

SENATE BILL No. 428

June 6, 2017, Introduced by Senator HANSEN and referred to the Committee on Elections and Government Reform.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law," by amending section 509t (MCL 168.509t), as amended by 2004 PA 92.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 509t. (1) Notwithstanding another provision of law to the
2 contrary, a person who is a qualified elector in this state and who
3 registers to vote in a manner consistent with the national voter
4 registration act of 1993 is considered a registered voter under
5 this act.

6 (2) A person who registers to vote in a jurisdiction in this
7 state by mail **OR BY SUBMITTING AN ELECTRONIC VOTER REGISTRATION**
8 **APPLICATION** shall vote in person and shall provide identification
9 as required under section 303(b) of the help America vote act of
10 2002, ~~42 USC 15483,~~ **52 USC 21083**, if that person has not previously
11 voted in person in this state. This subsection does not apply to
12 any of the following registered voters:

1 (A) A PERSON WHO HAS REGISTERED TO VOTE IN A JURISDICTION IN
2 THIS STATE IN PERSON.

3 (B) ~~(a)~~—A person entitled to vote by absentee ballot under the
4 uniformed and overseas citizens absentee voting act.

5 (C) ~~(b)~~—A person who has a disability as **THAT TERM IS** defined
6 in section 103 of the persons with disabilities civil rights act,
7 1976 PA 220, MCL 37.1103, or, for purposes of voting in person
8 only, a person who is 60 years of age or older.

9 (D) ~~(e)~~—A person who is entitled to vote other than in person
10 under any other federal law.

11 (3) This section does not preclude this state from prosecuting
12 a violation of this act that is also a violation of a federal
13 election or voting rights law.

14 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
15 after the date it is enacted into law.

16 Enacting section 2. This amendatory act does not take effect
17 unless all of the following bills of the 99th Legislature are
18 enacted into law:
