THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 43537. (1) Until March 1, 2014, a resident who is

declared legally blind is eligible to purchase a senior restricted

or senior all-species fishing license. Beginning March 1, 2014, a A

- 16 (a) "Developmental disability" means that term as defined in 17 section 100a of the mental health code, 1974 PA 258, MCL 330.1100a.
 - (b) "Disabled veteran" means either of the following:
 - (i) (a)—A resident who has been determined by the United States department Department of veterans affairs Veterans Affairs to be permanently and totally disabled as a result of military service and entitled to veterans' benefits at the 100% rate, for a disability other than blindness.
- (ii) (b)—A resident rated by the United States department
 Department of veterans affairs Veterans Affairs as individually
 unemployable.
- Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days after the date it is enacted into law.
