August 17, 2020, Introduced by Rep. Meerman and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending section 505 (MCL 339.505) and by adding section 602a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 505. (1) After an investigation has been conducted,
- 2 subject to section 602a, the department may issue an order
- 3 summarily suspending a license or a certificate of registration
- 4 issued pursuant to articles 8 to 25 based on an affidavit by a





- 1 person familiar with the facts set forth in the affidavit, or, if
- 2 appropriate, based upon an affidavit on information and belief,
- 3 that an imminent threat to the public health, safety, and welfare
- 4 exists. Thereafter, the proceedings described in this article shall
- 5 must be promptly commenced and decided.
- **6** (2) A person whose license or certificate of registration has
- 7 been summarily suspended under this section may petition the
- 8 department to dissolve the order. Upon On receiving a petition, the
- 9 department immediately shall schedule a hearing to decide whether
- 10 to grant or deny the requested relief.
- 11 (3) An administrative law hearings examiner shall grant the
- 12 requested relief dissolving the summary suspension order, unless
- 13 sufficient evidence is presented that an imminent threat to the
- 14 public health, safety, and welfare exists which requires emergency
- 15 action and continuation of the director's summary suspension order.
- 16 (4) The record created at the hearing to dissolve a summary
- 17 suspension order shall become part of the record on the complaint
- 18 at a subsequent hearing in a contested case.
- 19 Sec. 602a. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a licensee or
- 20 registrant who engages in conduct that violates an executive order
- 21 issued by the governor during a state of disaster or emergency
- 22 declared under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390, MCL
- 23 30.401 to 30.421, or 1945 PA 302, MCL 10.31 to 10.33, relating to
- 24 COVID-19, shall not be subject to either of the following:
- 25 (a) An order summarily suspending a license or certificate of
- 26 registration under section 505.
- 27 (b) Any penalty prescribed in section 602.
- 28 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply if the conduct would be a
- 29 ground for investigation or disciplinary action under this article



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- 1 if the executive order had not been issued.
- 2 (3) As used in this section, "COVID-19" means severe acute 3 respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2).
