

HOUSE BILL No. 4838

July 12, 2017, Introduced by Reps. Rendon, Chirkun, Howell, VanderWall, Vaupel, Whiteford, Albert, Wentworth, Dianda, Cole, Crawford, Hornberger, LaFave, Lower, Hoitenga, Calley, Lucido and Kosowski and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending sections 1, 5b, and 5o (MCL 28.421, 28.425b, and 28.425o), section 1 as amended by 2016 PA 301, section 5b as amended by 2015 PA 207, and section 5o as amended by 2015 PA 206.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1. (1) As used in this act:

2 (a) "Corrections officer of the department of corrections"

1 means a state correctional officer as that term is defined in
2 section 2 of the correctional officers' training act of 1982, 1982
3 PA 415, MCL 791.502.

4 (b) "Felony" means, except as otherwise provided in this
5 subdivision, that term as defined in section 1 of chapter I of the
6 code of criminal procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 761.1, or a violation
7 of a law of the United States or another state that is designated
8 as a felony or that is punishable by death or by imprisonment for
9 more than 1 year. Felony does not include a violation of a penal
10 law of this state that is expressly designated as a misdemeanor.

11 (c) "Firearm" means any weapon which will, is designed to, or
12 may readily be converted to expel a projectile by action of an
13 explosive.

14 (d) "Firearms records" means any form, information, or record
15 required for submission to a government agency under sections 2,
16 2a, 2b, and 5b, or any form, permit, or license issued by a
17 government agency under this act.

18 (e) "Local corrections officer" means that term as defined in
19 section 2 of the local corrections officers training act, 2003 PA
20 125, MCL 791.532.

21 (f) "Misdemeanor" means a violation of a penal law of this
22 state or violation of a local ordinance substantially corresponding
23 to a violation of a penal law of this state that is not a felony or
24 a violation of an order, rule, or regulation of a state agency that
25 is punishable by imprisonment or a fine that is not a civil fine,
26 or both.

27 (g) "Parole or probation officer of the department of

1 corrections" means any individual employed by the department of
2 corrections to supervise felony probationers or parolees or that
3 individual's immediate supervisor.

4 (h) "Peace officer" means, except as otherwise provided in
5 this act, an individual who is employed as a law enforcement
6 officer, as that term is defined under section 2 of the Michigan
7 commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA 203, MCL
8 28.602, by this state or another state, a political subdivision of
9 this state or another state, or the United States, and who is
10 required to carry a firearm in the course of his or her duties as a
11 law enforcement officer.

12 (i) "Pistol" means a loaded or unloaded firearm that is 26
13 inches or less in length, or a loaded or unloaded firearm that by
14 its construction and appearance conceals it as a firearm.

15 (j) "Purchaser" means a person who receives a pistol from
16 another person by purchase or gift.

17 **(K) "QUALIFIED RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" MEANS THAT**
18 **TERM AS DEFINED IN 18 USC 926C.**

19 (l) ~~(k)~~ "Reserve peace officer", "auxiliary officer", or
20 "reserve officer" means, except as otherwise provided in this act,
21 an individual authorized on a voluntary or irregular basis by a
22 duly authorized police agency of this state or a political
23 subdivision of this state to act as a law enforcement officer, who
24 is responsible for the preservation of the peace, the prevention
25 and detection of crime, and the enforcement of the general criminal
26 laws of this state, and who is otherwise eligible to possess a
27 firearm under this act.

1 **(M)** ~~(I)~~—"Retired corrections officer of the department of
2 corrections" means an individual who was a corrections officer of
3 the department of corrections and who retired in good standing from
4 his or her employment as a corrections officer of the department of
5 corrections.

6 **(N)** ~~(m)~~—"Retired federal law enforcement officer" means an
7 individual who was an officer or agent employed by a law
8 enforcement agency of the United States government whose primary
9 responsibility was enforcing laws of the United States, who was
10 required to carry a firearm in the course of his or her duties as a
11 law enforcement officer, and who retired in good standing from his
12 or her employment as a federal law enforcement officer.

13 **(O)** ~~(n)~~—"Retired parole or probation officer of the department
14 of corrections" means an individual who was a parole or probation
15 officer of the department of corrections and who retired in good
16 standing from his or her employment as a parole or probation
17 officer of the department of corrections.

18 **(P)** ~~(o)~~—"Retired police officer" or "retired law enforcement
19 officer" means an individual who was a police officer or law
20 enforcement officer who was licensed or certified as described in
21 the Michigan commission on law enforcement standards act, 1965 PA
22 203, MCL 28.601 to 28.615, and retired in good standing from his or
23 her employment as a police officer or law enforcement officer. A
24 police officer or law enforcement officer retired in good standing
25 if he or she receives a pension or other retirement benefit for his
26 or her service as a police officer or law enforcement officer or
27 actively maintained a Michigan commission on law enforcement

1 standards or equivalent state certification or license for not less
2 than 10 consecutive years.

3 (Q) ~~(p)~~ "Seller" means a person who sells or gives a pistol to
4 another person.

5 (R) ~~(q)~~ "State court judge" means a judge of the district
6 court, circuit court, probate court, or court of appeals or justice
7 of the supreme court of this state who is serving either by
8 election or appointment.

9 (S) ~~(r)~~ "State court retired judge" means a judge or justice
10 described in subdivision ~~(q)~~ (R) who is retired, or a retired judge
11 of the recorders court.

12 (2) A person may lawfully own, possess, carry, or transport as
13 a pistol a firearm greater than 26 inches in length if all of the
14 following conditions apply:

15 (a) The person registered the firearm as a pistol under
16 section 2 or 2a before January 1, 2013.

17 (b) The person who registered the firearm as described in
18 subdivision (a) has maintained registration of the firearm since
19 January 1, 2013 without lapse.

20 (c) The person possesses a copy of the license or record
21 issued to him or her under section 2 or 2a.

22 (3) A person who satisfies all of the conditions listed under
23 subsection (2) nevertheless may elect to have the firearm not be
24 considered to be a pistol. A person who makes the election under
25 this subsection shall notify the department of state police of the
26 election in a manner prescribed by that department.

19 (b) A statement by the applicant that the applicant meets the
20 criteria for a license under this act to carry a concealed pistol.

21 (c) ~~Until November 30, 2015, a statement by the applicant~~
22 ~~authorizing the concealed weapon licensing board to access any~~
23 ~~record, including any medical record, pertaining to the applicant's~~
24 ~~qualifications for a license to carry a concealed pistol under this~~

14 (i) Any felony.

15 (ii) A misdemeanor listed under subsection (7)(h) if the
16 applicant was convicted of that misdemeanor in the 8 years
17 immediately preceding the date of the application, or a misdemeanor
18 listed under subsection (7)(i) if the applicant was convicted of
19 that misdemeanor in the 3 years immediately preceding the date of
20 the application.

7 state, a passport-quality photograph of the applicant provided by

11 (2) The county clerk shall not require the applicant to submit
12 any additional forms, documents, letters, or other evidence of
13 eligibility for obtaining a license to carry a concealed pistol
14 except as set forth in subsection (1) or as otherwise provided for
15 in this act. The application form ~~shall~~ **MUST** contain a conspicuous
16 warning that the application is executed under oath and that
17 intentionally making a material false statement on the application
18 is a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or
19 a fine of not more than \$2,500.00, or both.

20 (3) An individual who intentionally makes a material false
21 statement on an application under subsection (1) is guilty of a
22 felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a
23 fine of not more than \$2,500.00, or both.

24 (4) The county clerk shall retain a copy of each application
25 for a license to carry a concealed pistol as an official record.
26 One year after the expiration of a concealed pistol license, the
27 county clerk may destroy the record and maintain only a name index

1 of the record.

2 (5) ~~Until November 30, 2015, each applicant shall pay a~~
3 ~~nonrefundable application and licensing fee of \$105.00 by any~~
4 ~~method of payment accepted by that county for payments of other~~
5 ~~fees and penalties. Beginning December 1, 2015, each **EACH** applicant~~
6 shall pay an application and licensing fee of \$100.00 by any method
7 of payment accepted by that county for payments of other fees and
8 penalties. Except as provided in subsection (9), no other charge,
9 fee, cost, or assessment, including any local charge, fee, cost, or

5 safe use and handling of a pistol by the successful completion of a
6 pistol safety training course or class that meets the requirements
7 of section 5j.

8 (d) The applicant is not the subject of an order or
9 disposition under any of the following:

10 (i) Section 464a of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL
11 330.1464a.

12 (ii) Section 5107 of the estates and protected individuals
13 code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.5107.

14 (iii) Sections 2950 and 2950a of the revised judicature act of
15 1961, 1961 PA 236, MCL 600.2950 and 600.2950a.

16 (iv) Section 6b of chapter V of the code of criminal
17 procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 765.6b, if the order has a condition
18 imposed under section 6b(3) of chapter V of the code of criminal
19 procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 765.6b.

20 (v) Section 16b of chapter IX of the code of criminal
21 procedure, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.16b.

22 (e) The applicant is not prohibited from possessing, using,
23 transporting, selling, purchasing, carrying, shipping, receiving,
24 or distributing a firearm under section 224f of the Michigan penal
25 code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.224f.

26 (f) The applicant has never been convicted of a felony in this
27 state or elsewhere, and a felony charge against the applicant is

1 not pending in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she
2 applies for a license described in this section.

3 (g) The applicant has not been dishonorably discharged from
4 the United States ~~armed forces~~. **ARMED FORCES.**

5 (h) The applicant has not been convicted of a misdemeanor
6 violation of any of the following in the 8 years immediately
7 preceding the date of application and a charge for a misdemeanor
8 violation of any of the following is not pending against the
9 applicant in this state or elsewhere at the time he or she applies
10 for a license described in this section:

11 (i) Section 617a (failing to stop when involved in a personal
12 injury accident), section 625 as punishable under subsection (9) (b)
13 of that section (operating while intoxicated, second offense),
14 section 625m as punishable under subsection (4) of that section
15 (operating a commercial vehicle with alcohol content, second
16 offense), section 626 (reckless driving), or a violation of section
17 904(1) (operating while license suspended or revoked, second or
18 subsequent offense) of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL
19 257.617a, 257.625, 257.625m, 257.626, and 257.904.

20 (ii) Section 185(7) of the aeronautics code of the state of
21 Michigan, 1945 PA 327, MCL 259.185 (operating aircraft while under
22 the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance with
23 prior conviction).

24 (iii) Section 29 of the weights and measures act, 1964 PA 283,

21 sexually explicit matter to minors).

22 (ix) Section 81 (assault or domestic assault), section 81a(1)
23 or (2) (aggravated assault or aggravated domestic assault), section
24 115 (breaking and entering or entering without breaking), section
25 136b(7) (fourth degree child abuse), section 145n (vulnerable adult
26 abuse), section 157b(3) (b) (solicitation to commit a felony),
27 section 215 (impersonating peace officer or medical examiner),

1 section 223 (illegal sale of a firearm or ammunition), section 224d
2 (illegal use or sale of a self-defense spray), section 226a (sale
3 or possession of a switchblade), section 227c (improper
4 transportation of a loaded firearm), section 229 (accepting a
5 pistol in pawn), section 232 (failure to register the purchase of a
6 firearm or a firearm component), section 232a (improperly obtaining
7 a pistol, making a false statement on an application to purchase a

22 or more individuals that the individual knows or should know has a
23 seating capacity of 2,500 or more individuals or that has a sign
24 above each public entrance stating in letters not less than 1-inch
25 high a seating capacity of 2,500 or more individuals.

26 (g) A hospital.

27 (h) A dormitory or classroom of a community college, college,

1 or university.

2 (2) Subject to subsection (5), an individual shall not carry a
3 portable device that uses electro-muscular disruption technology on
4 any of the premises described in subsection (1).

5 (3) An individual licensed under this act to carry a concealed
6 pistol, or who is exempt from licensure under section ~~12a(1)(h)~~,
7 **12A(H)**, shall not carry a concealed pistol in violation of R
8 432.1212 or a successor rule of the Michigan administrative code
9 promulgated under the Michigan gaming control and revenue act, 1996
10 IL 1, MCL 432.201 to 432.226.

11 (4) As used in subsection (1), "premises" does not include
12 parking areas of the places identified under subsection (1).

13 (5) Subsections (1) and (2) do not apply to any of the
14 following:

15 (a) An individual licensed under this act who is a retired
16 police officer, retired law enforcement officer, or retired federal
17 law enforcement officer.

18 (b) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is
19 employed or contracted by an entity described under subsection (1)
20 to provide security services and is required by his or her employer
21 or the terms of a contract to carry a concealed firearm on the
22 premises of the employing or contracting entity.

23 (c) An individual who is licensed as a private investigator or
24 private detective under the professional investigator licensure
25 act, 1965 PA 285, MCL 338.821 to 338.851.

26 (d) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
27 corrections officer of a county sheriff's department or who is

1 licensed under this act and is a retired corrections officer of a
2 county sheriff's department, if that individual has received county
3 sheriff approved weapons training.

4 (e) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
5 motor carrier officer or capitol security officer of the department
6 of state police.

7 (f) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
8 member of a sheriff's posse.

9 (g) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is an
10 auxiliary officer or reserve officer of a police or sheriff's
11 department.

12 (h) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is
13 any of the following:

14 (i) A parole, probation, or corrections officer, or absconder
15 recovery unit member, of the department of corrections, if that
16 individual has obtained a Michigan department of corrections
17 weapons permit.

18 (ii) A retired parole, probation, or corrections officer, or
19 retired absconder recovery unit member, of the department of
20 corrections, if that individual has obtained a Michigan department
21 of corrections weapons permit.

22 (i) A state court judge or state court retired judge who is
23 licensed under this act.

24 (j) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
25 court officer.

26 **(K) A QUALIFIED RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER.**

27 (6) An individual who violates this section is responsible for

1 a state civil infraction or guilty of a crime as follows:

2 (a) Except as provided in subdivisions (b) and (c), the
3 individual is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be
4 fined not more than \$500.00. The court shall order the individual's
5 license to carry a concealed pistol suspended for 6 months.

6 (b) For a second violation, the individual is guilty of a
7 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00. The
8 court shall order the individual's license to carry a concealed
9 pistol revoked.

10 (c) For a third or subsequent violation, the individual is
11 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4
12 years or a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both. The court
13 shall order the individual's license to carry a concealed pistol
14 revoked.
