## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 36

Senator Bizon offered the following concurrent resolution:

1 A concurrent resolution to create a Joint Committee on Inter-  
2 Session Rules and Regulations.

3 Whereas, Article IV, Section 37 of the *Constitution of the*  
4 *State of Michigan of 1963* provides:

5 The legislature may by concurrent resolution empower a  
6 joint committee of the legislature, acting between  
7 sessions, to suspend any rule or regulation promulgated by  
8 an administrative agency subsequent to the adjournment of  
9 the last preceding regular legislative session. Such  
10 suspension shall continue no longer than the end of the  
11 next regular legislative session.

13 Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives

1 concurring), That, pursuant to Article IV, Section 37 of the  
2 *Constitution of the State of Michigan of 1963*, there be created a  
3 Joint Committee on Inter-Session Rules and Regulations which is  
4 empowered, acting between sessions, to suspend any rule or  
5 regulation promulgated by an administrative agency subsequent to  
6 the adjournment of this regular legislative session. Such  
7 suspension shall continue no longer than the end of the next  
8 regular legislative session. The joint committee shall consist of  
9 three members of the Senate appointed by the Senate Majority  
10 Leader, one from the Senate Democratic Caucus recommended by the  
11 Senate Minority Leader and two from the Senate Republican Caucus,  
12 and three members of the House of Representatives appointed by the  
13 Speaker of the House, one from the House Democratic Caucus  
14 recommended by the House Minority Leader and two from the House  
15 Republican Caucus. The Senate Majority Leader shall designate the  
16 chairperson of the joint committee, and the Speaker of the House  
17 shall designate the vice chairperson.
