A bill to amend 1865 PA 124, entitled

"An act to designate the holidays to be observed in acceptance and payment of bills of exchange, bank checks and promissory notes, the business of banking, savings and loan, building and loan, municipal offices, the holding of courts and relative to the continuance of suits,"

by amending section 1 (MCL 435.101), as amended by 1984 PA 4.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) The following days, namely: for all purposes
- 2 related to the presenting for payment or acceptance of, and the





- 1 protesting and giving notice of the dishonor of, bills of exchange,
- 2 bank checks, and promissory notes, and for the holding of courts,
- 3 except as otherwise provided in this act, shall be treated and
- 4 considered as the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday,
- 5 and as public holidays or half-holidays:
- 6 (a) January 1, New Year's day; the Day.
- 7 (b) The third Monday in January in conjunction with the 8 federal holiday, Martin Luther King, Jr. day; Day.
 - (c) February 12, Lincoln's birthday; the Birthday.
- 10 (d) The third Monday of February, Washington's birthday; the
 11 Birthday.
- 12 (e) The last Monday of May, Memorial or Decoration day; Day.
- **13 (f)** July 4. ; the
- 14 (g) The first Monday in September, Labor day; the Day.

- 23 (6) If the return or adjourn day in an action, matter, or
- 24 hearing before a court, officer, referee, or arbitrators,
- 25 arbitrator falls on any of the days mentioned described in this

 - (8) This act shall does not prevent or invalidate the entry, issuance, service, or execution of a writ, summons, or confession of judgment, or other legal process, the holding of courts, or the transaction of lawful business except banking on any of the Saturday afternoons designated in this act as half holidays, nor shall this half-holidays.
 - (9) This act does not prevent a bank, savings and loan association, or building and loan association from keeping its doors remaining open or transacting its business on Saturday afternoons, if by vote of its directors it elects to do so.
 - (10) The legislative body of a county or city may, by ordinance or resolution, provide for the closing of county or municipal offices for any or for all purposes purpose on every Saturday.Saturdays.
- (11) This act shall does not affect state employees working on
 a Sunday in accordance with their employment as construed by the
 civil service commission.
