THE PHYSICIAN

## 1 TO UTILIZE FOR DIAGNOSTIC OR OPERATIVE PURPOSES.

- 2 (G) (f) "Qualified person assisting the physician" means
- 3 another physician or a physician's assistant licensed under this
- 4 part or part 175, a fully licensed or limited licensed psychologist
- 5 licensed under part 182, a professional counselor licensed under
- 6 part 181, a registered professional nurse or a licensed practical
- 7 nurse licensed under part 172, or a social worker licensed under
- 8 part 185.
- 9 (H) (g) "Probable gestational age of the fetus" means the
- 10 gestational age of the fetus at the time an abortion is planned to
- 11 be performed.
- 12 (I) (h) "Provide the patient with a physical copy" means
- 13 confirming that the patient accessed the internet website described
- 14 in subsection (5) and received a printed valid confirmation form
- 15 from the website and including that form in the patient's medical
- 16 record or giving a patient a copy of a required document by 1 or
- more of the following means:
- 18 (i) In person.
- 19 (ii) By registered mail, return receipt requested.
- 20 (iii) By parcel delivery service that requires the recipient to
- 21 provide a signature in order to receive delivery of a parcel.
- 22 (iv) By facsimile transmission.
- 23 (3) Subject to subsection (10), a physician or a qualified
- 24 person assisting the physician shall do all of the following not
- 25 less than 24 hours before that physician performs an abortion upon
- 26 a patient who is a pregnant woman:
- 27 (a) Confirm that, according to the best medical judgment of a

- 1 physician, the patient is pregnant, and determine the probable
- 2 gestational age of the fetus.
- 3 (b) Orally describe, in language designed to be understood by
- 4 the patient, taking into account her age, level of maturity, and
- 5 intellectual capability, each of the following:
- 6 (i) The probable gestational age of the fetus she is carrying.
- 7 (ii) Information about what to do and whom to contact should
- 8 medical complications arise from the abortion.
- 9 (iii) Information about how to obtain pregnancy prevention
- 10 information through the department of community health.
- 11 (c) Provide the patient with a physical copy of the written
- 12 summary described in subsection (11)(b) that corresponds to the
- 13 procedure the patient will undergo and is provided by the
- 14 department of community health. If the procedure has not been
- 15 recognized by the department, but is otherwise allowed under
- 16 Michigan law, and the department has not provided a written summary
- 17 for that procedure, the physician shall develop and provide a
- 18 written summary that describes the procedure, any known risks or
- 19 complications of the procedure, and risks associated with live
- 20 birth and meets the requirements of subsection (11)(b)(iii) through
- **21** (*vii*).
- 22 (d) Provide the patient with a physical copy of a medically
- 23 accurate depiction, illustration, or photograph and description of
- 24 a fetus supplied by the department of community health pursuant to
- 25 subsection (11)(a) at the gestational age nearest the probable
- 26 gestational age of the patient's fetus.
- (e) Provide the patient with a physical copy of the prenatal

- 1 care and parenting information pamphlet distributed by the
- 2 department of community health under section 9161.
- 3 (4) The requirements of subsection (3) may be fulfilled by the
- 4 physician or a qualified person assisting the physician at a
- 5 location other than the health facility where the abortion is to be
- 6 performed. The requirement of subsection (3)(a) that a patient's
- 7 pregnancy be confirmed may be fulfilled by a local health
- 8 department under subsection (18). The requirements of subsection
- 9 (3) cannot be fulfilled by the patient accessing an internet
- 10 website other than the internet website described in subsection (5)
- 11 that is maintained through the department.
- 12 (5) The requirements of subsection (3)(c) through (e) may be
- 13 fulfilled by a patient accessing the internet website maintained
- 14 and operated through the department and receiving a printed, valid
- 15 confirmation form from the website that the patient has reviewed
- 16 the information required in subsection (3)(c) through (e) at least
- 17 24 hours before an abortion being performed on the patient. The
- 18 website shall not require any information be supplied by the
- 19 patient. The department shall not track, compile, or otherwise keep
- 20 a record of information that would identify a patient who accesses
- 21 this website. The patient shall supply the valid confirmation form
- 22 to the physician or qualified person assisting the physician to be
- 23 included in the patient's medical record to comply with this
- 24 subsection.
- 25 (6) Subject to subsection (10), before obtaining the patient's
- 26 signature on the acknowledgment and consent form, a physician
- 27 personally and in the presence of the patient shall do all of the

- 1 following:
- 2 (a) Provide the patient with the physician's name and inform
- 3 the patient of her right to withhold or withdraw her consent to the
- 4 abortion at any time before performance of the abortion.
- 5 (b) Orally describe, in language designed to be understood by
- 6 the patient, taking into account her age, level of maturity, and
- 7 intellectual capability, each of the following:
- 8 (i) The specific risk, if any, to the patient of the
- 9 complications that have been associated with the procedure the
- 10 patient will undergo, based on the patient's particular medical
- 11 condition and history as determined by the physician.
- 12 (ii) The specific risk of complications, if any, to the patient
- 13 if she chooses to continue the pregnancy based on the patient's
- 14 particular medical condition and history as determined by a
- 15 physician.
- 16 (7) To protect a patient's privacy, the information set forth
- in subsection (3) and subsection (6) shall not be disclosed to the
- 18 patient in the presence of another patient.
- 19 (8) If at any time prior to BEFORE the performance of an
- 20 abortion, a patient undergoes an ultrasound examination, or a
- 21 physician determines that ultrasound imaging will be used during
- 22 the course of a patient's abortion, the physician or qualified
- 23 person assisting the physician shall provide the patient with the
- 24 opportunity to view or decline to view an active ultrasound image
- 25 of the fetus, and offer to provide the patient with a physical
- 26 picture of the ultrasound image of the fetus prior to the
- 27 performance of the abortion. BEFORE THE PATIENT SIGNS THE

- 1 ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND CONSENT FORM DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (11) (C) AND
- 2 BEFORE ANY PREOPERATIVE SEDATIVE OR ANESTHETIC MEDICATIONS ARE
- 3 ADMINISTERED TO THE PATIENT. IN COMPLYING WITH THIS SUBSECTION, THE
- 4 PHYSICIAN OR QUALIFIED PERSON ASSISTING THE PHYSICIAN SHALL ENSURE
- 5 THAT THE MOST TECHNOLOGICALLY ADVANCED ULTRASOUND EQUIPMENT
- 6 AVAILABLE AT THAT LOCATION IS USED FOR THE ULTRASOUND EXAMINATION,
- 7 FOR THE PATIENT'S VIEWING AN ACTIVE ULTRASOUND IMAGE, AND FOR
- 8 CREATING THE PHYSICAL PICTURE OF THE ULTRASOUND IMAGE AND THAT THE
- 9 ULTRASOUND IMAGE OF THE FETUS IS OF A QUALITY CONSISTENT WITH THE
- 10 CURRENT MEDICAL STANDARD OF CARE FOR PRENATAL DIAGNOSTIC PURPOSES
- 11 GIVEN THE PATIENT'S GESTATIONAL STAGE OF PREGNANCY AND THE
- 12 EQUIPMENT USED. HOWEVER, IF, IN THE BEST MEDICAL JUDGMENT OF THE
- 13 PHYSICIAN, THE USE OF THE MOST TECHNOLOGICALLY ADVANCED ULTRASOUND
- 14 EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE AT THAT LOCATION WOULD JEOPARDIZE THE PATIENT'S
- 15 PHYSICAL HEALTH OR OTHERWISE HARM THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE PATIENT
- 16 OR THE FETUS, OR BOTH, THE PHYSICIAN OR QUALIFIED PERSON ASSISTING
- 17 THE PHYSICIAN MAY USE ALTERNATIVE ULTRASOUND EQUIPMENT. Before
- 18 performing an abortion on a patient who is a pregnant woman, a
- 19 physician or a qualified person assisting the physician shall do
- 20 all of the following:
- 21 (a) Obtain the patient's signature on the acknowledgment and
- 22 consent form described in subsection (11)(c) confirming that she
- 23 has received the information required under subsection (3).
- 24 (b) Provide the patient with a physical copy of the signed
- 25 acknowledgment and consent form described in subsection (11)(c).
- (c) Retain a copy of the signed acknowledgment and consent
- 27 form described in subsection (11)(c) and, if applicable, a copy of

- 1 the pregnancy certification form completed under subsection
- 2 (18)(b), in the patient's medical record.
- 3 (9) This subsection does not prohibit notifying the patient
- 4 that payment for medical services will be required or that
- 5 collection of payment in full for all medical services provided or
- 6 planned may be demanded after the 24-hour period described in this
- 7 subsection has expired. A physician or an agent of the physician
- 8 shall not collect payment, in whole or in part, for a medical
- 9 service provided to or planned for a patient before the expiration
- 10 of 24 hours from the time the patient has done either or both of
- 11 the following, except in the case of a physician or an agent of a
- 12 physician receiving capitated payments or under a salary
- 13 arrangement for providing those medical services:
- 14 (a) Inquired about obtaining an abortion after her pregnancy
- 15 is confirmed and she has received from that physician or a
- 16 qualified person assisting the physician the information required
- under subsection (3)(c) and (d).
- (b) Scheduled an abortion to be performed by that physician.
- 19 (10) If the attending physician, utilizing his or her
- 20 experience, judgment, and professional competence, determines that
- 21 a medical emergency exists and necessitates performance of an
- 22 abortion before the requirements of subsections (1), (3), and (6)
- 23 can be met, the physician is exempt from the requirements of
- 24 subsections (1), (3), and (6), may perform the abortion, and shall
- 25 maintain a written record identifying with specificity the medical
- 26 factors upon which the determination of the medical emergency is

27 based.

- 1 (11) The department of community health shall do each of the
- 2 following:
- 3 (a) Produce medically accurate depictions, illustrations, or
- 4 photographs of the development of a human fetus that indicate by
- 5 scale the actual size of the fetus at 2-week intervals from the
- 6 fourth week through the twenty-eighth week of gestation. Each
- 7 depiction, illustration, or photograph shall be accompanied by a
- 8 printed description, in nontechnical English, Arabic, and Spanish,
- 9 of the probable anatomical and physiological characteristics of the
- 10 fetus at that particular state of gestational development.
- 11 (b) Subject to subdivision (g), develop, draft, and print, in
- 12 nontechnical English, Arabic, and Spanish, written standardized
- 13 summaries, based upon the various medical procedures used to abort
- 14 pregnancies, that do each of the following:
- 15 (i) Describe, individually and on separate documents, those
- 16 medical procedures used to perform abortions in this state that are
- 17 recognized by the department.
- 18 (ii) Identify the physical complications that have been
- 19 associated with each procedure described in subparagraph (i) and
- 20 with live birth, as determined by the department. In identifying
- 21 these complications, the department shall consider the annual
- 22 statistical report required under section 2835(6)—2835, and shall
- 23 consider studies concerning complications that have been published
- 24 in a peer review medical journal, with particular attention paid to
- 25 the design of the study, and shall consult with the federal centers
- 26 for disease control AND PREVENTION, the American college CONGRESS
- 27 of obstetricians and gynecologists, the Michigan state medical

- 1 society, or any other source that the department determines
- 2 appropriate for the purpose.
- 3 (iii) State that as the result of an abortion, some women may
- 4 experience depression, feelings of guilt, sleep disturbance, loss
- 5 of interest in work or sex, or anger, and that if these symptoms
- 6 occur and are intense or persistent, professional help is
- 7 recommended.
- (iv) State that not all of the complications listed in
- 9 subparagraph (ii) may pertain to that particular patient and refer
- 10 the patient to her physician for more personalized information.
- 11 (v) Identify services available through public agencies to
- 12 assist the patient during her pregnancy and after the birth of her
- 13 child, should she choose to give birth and maintain custody of her
- 14 child.
- 15 (vi) Identify services available through public agencies to
- 16 assist the patient in placing her child in an adoptive or foster
- 17 home, should she choose to give birth but not maintain custody of
- 18 her child.
- 19 (vii) Identify services available through public agencies to
- 20 assist the patient and provide counseling should she experience
- 21 subsequent adverse psychological effects from the abortion.
- (c) Develop, draft, and print, in nontechnical English,
- 23 Arabic, and Spanish, an acknowledgment and consent form that
- 24 includes only the following language above a signature line for the
- 25 patient:
- 26 "I, \_\_\_\_\_, hereby authorize Dr.
- ("the physician") and any assistant designated

- 1 by the physician to perform upon me the following operation(s) or
- procedure(s):
- 3
- 4 (Name of operation(s) or procedure(s))
- 5
- **A.** I understand that I am approximately weeks pregnant.
- 7 I consent to an abortion procedure to terminate my pregnancy. I
- 8 understand that I have the right to withdraw my consent to the
- 9 abortion procedure at any time prior to performance of that
- 10 procedure.
- 11 B. I acknowledge that at least 24 hours before the scheduled
- 12 abortion I have received a physical copy of each of the following:
- 1. (a) A medically accurate depiction, illustration, or
- 14 photograph of a fetus at the probable gestational age of the fetus
- 15 I am carrying.
- 2. (b) A written description of the medical procedure that
- 17 will be used to perform the abortion.
- 18 3. (c)—A prenatal care and parenting information pamphlet. If
- 19 any of the above listed documents were transmitted by facsimile, I
- 20 certify that the documents were clear and legible.
- 21 C. I acknowledge that the physician who will perform the
- 22 abortion has orally described all of the following to me:
- 23 1.  $\frac{(i)}{}$  The specific risk to me, if any, of the complications
- 24 that have been associated with the procedure I am scheduled to
- 25 undergo.
- 26 2. (ii) The specific risk to me, if any, of the complications
- 27 if I choose to continue the pregnancy.

- 1 D. I acknowledge that I have received all of the following
- 2 information:
- 3 1. (d) Information about what to do and whom to contact in the
- 4 event that complications arise from the abortion.
- 5 2. (e) Information pertaining to available pregnancy related
- 6 services.
- 7 E. I ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE PHYSICIAN OR QUALIFIED PERSON
- 8 ASSISTING THE PHYSICIAN HAS INFORMED ME OF THE FOLLOWING [SELECT 1
- 9 OF THE FOLLOWING BY PLACING YOUR INITIALS AFTER THE APPLICABLE
- 10 SENTENCE]:
- 1. AN ULTRASOUND EXAMINATION OR IMAGING WILL BE PERFORMED
- 12 BEFORE OR USED DURING THE ABORTION.
- 2. AN ULTRASOUND EXAMINATION OR IMAGING WILL NOT BE PERFORMED
- 14 BEFORE OR USED DURING THE ABORTION.
- 15 F. IF I HAVE SELECTED PARAGRAPH E1 ABOVE INDICATING THAT AN
- 16 ULTRASOUND EXAMINATION OR IMAGING WILL BE PERFORMED BEFORE OR USED
- 17 DURING THE ABORTION, I ACKNOWLEDGE THAT THE PHYSICIAN OR QUALIFIED
- 18 PERSON ASSISTING THE PHYSICIAN HAS DONE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 1. PROVIDED ME WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO VIEW OR DECLINE TO VIEW
- 20 AN ACTIVE ULTRASOUND IMAGE OF THE FETUS.
- 2. OFFERED TO PROVIDE ME WITH A PHYSICAL PICTURE OF THE
- 22 ULTRASOUND IMAGE OF THE FETUS.
- 23 3. OFFERED AN EXPLANATION OF THE ULTRASOUND IMAGE OF THE
- 24 FETUS.
- 25 G. I have been given an opportunity to ask questions about the
- 26 operation(s) or procedure(s). I certify that I have not been
- 27 required to make any payments for an abortion or any medical

- 1 service before the expiration of 24 hours after I received the
- 2 written materials listed in paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) PARAGRAPH
- 3 B above, or 24 hours after the time and date listed on the
- 4 confirmation form if paragraphs (a), (b), and (c) were THE
- 5 INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH B WAS viewed from the state of
- 6 Michigan internet website.".
- 7 (d) Make available to physicians through the Michigan board of
- 8 medicine and the Michigan board of osteopathic medicine and
- 9 surgery, and any person upon request the copies of medically
- 10 accurate depictions, illustrations, or photographs described in
- 11 subdivision (a), the standardized written summaries described in
- 12 subdivision (b), the acknowledgment and consent form described in
- 13 subdivision (c), the prenatal care and parenting information
- 14 pamphlet described in section 9161, and the pregnancy certification
- 15 form described in subdivision (f).
- 16 (e) The department shall not develop written summaries for
- 17 abortion procedures under subdivision (b) that utilize medication
- 18 that has not been approved by the United States food and drug
- 19 administration for use in performing an abortion.
- (f) Develop, draft, and print a certification form to be
- 21 signed by a local health department representative at the time and
- 22 place a patient has a pregnancy confirmed, as requested by the
- 23 patient, verifying the date and time the pregnancy is confirmed.
- 24 (q) Develop and maintain an internet website that allows a
- 25 patient considering an abortion to review the information required
- 26 in subsection (3)(c) through (e). After the patient reviews the
- 27 required information, the department shall assure that a

- 1 confirmation form can be printed by the patient from the internet
- 2 website that will verify the time and date the information was
- 3 reviewed. A confirmation form printed under this subdivision
- 4 becomes invalid 14 days after the date and time printed on the
- 5 confirmation form.
- 6 (h) Include on the informed consent website developed under
- 7 subdivision (g) a list of health care providers, facilities, and
- 8 clinics that offer to perform ultrasounds free of charge. The list
- 9 shall be organized geographically and shall include the name,
- 10 address, and telephone number of each health care provider,
- 11 facility, and clinic.
- 12 (12) A physician's duty to inform the patient under this
- 13 section does not require disclosure of information beyond what a
- 14 reasonably well-qualified physician licensed under this article
- 15 would possess.
- 16 (13) A written consent form meeting the requirements set forth
- 17 in this section and signed by the patient is presumed valid. The
- 18 presumption created by this subsection may be rebutted by evidence
- 19 that establishes, by a preponderance of the evidence, that consent
- 20 was obtained through fraud, negligence, deception,
- 21 misrepresentation, coercion, or duress.
- 22 (14) A completed certification form described in subsection
- 23 (11)(f) that is signed by a local health department representative
- 24 is presumed valid. The presumption created by this subsection may
- 25 be rebutted by evidence that establishes, by a preponderance of the
- 26 evidence, that the physician who relied upon the certification had
- 27 actual knowledge that the certificate contained a false or

- 1 misleading statement or signature.
- 2 (15) This section does not create a right to abortion.
- 3 (16) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, a
- 4 person shall not perform an abortion that is prohibited by law.
- 5 (17) If any portion of this act or the application of this act
- 6 to any person or circumstances is found invalid by a court, that
- 7 invalidity does not affect the remaining portions or applications
- 8 of the act that can be given effect without the invalid portion or
- 9 application, if those remaining portions are not determined by the
- 10 court to be inoperable.
- 11 (18) Upon a patient's request, each local health department
- **12** shall:
- 13 (a) Provide a pregnancy test for that patient to confirm the
- 14 pregnancy as required under subsection (3)(a) and determine the
- 15 probable gestational stage of the fetus. The local health
- 16 department need not comply with this subdivision if the
- 17 requirements of subsection (3)(a) have already been met.
- 18 (b) If a pregnancy is confirmed, ensure that the patient is
- 19 provided with a completed pregnancy certification form described in
- 20 subsection (11)(f) at the time the information is provided.
- 21 (19) The identity and address of a patient who is provided
- 22 information or who consents to an abortion pursuant to this section
- 23 is confidential and is subject to disclosure only with the consent
- 24 of the patient or by judicial process.
- 25 (20) A local health department with a file containing the
- 26 identity and address of a patient described in subsection (19) who
- 27 has been assisted by the local health department under this section

- 1 shall do both of the following:
- 2 (a) Only release the identity and address of the patient to a
- 3 physician or qualified person assisting the physician in order to
- 4 verify the receipt of the information required under this section.
- 5 (b) Destroy the information containing the identity and
- 6 address of the patient within 30 days after assisting the patient
- 7 under this section.

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
