

SENATE BILL No. 801

February 19, 2014, Introduced by Senators MOOLENAAR, WALKER, KOWALL, HANSEN, MEEKHOF, SCHUITMAKER, CASPERSON, EMMONS and BIEDA and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources, Environment and Great Lakes.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 306, entitled "Administrative procedures act of 1969," by amending section 92 (MCL 24.292), as amended by 1996 PA 237.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 92. (1) Before ~~the commencement of~~ **BEGINNING** proceedings
2 for **THE** suspension, revocation, annulment, withdrawal, recall,
3 cancellation or amendment of a license, an agency shall give
4 notice, personally or by mail, to the licensee of facts or conduct
5 ~~which warrant~~ **THAT WARRANTS** the intended action. ~~Except as~~
6 ~~otherwise provided in the support and parenting time enforcement~~
7 ~~act, Act No. 295 of the Public Acts of 1982, being sections 552.601~~
8 ~~to 552.650 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, or the regulated~~
9 ~~occupations support enforcement act, the~~ **THE** licensee shall be

1 given an opportunity to show compliance with all lawful
2 requirements for retention of the license **EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE**
3 **PROVIDED IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:**

4 (A) **THE SUPPORT AND PARENTING TIME ENFORCEMENT ACT, 1982 PA**
5 **295, MCL 552.601 TO 552.650.**

6 (B) **THE REGULATED OCCUPATION SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT ACT, 1996 PA**
7 **236, MCL 338.3431 TO 338.3436.**

8 (C) **SECTION 41309 OF THE NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL**
9 **PROTECTION ACT, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.41309.**

10 (2) If the agency finds that the public health, safety or
11 welfare requires emergency action and incorporates this finding in
12 its order, summary suspension of a license may be ordered effective
13 on the date specified in the order or on service of a certified
14 copy of the order on the licensee, whichever is later, and
15 effective during the proceedings. The proceedings shall be promptly
16 commenced and determined.

17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
18 unless Senate Bill No. 800

19 of the 97th Legislature is enacted into law.
