SENATE BILL NO. 535

September 24, 2019, Introduced by Senator LUCIDO and referred to the Committee on Judiciary and Public Safety.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 223, entitled

"An act to create an agency concerned with crime victim services; to prescribe its powers and duties; to provide compensation to certain victims of crimes; to provide for the promulgation of rules; and to provide for penalties,"

by amending the title and sections 1, 4, 10, and 11 (MCL 18.351, 18.354, 18.360, and 18.361), the title and section 1 as amended by 1996 PA 519, sections 4 and 10 as amended by 2008 PA 390, and section 11 as amended by 2010 PA 282, and by adding section 5b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 TITLE

1 An act to create an agency concerned with crime victim

- 6 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 7 (a) "Claimant" means a victim or intervenor who is injured, or
- 8 any other person eligible for an award under section 4(1) or 5(1),
- 9 who files a claim under this act.
- 10 (b) "Commission" means the crime victim services commission.
- 11 (c) "Crime" means an act that is 1 of the following:
- 12 (i) A crime under the laws of this state or the United States
- 13 that causes an injury within this state.
- 14 (ii) An act committed in another state that if committed in
- 15 this state would constitute a crime under the laws of this state or
- 16 the United States, that causes an injury within this state or that
- 17 causes an injury to a resident of this state within a state that
- 18 does not have a victim compensation program eligible for funding
- 19 from the victims of crime act of 1984, chapter XIV of title II of
- 20 the comprehensive crime control act of 1984, Public Law 98-473. τ
- 21 98 Stat. 2170.
- 22 (iii) An act of international terrorism as that term is defined
- 23 in section 2331 of title 18 of the United States code, 18 U.S.C.
- 24 USC 2331, committed outside the territorial jurisdiction of the
- 25 United States that causes an injury to a resident of this state.
- 26 (d) "Financial injury" means the payment of towing fees or
- 27 storage fees to recover an automobile.
- (e) (d) "Intervenor" means a person who goes to the aid of one
- 29 who has become a victim of a crime and who suffers personal

- 1 physical injury.
- 2 (f) (e) "Out-of-pocket loss" means the unreimbursed and
- 3 unreimbursable expenses or indebtedness reasonably incurred for
- 4 medical care, psychological counseling, replacement services, any
- 5 nonmedical remedial treatment rendered in accordance with a
- 6 recognized religious method of healing, or other services necessary
- 7 as a result of the injury upon which a claim is based.
- 8 (g) (f) "Personal physical injury" means actual bodily harm
- 9 and includes pregnancy.
- 10 (h) (g) "Replacement services" means homemaking tasks, child
- 11 care, transportation, and other services previously performed by
- 12 the victim that, because of the victim's injury, must temporarily
- 13 or permanently be performed by a person other than the victim.
- (i) (h) "Support" means actual monetary payments made by a
- 15 victim or intervenor to or for a person principally dependent on
- 16 the victim or intervenor.
- 17 (j) (i) "Victim" means a person an individual who suffers a
- 18 personal physical injury as a direct result of a crime or a person
- 19 that suffers a financial injury as a result of a crime involving
- 20 automobile theft.
- 21 Sec. 4. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), the
- 22 following persons are eligible for awards:
- (a) A victim or an intervenor of a crime.
- 24 (b) A surviving spouse, parent, grandparent, child, sibling,
- 25 or grandchild of a victim of a crime who died as a direct result of
- 26 the crime.
- (c) A surviving person related to the victim by blood or
- 28 affinity, a guardian, personal representative, or member of the
- 29 same household as the victim.

- 1 (d) A health care provider seeking payment under section 5a.
- 2 (e) An insurer seeking payment under section 5b.
- 3 (2) A person is not eligible to receive an award if the person4 is either of the following:
 - (a) Criminally responsible for the crime.
- 6 (b) An accomplice to the crime.

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- 7 (3) An award shall must not be made on a claim unless the
- 8 claimant has incurred a minimum out-of-pocket loss of \$200.00 or
- 9 has lost at least 2 continuous weeks' earnings or support, but the
- 10 commission may waive the limitations of this subsection in the case
- 11 of a claimant retired by reason of age or disability. If the
- 12 claimant is a victim of criminal sexual conduct in the first,
- 13 second, or third degree, the commission may waive the limitations
- 14 of this subsection. The commission shall waive this limitation for
- 15 health care providers seeking payment under section 5a, a victim
- 16 seeking payment for a financial injury, or an insurer seeking
- 17 payment under section 5b.
- 18 Sec. 5b. An insurer is eligible to be paid for the actual cost
- 19 of towing fees and storage fees paid for a victim to recover his or
- 20 her stolen automobile.
- 21 Sec. 10. An award shall must not be made unless the
- 22 investigation of the claim verifies the following facts:
- 23 (a) A crime was committed.
- ${f 24}$ (b) The crime directly resulted in personal physical injury ${f or}$
- 25 financial injury to, or death of, the victim.
- (c) Police records show that the crime was reported promptly
- 27 to the proper authorities. An award shall must not be made if the
- 28 police records show that the report was made more than 48 hours
- 29 after the occurrence of the crime unless any of the following

- 1 circumstances apply:
- 2 (i) The crime was criminal sexual conduct committed against a
- 3 victim who was less than 18 years of age at the time of the
- 4 occurrence and the crime was reported before the victim attained 19
- 5 years of age.
- 6 (ii) The commission, for good cause shown, finds the delay was
- 7 justified.
- 8 (iii) The commission is making a payment under section 5a.
- 9 (d) That the crime did not occur while the victim was confined
- 10 in a federal, state, or local correctional facility.
- 11 Sec. 11. (1) Except for a claim for payment of a financial
- 12 injury, or under section 5a or 5b, an award made under this act
- 13 shall must be an amount not more than an out-of-pocket loss,
- 14 including indebtedness reasonably incurred for medical or other
- 15 services necessary as a result of the injury upon which the claim
- 16 is based, together with loss of earnings or support resulting from
- 17 the injury. The aggregate award under this act shall must not
- 18 exceed \$25,000.00 per claimant.
- 19 (2) Unless reduced under this act, an award made for loss of
- 20 earnings or support shall must be in an amount equal to the actual
- 21 loss sustained. An award shall must not exceed \$350.00 for each
- 22 week of lost earnings or support.
- 23 (3) An award made for funeral expenses, including burial
- 24 expenses, shall must not exceed \$5,000.00 for each victim. An award
- 25 under this subsection shall must not exceed an additional \$500.00
- 26 for each of the following services:
- 27 (a) Grief counseling for the victim's spouse, children,
- 28 parents, siblings, grandparents, and grandchildren.
- 29 (b) Crime scene cleanup services after crime scene cleanup is

- permitted by the investigating law enforcement agency, if the crimescene is located at the residence of the victim or of a person
- 3 eligible for an award under section 4(1) (b).
- 4 (4) An award for psychological counseling shall must not
- 5 exceed 35 hourly sessions per victim or intervenor. The award may
- 6 include not more than 8 family sessions that include any of the
- 7 victim's or intervenor's spouse, children, parents, or siblings who
- 8 are not criminally responsible for or an accomplice to the crime.
- 9 The maximum hourly reimbursement rate shall must not exceed \$80.00
- 10 per hourly session for a therapist or counselor licensed or
- 11 registered to practice in this state, except that the maximum
- 12 hourly reimbursement rate shall must not exceed \$125.00 per hourly
- 13 session for a psychologist or physician licensed to practice in
- 14 this state.
- 15 (5) An award shall must be reduced by the amount of 1 or more
- 16 of the following payments received or to be received as a result of
- 17 the injury:
- 18 (a) From or on behalf of the person who committed the crime.
- 19 (b) From insurance, but not including disability or death
- 20 benefits paid or to be paid to a peace officer or a corrections
- 21 officer on account of injuries sustained in the course of
- 22 employment.
- (c) From public funds, but not including disability or death
- 24 benefits paid or to be paid to a peace officer or a corrections
- 25 officer on account of injuries sustained in the course of
- 26 employment.
- 27 (d) From an emergency award under section 9.
- 28 (6) In making a determination on a claim filed by a person
- 29 listed in section 4(1)(a), (b), or (c), the commission shall

- 1 determine whether the victim's misconduct contributed to his or her
- 2 injury and shall reduce the amount of the award or reject the claim
- 3 altogether, in accordance with the determination. The commission
- 4 may disregard for this purpose the victim's responsibility for his
- 5 or her own injury if the record shows that the injury was
- 6 attributable to the victim's efforts to prevent a crime or an
- 7 attempted crime from occurring in his or her presence or to
- 8 apprehend a person who had committed a crime in his or her
- 9 presence. As used in this subsection, "misconduct" includes but is
- 10 not limited to provocation of or participation in a crime
- 11 contemporaneous with or immediately preceding the injury.
- 12 (7) Except for a claim for payment of a financial injury, or
- 13 under section 5a or 5b, if the commission finds that the claimant
- 14 will not suffer serious financial hardship as a result of the loss
- 15 of earnings or support and the out-of-pocket expenses incurred as a
- 16 result of the injury if he or she is not granted financial
- 17 assistance, the commission shall deny the award. In determining the
- 18 serious financial hardship, the commission shall consider all of
- 19 the financial resources of the claimant.
- 20 (8) If the commission determines that the payment of an award
- 21 will cause substantial unjust enrichment and economic benefit to a
- 22 person criminally responsible for the crime, the commission shall
- 23 deny the payment.
- 24 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect 90 days
- 25 after the date it is enacted into law.
