authorize the purchase of fire and police equipment, and the maintenance and operation of the equipment; to provide for defraying the cost of the equipment; to authorize the creation of special assessment districts and the levying and collecting of special assessments; to authorize the issuance of special assessment bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments and the advancement of the amount necessary to pay such bonds, and to provide for reimbursement for such advances by reassessment if necessary; to authorize the collection of fees for certain emergency services in townships and other municipalities; to authorize the creation of administrative boards and to prescribe their powers and duties; to provide for the appointment of traffic officers and to prescribe their powers and duties; and to repeal acts and parts of acts," by amending section 10 (MCL 41.810), as amended by 2004 PA 463.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Local Government.

House Bill No. 5080, entitled

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code," by amending section 601c (MCL 257.601c), as added by 2001 PA 103.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Criminal Justice.

Announcements by the Clerk

The Clerk received the following dissent on House Bill Nos. 4121, 4740, 4821, 4866, 4622 and 4793, from Rep. Irwin:

I continue to object to the use of procedural tricks to subvert the Constitutional rights of citizens to know accurately the actions of the House of Representatives. Motions for immediate effect are routinely gaveled through without even a pretense of vote counting. This motion requires support from 2/3rds of the members and there is no genuine effort to ascertain the level of support for immediate effect. I object to this practice and I object to the erroneous assertions printed in the House Journal that suggest an authentic counting of votes occurred on the House floor.

Rep. Foster moved that the House adjourn. The motion prevailed, the time being 3:00 p.m.
