House Resolution No. 95.

A resolution to urge the Congress and the President of the United States to take action to protect the rights of Arab and Muslim Americans.

Whereas, Hate crimes have become all too common in this country with an acceleration of violence in recent years. Individuals of diverse ethnic, racial, and religious cultures are being victimized by discrimination that is manifested in many forms, hence, creating a climate of fear and intimidation; and

Whereas, Efforts to increase homeland security resulted in the exercise of numerous tactics that have compromised the rights of racial and ethnic communities. One such system—the national terror watch list—has stigmatized and in some cases ruined the lives of individuals under the guise of suspected terror. This system, rife with secrecy and covert in many ways, is in need of a systemic overhaul; and

Whereas, Laws have been passed at the federal and state levels to address hate crimes. Yet, we have seen a precipitous rise in hate groups and hate crimes that target Arab, Hindu, Middle Eastern, Muslim, Sikh, and South Asian communities. It is of vital importance for the White House to respond by establishing a task force that addresses hate crimes that target Arab, Hindu, Middle Eastern, Muslim, Sikh, and South Asian communities; and

Whereas, Post 9-11 profiling and abuses of Arab and Muslim must be given a formal place in public record. Congressional hearings focused on this issue will enable the aftermath of this tragic event and its impact on the lives of Arab and Muslim Americans to be publicly chronicled; and

Whereas, Local police have heightened acts of unwarranted surveillance of the day-to-day lives of Arab and Muslim Americans, and created a climate of anxiety, mistrust, and fear in these communities. Further federal action through passage of the End Racial Profiling Act (ERPA) would protect the civil liberties and human rights of groups that have long been subject to profiling by law enforcement agencies at all levels of government; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the House of Representatives, That we urge the Congress and the President of the United States to take action to:

- Create a mechanism for oversight of the U.S. terror watch list.
- Establish a White House task force to prevent and respond to hate violence targeting Arab, Hindu, Middle Eastern, Muslim, Sikh and South Asian communities.
- Investigate civil rights abuses through congressional hearings.
- Promote local police accountability.
- Enact the End of Racial Profiling Act (ERPA).
- Reform the Department of Justice's racial profiling guidelines.

Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and the members of the Michigan congressional delegation

"An act to provide for the registration, titling, sale, transfer, and regulation of certain vehicles operated upon the public highways of this state or any other place open to the general public or generally accessible to motor vehicles and distressed vehicles; to provide for the licensing of dealers; to provide for the examination, licensing, and control of operators and chauffeurs; to provide for the giving of proof of financial responsibility and security by owners and operators of vehicles; to provide for the imposition, levy, and collection of specific taxes on vehicles, and the levy and collection of sales and use taxes, license fees, and permit fees; to provide for the regulation and use of streets and highways; to create certain funds; to provide penalties and sanctions for a violation of this act; to provide for civil liability of manufacturers, the manufacturers of automated technology, upfitters, owners, and operators of vehicles and service of process on residents and nonresidents; to regulate the introduction and use of certain evidence; to provide for the levy of certain assessments; to provide for the enforcement of this act; to provide for the creation of and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to impose liability upon the state or local agencies; to provide appropriations for certain purposes; to repeal all other acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act or contrary to this act; and to repeal certain parts of this act on a specific date."

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Military and Veterans Affairs.

House Bill No. 4643, entitled

A bill to amend 1939 PA 176, entitled "An act to create a commission relative to labor disputes, and to prescribe its powers and duties; to provide for the mediation and arbitration of labor disputes, and the holding of elections thereon; to regulate the conduct of parties to labor disputes and to require the parties to follow certain procedures; to regulate and limit the right to strike and picket; to protect the rights and privileges of employees, including the right to organize and engage in lawful concerted activities; to protect the rights and privileges of employers; to make certain acts unlawful; to make appropriations; and to prescribe means of enforcement and penalties for violations of this act," by amending section 9f (MCL 423.9f).
