SUMMARY:

House Bill 6087 would amend the Michigan Liquor Control Code to increase the fee the Michigan Liquor Control Commission (MLCC) may pay to a *vendor of spirits* as an offset to the costs incurred by the vendor in contracting with an authorized distribution agent for warehousing and delivering spirits to retailers.

The code defines a *vendor of spirits* as a person selling spirits to the commission.

At present, the code allows the MLCC to pay a fee to a vendor of spirits that is no less than \$4.50 per case and no more than \$8.25 per case. The bill instead would allow a fee that is no less than \$8.25 per case and no more than \$12.50 per case. The last increase in the allowable per-case fee that the MLCC could pay to a vendor was signed into law in 2015.¹

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 6087 would not have a direct fiscal impact on the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) or any other unit of state or local government. The MLCC currently pays vendors the \$8.25 price floor established by the bill, so the bill would not necessitate an increase to the amount paid. By establishing a price ceiling of \$12.50, the bill would allow the MLCC to increase the amount it pays up to \$12.50, but such action is not required by the bill and would occur at the MLCC's discretion.
