SENATE RESOLUTION NO.106

Senator Alexander offered the following resolution:

A resolution to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the
 passage and ratification of the 19th Amendment to the United States
 Constitution.

Whereas, Between 1919 and 1920, The Sixty-Sixth United States
Congress and state legislatures debated whether to amend the
Constitution to provide suffrage to women; and

7 Whereas, The 19th Amendment was guided by the shared ideals of
8 freedom, sovereignty, democracy, civil liberties, and individual
9 rights; and

10 Whereas, The U.S. House of Representatives approved the 11 proposed 19th amendment on May 21, 1919 followed by the U.S. Senate 12 on June 4, 1919; and Whereas, The introduction, passage, and ratification of the
 19th Amendment culminated the decades of struggles and work by
 advocates of women's rights across the United States and worldwide;
 and

Whereas, The ratification of the 19th Amendment in the United 5 6 States ensured that women could fully participate in our democracy, 7 while changing the role of women's civic responsibilities; and 8 Whereas, On August 18, 1920, three-fourths of the states 9 ratified the 19th Amendment which provided the necessary support 10 under Article V of the Constitution. Then, the 19th Amendment 11 became part of the U.S. Constitution on August 26, 1920; now, 12 therefore, be it

13 Resolved by the Senate, That the members of this legislative 14 body commemorate the 100th anniversary of the passage and 15 ratification of the 19th Amendment to the United States 16 Constitution; and be it further

17 Resolved, That we reaffirm the desire of Congress to continue
18 to strengthen democratic participation and inspire future
19 generations to cherish and preserve the historic precedent
20 established under the 19th Amendment.
