HOUSE BILL NO. 5862

June 17, 2020, Introduced by Reps. Leutheuser and Cole and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1972 PA 382, entitled "Traxler-McCauley-Law-Bowman bingo act,"

by amending sections 3 and 5d (MCL 432.103 and 432.105d), section 3 as amended by 2019 PA 159 and section 5d as added by 1999 PA 108.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Large bingo" means a series of bingo occasions that occur
- 3 on a regular basis during which the total value of all prizes
- 4 awarded for bingo games at a single occasion does not exceed
- 5 \$3,500.00 and the total value of all prizes awarded for 1 bingo





- 1 game does not exceed \$1,100.00, except that a prize awarded through
- 2 a Michigan progressive jackpot bingo game is not subject to these
- 3 limitations.
- 4 (b) "Large raffle" means an event where at which the total
- 5 value of all prizes awarded through raffle drawings exceeds \$500.00
- 6 per occasion.
- 7 (c) "Licensee" means a person, including a qualified
- 8 organization, licensed under this act.
- 9 (d) "Location" means, except as otherwise provided in section
- 10 5d, a building, enclosure, part of a building or enclosure, or a
- 11 distinct portion of real property that is used for the purpose of
- 12 conducting an event. Location includes all components or buildings
- 13 that compose 1 architectural entity or that serve a unified
- 14 functional purpose.
- 15 (e) "Manufacturer" means a person licensed under section 11c
- 16 who manufactures numeral game tickets for sale to suppliers for use
- 17 in an event.
- 18 (f) "Member" means an individual who qualified for membership
- 19 in a qualified organization under its bylaws, articles of
- 20 incorporation, charter, rules, or other written statement.
- 21 (g) "Michigan national guard" and "military" mean those terms
- 22 as defined in section 105 of the Michigan military act, 1967 PA
- 23 150, MCL 32.505.
- 24 (h) "Michigan progressive jackpot" means a bingo game
- 25 conducted in conjunction with a licensed large bingo occasion in
- 26 which the value of the prize is carried forward to the next bingo
- 27 occasion if no player wins in a predetermined number of allowable
- 28 calls. Michigan progressive jackpot may include bingo games
- 29 conducted by more than 1 licensee that are linked together for the



- purpose of a common jackpot prize and consolation prize as
 prescribed by the commissioner.
- (i) "Millionaire party" means an event at which wagers are
 placed on games of chance customarily associated with a gambling
 casino through the use of imitation money or chips that have a
 nominal value equal to or greater than the value of the currency
 for which they can be exchanged.
- 8 (j) "Numeral game" means the random resale of a series of9 numeral game tickets.
- 10 (k) "Numeral game ticket" means a paper strip on which
 11 preprinted numerals are covered by folding the strip and banding
 12 the folded strip with a separate piece of paper, so that on
 13 breaking the paper that bands the folding strip the purchaser
 14 discovers whether the ticket is a winning ticket.
- 15 (l) "Occasion" means a single day for which a license to conduct games is issued under this act.
- Sec. 5d. (1) A qualified organization may apply for an unlimited number of small and large raffle licenses.
- (2) Only 1 small raffle license may be issued for a locationeach day.
 - (3) All drawing locations shall must be the same if a small raffle license is issued for more than 1 date.
 - (4) A qualified organization is excused from the requirements of obtaining a license under this act if the qualified organization is sponsoring a single gathering and conducts a raffle before which there is no presale of tickets and the total aggregate retail value of the prize or prizes to be awarded that day is \$100.00 or less.
- 28 (5) Notwithstanding anything in this act to the contrary, the 29 bureau shall allow a qualified organization that held a license to

- 1 conduct a raffle under this act in 2018 or 2019, or both, to
- 2 conduct a small or large raffle via the internet. An internet
- 3 raffle platform is considered to be the location where an event
- 4 under this subsection is conducted. The bureau shall promulgate
- 5 rules to implement this subsection. This subsection does not apply
- 6 after June 30, 2023. As used in this subsection, "internet raffle
- 7 platform" means an integrated system of hardware, software,
- 8 applications, including mobile applications, and servers through
- 9 which a qualified organization may conduct a small or large raffle
- 10 via the internet under this subsection.
