The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled “The Michigan penal code,” by amending section 224a (MCL 750.224a), as amended by 2012 PA 122.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled “An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,” by amending sections 5b and 5l (MCL 28.425b and 28.425l), as amended by 2017 PA 95.

A bill to amend 1956 PA 218, entitled “The insurance code of 1956,” by amending sections 3104, 3107, 3109a, 3135, and 3157 (MCL 500.3104, 500.3107, 500.3109a, 500.3135, and 500.3157), section 3104 as amended by 2002 PA 662, section 3107 as amended by 2012 PA 542, section 3109a as amended by 2012 PA 454, and section 3135 as amended by 2012 PA 158, and by adding section 3180.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Insurance.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

**House Bill No. 4027, entitled**

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled “The code of criminal procedure,” by amending section 11b of chapter XVII (MCL 777.11b), as amended by 2016 PA 234.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Reps. Markkanen and LaFave introduced

**House Bill No. 4028, entitled**

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled “Natural resources and environmental protection act,” by amending section 43510 (MCL 324.43510), as amended by 2013 PA 108.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Reps. Steven Johnson, LaFave and Hoytenga introduced

**House Bill No. 4029, entitled**

A bill to amend 1931 PA 328, entitled “The Michigan penal code,” by amending sections 227 and 230 (MCL 750.227 and 750.230), section 227 as amended by 1986 PA 8; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Rep. Allor introduced

**House Bill No. 4030, entitled**

A bill to amend 1972 PA 139, entitled “An act authorizing township boards to provide for the maintenance and improvement of private roads by contract and to provide payments by special assessment districts; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,” by amending section 2 (MCL 247.392).

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Local Government and Municipal Finance.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled “The code of criminal procedure,” by amending section 13 of chapter II and sections 1 and 3c of chapter XI (MCL 762.13, 771.1, and 771.3c), section 13 of chapter II as amended by 2015 PA 33, section 1 of chapter XI as amended by 2006 PA 631, and section 3c of chapter XI as amended by 2002 PA 483.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1953 PA 232, entitled “Corrections code of 1953,” by amending sections 25a, 36a, and 85 (MCL 791.225a, 791.236a, and 791.285), sections 25a and 36a as amended by 2002 PA 502 and section 85 as added by 2006 PA 172.

The bill was read a first time by its title and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.
