Reading skills are fundamental in laying a foundation for future academic success in every subject, at every grade level and for every student; and

Whereas, According the Michigan Department of Education, Michigan students continue to struggle in reading, with less than half of the state's third graders passing the English language arts portion of the M-STEP. Nurturing a child's literacy skills is an investment both schools and parents must make in our children even before they enter kindergarten. The brain undergoes its most significant period of growth in the earliest stages of life, providing a crucial window of opportunity to enrich cognitive development; and

Whereas, Early childhood education may also provide necessary early intervention for students who struggle with emotional, social, or learning disabilities and development delays that could impact their ability to read and write at grade-level. This is especially true for children in low-income communities where time, resources, and funds to ensure healthy development are limited; and

Whereas, Access to school libraries and personnel alone cannot improve Michigan's reading proficiency scores. Options including school readiness programs and other early childhood programs will empower Michigan students and families to succeed; and
