

**SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 5506**

A bill to amend 1979 PA 218, entitled "Adult foster care facility licensing act," by amending sections 24, 25, 34b, and 34c (MCL 400.724, 400.725, 400.734b, and 400.734c), section 24 as amended by 2016 PA 492, section 34b as amended by 2014 PA 73, and section 34c as added by 2006 PA 29; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 24. (1) A person who believes that this act or a rule
2 promulgated under this act may have been violated may request an
3 investigation of an adult foster care facility. The request shall
4 be submitted to the department in writing or the department shall
5 assist the person in reducing an oral complaint to writing within 7
6 days after the oral request is made.

7 (2) The substance of the complaint shall be provided to the

1 licensee not earlier than at the commencement of the on-site
2 inspection of the adult foster care facility that takes place
3 according to the complaint.

4 (3) The complaint, a copy of the complaint, or a record
5 published, released, or otherwise disclosed to the adult foster
6 care facility shall not disclose the name of the complainant or an
7 adult resident named in the complaint unless the complainant or an
8 adult resident consents in writing to the disclosure or the
9 investigation results in an administrative hearing or a judicial
10 proceeding, or unless disclosure is considered essential to the
11 investigation by the department. If disclosure is considered
12 essential to the investigation, the complainant shall be given the
13 opportunity to withdraw the complaint before disclosure.

14 (4) Upon receipt of a complaint, the department shall
15 determine, based on the allegations presented, whether this act or
16 a rule promulgated under this act has been, is, or is in danger of
17 being violated. The department shall investigate the complaint
18 according to the urgency determined by the department. The
19 initiation of a complaint investigation shall commence within 15
20 days after receipt of the written complaint by the department.

21 (5) The department shall inform the complainant of its
22 findings. Within 30 days after the receipt of complaint, the
23 department shall provide the complainant a copy, if any, of the
24 written determination or a status report indicating when these
25 documents may be expected. The final report shall include a copy of
26 the original complaint. The complainant may request additional
27 copies of the documents listed in this subsection and shall

1 reimburse the department for the copies according to ~~established~~
2 ~~policies and procedures.~~ **THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA**
3 **442, MCL 15.231 TO 15.246.**

4 (6) The department shall inform the licensee of the
5 department's findings at the same time that the department informs
6 the complainant under subsection (5).

7 (7) A written determination concerning a complaint shall be
8 available for public inspection, but the name of the complainant or
9 adult resident shall not be disclosed without the complainant's or
10 adult resident's consent.

11 (8) A complainant who is dissatisfied with the determination
12 or investigation by the department may request ~~a hearing.~~ **AN**
13 **ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW BY THE DEPARTMENT.** A request ~~for a hearing~~
14 shall be submitted in writing to the director within 30 days after
15 the mailing of the department's findings as described in subsection
16 (5). ~~Notice of the time and place of the hearing shall be sent to~~
17 ~~the complainant and the adult foster care facility. A complainant~~
18 ~~who is dissatisfied with the decision of the director may appeal by~~
19 ~~filing with the clerk of the court an affidavit setting forth the~~
20 ~~substance of the proceedings before the department and the errors~~
21 ~~of law upon which the person relies, and serving the director with~~
22 ~~a copy of the affidavit. The circuit court of the county in which~~
23 ~~the complainant resides shall have jurisdiction to hear and~~
24 ~~determine the questions of fact or law involved in the appeal.~~ **THE**
25 **ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW SHALL BE CONDUCTED BASED ON PERTINENT**
26 **DOCUMENTATION OR A VERIFIABLE STATEMENT SUBMITTED IN WRITING BY THE**
27 **COMPLAINANT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SEND THE RESULTS OF THE**

1 **ADMINISTRATIVE REVIEW TO THE COMPLAINANT. IF THE ADMINISTRATIVE**
2 **REVIEW RESULTS IN RECONSIDERATION OF A COMPLAINT AGAINST THE ADULT**
3 **FOSTER CARE FACILITY, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REOPEN THE COMPLAINT**
4 **INVESTIGATION.**

5 (9) Notwithstanding subsection (3) and sections 5 and 7(2) of
6 the child protection law, 1975 PA 238, MCL 722.625 and 722.627,
7 information or records in the possession of the department **OF**
8 **HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES** or the department ~~of licensing and~~
9 ~~regulatory affairs~~ may be shared to the extent necessary for the
10 proper functioning of the department **OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**
11 or the department ~~of licensing and regulatory affairs~~ in
12 administering adult welfare or adult foster care licensing under
13 this act or in an investigation conducted under section 43b of the
14 social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.43b. Information or
15 records shared under this subsection shall not be released by the
16 department **OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES** or the department ~~of~~
17 ~~licensing and regulatory affairs~~ unless otherwise permitted under
18 this act or other state or federal law.

19 Sec. 25. A ~~person~~ **PARTY** aggrieved by the decision of the
20 director following a **CONTESTED CASE** hearing under section 22 ~~or 23,~~
21 ~~within 10 days after receipt of decision,~~ may appeal to the circuit
22 court for the county in which the person resides by filing with the
23 clerk of the court an affidavit setting forth the substance of the
24 proceedings before the department and the errors of law upon which
25 the person relies, and serving the director with a copy of the
26 affidavit. The circuit court shall have jurisdiction to hear and
27 determine the questions of fact or law involved in the appeal. If

1 ~~the department prevails, the circuit court shall affirm the~~
2 ~~decision of the department; if the licensee, or applicant prevails,~~
3 ~~the circuit court shall set aside the revocation or order the~~

7 Sec. 34b. (1) In addition to the restrictions prescribed in
8 sections 13, 22, and 31, and except as otherwise provided in
9 subsection (2), an adult foster care facility shall not employ or
10 independently contract with an individual who regularly has direct
11 access to or provides direct services to residents of the adult
12 foster care facility if the individual satisfies 1 or more of the
13 following:

14 (a) Has been convicted of a relevant crime described under 42
15 USC 1320a-7(a).

16 (b) Has been convicted of any of the following felonies, an
17 attempt or conspiracy to commit any of those felonies, or any other
18 state or federal crime that is similar to the felonies described in
19 this subdivision, other than a felony for a relevant crime
20 described under 42 USC 1320a-7(a), unless 15 years have lapsed
21 since the individual completed all of the terms and conditions of
22 his or her sentencing, parole, and probation for that conviction
23 ~~prior to~~ **BEFORE** the date of application for employment or the date
24 of the execution of the independent contract:

25 (i) A felony that involves the intent to cause death or
26 serious impairment of a body function, that results in death or
27 serious impairment of a body function, that involves the use of

1 force or violence, or that involves the threat of the use of force
2 or violence.

3 (ii) A felony involving cruelty or torture.

4 (iii) A felony under chapter XXA of the Michigan penal code,
5 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145m to 750.145r.

6 (iv) A felony involving criminal sexual conduct.

7 (v) A felony involving abuse or neglect.

8 (vi) A felony involving the use of a firearm or dangerous
9 weapon.

10 (vii) A felony involving the diversion or adulteration of a
11 prescription drug or other medications.

12 (c) Has been convicted of a felony or an attempt or conspiracy
13 to commit a felony, other than a felony for a relevant crime
14 described under 42 USC 1320a-7(a) or a felony described under
15 subdivision (b), unless 10 years have lapsed since the individual
16 completed all of the terms and conditions of his or her sentencing,
17 parole, and probation for that conviction ~~prior to~~ **BEFORE** the date
18 of application for employment or the date of the execution of the
19 independent contract.

20 (d) Has been convicted of any of the following misdemeanors,
21 other than a misdemeanor for a relevant crime described under 42
22 USC 1320a-7(a), or a state or federal crime that is substantially
23 similar to the misdemeanors described in this subdivision, within
24 the 10 years immediately preceding the date of application for
25 employment or the date of the execution of the independent
26 contract:

27 (i) A misdemeanor involving the use of a firearm or dangerous

1 weapon with the intent to injure, the use of a firearm or dangerous
2 weapon that results in a personal injury, or a misdemeanor
3 involving the use of force or violence or the threat of the use of
4 force or violence.

5 (ii) A misdemeanor under chapter XXA of the Michigan penal
6 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145m to 750.145r.

7 (iii) A misdemeanor involving criminal sexual conduct.

8 (iv) A misdemeanor involving cruelty or torture unless
9 otherwise provided under subdivision (e).

10 (v) A misdemeanor involving abuse or neglect.

11 (e) Has been convicted of any of the following misdemeanors,
12 other than a misdemeanor for a relevant crime described under 42
13 USC 1320a-7(a), or a state or federal crime that is substantially
14 similar to the misdemeanors described in this subdivision, within
15 the 5 years immediately preceding the date of application for
16 employment or the date of the execution of the independent
17 contract:

18 (i) A misdemeanor involving cruelty if committed by an
19 individual who is less than 16 years of age.

20 (ii) A misdemeanor involving home invasion.

21 (iii) A misdemeanor involving embezzlement.

22 (iv) A misdemeanor involving negligent homicide or a violation
23 of section 601d(1) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
24 257.601d.

25 (v) A misdemeanor involving larceny unless otherwise provided
26 under subdivision (g).

27 (vi) A misdemeanor of retail fraud in the second degree unless

1 otherwise provided under subdivision (g).

2 (vii) Any other misdemeanor involving assault, fraud, theft,
3 or the possession or delivery of a controlled substance unless
4 otherwise provided under subdivision (d), (f), or (g).

5 (f) Has been convicted of any of the following misdemeanors,
6 other than a misdemeanor for a relevant crime described under 42
7 USC 1320a-7(a), or a state or federal crime that is substantially
8 similar to the misdemeanors described in this subdivision, within
9 the 3 years immediately preceding the date of application for
10 employment or the date of the execution of the independent
11 contract:

12 (i) A misdemeanor for assault if there was no use of a firearm
13 or dangerous weapon and no intent to commit murder or inflict great
14 bodily injury.

15 (ii) A misdemeanor of retail fraud in the third degree unless
16 otherwise provided under subdivision (g).

17 (iii) A misdemeanor under part 74 of the public health code,
18 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7401 to 333.7461, unless otherwise provided
19 under subdivision (g).

20 (g) Has been convicted of any of the following misdemeanors,
21 other than a misdemeanor for a relevant crime described under 42
22 USC 1320a-7(a), or a state or federal crime that is substantially
23 similar to the misdemeanors described in this subdivision, within
24 the year immediately preceding the date of application for
25 employment or the date of the execution of the independent
26 contract:

27 (i) A misdemeanor under part 74 of the public health code,

1 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7401 to 333.7461, if the individual, at the
2 time of conviction, is under the age of 18.

3 (ii) A misdemeanor for larceny or retail fraud in the second
4 or third degree if the individual, at the time of conviction, is
5 under the age of 16.

6 (h) Is the subject of an order or disposition under section
7 16b of chapter IX of the code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175,
8 MCL 769.16b.

9 (i) Engages in conduct that becomes the subject of a
10 substantiated finding of neglect, abuse, or misappropriation of
11 property by a state or federal agency according to an investigation
12 conducted in accordance with 42 USC 1395i-3 or 1396r.

13 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection or
14 subsection (6), an adult foster care facility shall not employ or
15 independently contract with an individual who has direct access to
16 residents until the adult foster care facility or staffing agency
17 has conducted a criminal history check in compliance with this
18 section or has received criminal history record information in
19 compliance with subsections (3) and (11). This subsection and
20 subsection (1) do not apply to an individual who is employed by or
21 under contract to an adult foster care facility before April 1,
22 2006. On or before April 1, 2011, an individual who is exempt under
23 this subsection and who has not been the subject of a criminal
24 history check conducted in compliance with this section shall
25 provide the department of state police a set of fingerprints and
26 the department of state police shall input those fingerprints into
27 the automated fingerprint identification system database

1 established under subsection (14). An individual who is exempt
2 under this subsection is not limited to working within the adult
3 foster care facility with which he or she is employed by or under
4 independent contract with on April 1, 2006 but may transfer to
5 another adult foster care facility, mental health facility, or
6 covered health facility. If an individual who is exempt under this
7 subsection is subsequently convicted of a crime or offense
8 described under subsection (1) (a) to (g) or found to be the subject
9 of a substantiated finding described under subsection (1) (i) or an
10 order or disposition described under subsection (1) (h), or is found
11 to have been convicted of a relevant crime described under 42 USC
12 1320a-7(a), he or she is no longer exempt and shall be terminated
13 from employment or denied employment.

14 (3) An individual who applies for employment either as an
15 employee or as an independent contractor with an adult foster care
16 facility or staffing agency and who has not been the subject of a
17 criminal history check conducted in compliance with this section
18 shall give written consent at the time of application for the
19 department of state police to conduct a criminal history check
20 under this section, along with identification acceptable to the
21 department of state police. If the individual has been the subject
22 of a criminal history check conducted in compliance with this
23 section, the individual shall give written consent at the time of
24 application for the adult foster care facility or staffing agency
25 to obtain the criminal history record information as prescribed in
26 subsection (4) or (5) from the relevant licensing or regulatory
27 department and for the department of state police to conduct a

1 criminal history check under this section if the requirements of
2 subsection (11) are not met and a request to the ~~federal bureau of~~
3 ~~investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION** to make a
4 determination of the existence of any national criminal history
5 pertaining to the individual is necessary, along with
6 identification acceptable to the department of state police. Upon
7 receipt of the written consent to obtain the criminal history
8 record information and identification required under this
9 subsection, the adult foster care facility or staffing agency that
10 has made a ~~good faith~~ **GOOD-FAITH** offer of employment or an
11 independent contract to the individual shall request the criminal
12 history record information from the relevant licensing or
13 regulatory department and shall make a request regarding that
14 individual to the relevant licensing or regulatory department to
15 conduct a check of all relevant registries in the manner required
16 in subsection (4). If the requirements of subsection (11) are not
17 met and a request to the ~~federal bureau of investigation~~ **FEDERAL**
18 **BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION** to make a subsequent determination of the
19 existence of any national criminal history pertaining to the
20 individual is necessary, the adult foster care facility or staffing
21 agency shall proceed in the manner required in subsection (5). A
22 staffing agency that employs an individual who regularly has direct
23 access to or provides direct services to residents under an
24 independent contract with an adult foster care facility shall
25 submit information regarding the criminal history check conducted
26 by the staffing agency to the adult foster care facility that has
27 made a ~~good faith~~ **GOOD-FAITH** offer of independent contract to that

1 applicant.

2 (4) Upon receipt of the written consent to conduct a criminal
3 history check and identification required under subsection (3), the
4 adult foster care facility or staffing agency that has made a ~~good~~
5 ~~faith~~**GOOD-FAITH** offer of employment or independent contract to the
6 individual shall make a request to the department of state police
7 to conduct a criminal history check on the individual and input the
8 individual's fingerprints into the automated fingerprint
9 identification system database, and shall make a request to the
10 relevant licensing or regulatory department to perform a check of
11 all relevant registries established according to federal and state
12 law and regulations for any substantiated findings of abuse,
13 neglect, or misappropriation of property. The request shall be made
14 in a manner prescribed by the department of state police and the
15 relevant licensing or regulatory department or agency. The adult
16 foster care facility or staffing agency shall make the written
17 consent and identification available to the department of state
18 police and the relevant licensing or regulatory department or
19 agency. ~~If~~**UNTIL JUNE 30, 2020, IF** the department of state police
20 or the ~~federal bureau of investigation~~**FEDERAL BUREAU OF**
21 **INVESTIGATION** charges a fee for conducting the criminal history
22 check, the charge shall be paid by or reimbursed by the department.
23 ~~The~~**UNTIL JUNE 30, 2020, THE** adult foster care facility or staffing
24 agency shall not seek reimbursement for a charge imposed by the
25 department of state police or the federal bureau of investigation
26 from the individual who is the subject of the criminal history
27 check. **BEGINNING JULY 1, 2020, IF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE OR**

1 **THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION CHARGES A FEE FOR CONDUCTING**
2 **THE CRIMINAL HISTORY CHECK, THE CHARGE SHALL BE PAID BY THE ADULT**
3 **FOSTER CARE FACILITY, THE STAFFING AGENCY, OR THE INDIVIDUAL.** The
4 department of state police shall conduct a criminal history check
5 on the individual named in the request. The department of state
6 police shall provide the department with a written report of the
7 criminal history check conducted under this subsection. The report
8 shall contain any criminal history record information on the
9 individual maintained by the department of state police.

10 (5) Upon receipt of the written consent to conduct a criminal
11 history check and identification required under subsection (3), if
12 the individual has applied for employment either as an employee or
13 as an independent contractor with an adult foster care facility or
14 staffing agency, the adult foster care facility or staffing agency
15 that has made a ~~good faith~~ **GOOD-FAITH** offer of employment or
16 independent contract shall comply with subsection (4) and shall
17 make a request to the department of state police to forward the
18 individual's fingerprints to the ~~federal bureau of investigation.~~
19 **FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION.** The department of state police
20 shall request the ~~federal bureau of investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU OF**
21 **INVESTIGATION** to make a determination of the existence of any
22 national criminal history pertaining to the individual. An
23 individual described in this subsection shall provide the
24 department of state police with a set of fingerprints. The
25 department of state police shall complete the criminal history
26 check under subsection (4) and, except as otherwise provided in
27 this subsection, provide the results of its determination under

1 subsection (4) and the results of the ~~federal bureau of~~
2 ~~investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION** determination to the
3 department within 30 days after the request is made. If the
4 requesting adult foster care facility or staffing agency is not a
5 state department or agency and if criminal history record
6 information is disclosed on the written report of the criminal
7 history check or the ~~federal bureau of investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU**
8 **OF INVESTIGATION** determination that resulted in a conviction, the
9 department shall notify the adult foster care facility or staffing
10 agency and the individual in writing of the type of crime disclosed
11 on the written report of the criminal history check or the ~~federal~~
12 ~~bureau of investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION**
13 determination without disclosing the details of the crime. The
14 notification shall inform the adult foster care facility or
15 staffing agency and the applicant regarding the appeal process in
16 section 34c and shall include a statement that the individual has a
17 right to appeal the information relied upon by the adult foster
18 care facility or staffing agency in making its decision regarding
19 his or her employment eligibility based on the criminal history
20 check. Any charges imposed by the department of state police or the
21 ~~federal bureau of investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION** for
22 conducting a criminal history check or making a determination under
23 this subsection shall be paid in the manner required under
24 subsection (4).

25 (6) If an adult foster care facility determines it necessary
26 to employ or independently contract with an individual before
27 receiving the results of the individual's criminal history check or

1 criminal history record information required under this section,
2 the adult foster care facility may conditionally employ the
3 individual if all of the following apply:

4 (a) The adult foster care facility requests the criminal
5 history check or criminal history record information required under
6 this section, upon conditionally employing the individual.

7 (b) The individual signs a written statement indicating all of
8 the following:

9 (i) That he or she has not been convicted of 1 or more of the
10 crimes that are described in subsection (1)(a) to (g) within the
11 applicable time period prescribed by subsection (1)(a) to (g).

12 (ii) That he or she is not the subject of an order or
13 disposition described in subsection (1)(h).

14 (iii) That he or she has not been the subject of a
15 substantiated finding as described in subsection (1)(i).

16 (iv) The individual agrees that, if the information in the
17 criminal history check conducted under this section does not
18 confirm the individual's statement under subparagraphs (i) to
19 (iii), his or her employment will be terminated by the adult foster
20 care facility as required under subsection (1) unless and until the
21 individual can prove that the information is incorrect.

22 (v) That he or she understands the conditions described in
23 subparagraphs (i) to (iv) that result in the termination of his or
24 her employment and that those conditions are good cause for
25 termination.

26 (c) Except as otherwise provided in this subdivision, the
27 adult foster care facility does not permit the individual to have

1 regular direct access to or provide direct services to residents in
2 the adult foster care facility without supervision until the
3 criminal history check or criminal history record information is
4 obtained and the individual is eligible for that employment. If
5 required under this subdivision, the adult foster care facility
6 shall provide on-site supervision of an individual in the facility
7 on a conditional basis under this subsection by an individual who
8 has undergone a criminal history check conducted in compliance with
9 this section. An adult foster care facility may permit an
10 individual in the facility on a conditional basis under this
11 subsection to have regular direct access to or provide direct
12 services to residents in the adult foster care facility without
13 supervision if all of the following conditions are met:

14 (i) The adult foster care facility, at its own expense and
15 before the individual has direct access to or provides direct
16 services to residents of the facility, conducts a search of public
17 records on that individual through the internet criminal history
18 access tool maintained by the department of state police and the
19 results of that search do not uncover any information that would
20 indicate that the individual is not eligible to have regular direct
21 access to or provide direct services to residents under this
22 section.

23 (ii) Before the individual has direct access to or provides
24 direct services to residents of the adult foster care facility, the
25 individual signs a statement in writing that he or she has resided
26 in this state without interruption for at least the immediately
27 preceding 12-month period.

1 (iii) If applicable, the individual provides to the department
2 of state police a set of fingerprints on or before the expiration
3 of 10 business days following the date the individual was
4 conditionally employed under this subsection.

5 (7) The department shall develop and distribute the model form
6 for the statements required under subsection (6) (b) and (c). The
7 department shall make the model form available to adult foster care
8 facilities upon request at no charge.

9 (8) If an individual is conditionally employed under
10 subsection (6), and the information under subsection (3) or report
11 under subsection (4) or (5), if applicable, does not confirm the
12 individual's statement under subsection (6) (b) (i) to (iii), the
13 adult foster care facility shall terminate the individual's
14 employment as required by subsection (1).

15 (9) An individual who knowingly provides false information
16 regarding his or her identity, criminal convictions, or
17 substantiated findings on a statement described in subsection
18 (6) (b) (i) to (iii) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
19 imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than
20 \$500.00, or both.

21 (10) An adult foster care facility or staffing agency shall
22 use criminal history record information obtained under subsection
23 (3), (4), or (5) only for the purpose of evaluating an individual's
24 qualifications for employment in the position for which he or she
25 has applied and for the purposes of subsections (6) and (8). An
26 adult foster care facility or staffing agency or an employee of the
27 adult foster care facility or staffing agency shall not disclose

1 criminal history record information obtained under this section to
2 a person who is not directly involved in evaluating the
3 individual's qualifications for employment or independent contract.
4 An individual who knowingly uses or disseminates the criminal
5 history record information obtained under subsection (3), (4), or
6 (5) in violation of this subsection is guilty of a misdemeanor
7 punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of
8 not more than \$1,000.00, or both. Except for a knowing or
9 intentional release of false information, an adult foster care
10 facility or staffing agency has no liability in connection with a
11 criminal history check conducted in compliance with this section or
12 the release of criminal history record information under this
13 subsection.

14 (11) Upon consent of an individual as required in subsection
15 (3) and upon request from an adult foster care facility or staffing
16 agency that has made a ~~good faith~~ **GOOD-FAITH** offer of employment or
17 an independent contract to the individual, the relevant licensing
18 or regulatory department shall review the criminal history record
19 information, if any, and notify the requesting adult foster care
20 facility or staffing agency of the information in the manner
21 prescribed in subsection (4) or (5). Until the ~~federal bureau of~~
22 ~~investigation~~ **FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION** implements an
