

**SENATE SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 4953**

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled
"The revised school code,"
(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1293.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 **Sec. 1293. (1) By not later than August 1, 2022, and by not**
2 **later than August 1 each year thereafter, the department shall**
3 **develop or update and shall make available to all school districts,**
4 **intermediate school districts, public school academies, and**
5 **nonpublic schools informational packets to be given by school**
6 **officials to each pupil or student enrolled in any of grades 8 to**
7 **12 in the school district, intermediate school district, public**
8 **school academy, or nonpublic school. An informational packet**
9 **described in this subsection must include, but is not limited to,**

1 all of the following:

2 (a) Information, disaggregated by prosperity region, regarding
3 dual enrollment opportunities that are available to pupils enrolled
4 in any of grades 8 to 12 under state or federal law.

5 (b) Information, disaggregated by prosperity region, regarding
6 early/middle college programs, advanced placement (AP) programs,
7 and college-level examination programs (CLEP) that are available
8 under state or federal law to pupils enrolled in any of grades 8 to
9 12.

10 (c) Information regarding the average tuition and average fees
11 associated with attendance at each public university and community
12 college in this state for the immediately preceding calendar year.

13 (d) The 6-year graduation rate for each public university and
14 community college in this state.

15 (e) Information regarding the average amount of student loans
16 incurred by individuals attending a postsecondary institution in
17 this state.

18 (f) A list of at least 10 postsecondary vocational training
19 opportunities for individuals who have been awarded a high school
20 diploma or who have been granted a high school equivalency
21 certificate, as that term is defined in section 4 of the state
22 school aid act of 1979, MCL 388.1604. The list described in this
23 subdivision must include, but is not limited to, the average costs
24 associated with certification through the listed vocational
25 training opportunities.

26 (g) A list of at least 20 of the most in-demand occupations in
27 this state, as determined by the department, for the immediately
28 preceding calendar year. The list under this subdivision must
29 include, but is not limited to, a breakdown of the average salary

1 for each occupation and the required educational level for each
2 occupation.

3 (h) A list of public and private resources designed to aid
4 pupils and the parents and legal guardians of pupils in navigating
5 postsecondary education. The list under this subdivision must
6 include, but is not limited to, information concerning public and
7 private scholarship opportunities available to pupils.

8 (i) A list of public-service opportunities for high school
9 graduates. The list under this subdivision must include, but is not
10 limited to, information concerning opportunities available for high
11 school graduates in the public-safety sector, including, but not
12 limited to, opportunities in the Armed Forces of the United States,
13 police departments, and fire departments. As used in this
14 subdivision, "Armed Forces of the United States" means the United
15 States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, Space Force, or Coast
16 Guard or other military force designated by Congress as a part of
17 the Armed Forces of the United States, including the reserve
18 components.

19 (j) Information regarding any postsecondary training and
20 tuition assistance available to those who choose a career in public
21 service.

22 (2) By not later than August 1, 2022, and by not later than
23 August 1 each year thereafter, the department shall post the
24 informational packet made available to school districts,
25 intermediate school districts, public school academies, and
26 nonpublic schools under subsection (1) on its website homepage.

27 (3) By not later than October 1, 2022, and by not later than
28 October 1 each year thereafter, the board of a school district or
29 intermediate school district, board of directors of a public school

1 academy, or governing body of a nonpublic school shall ensure that
2 the superintendent or chief administrator, as applicable, of each
3 school operated by the board or board of directors provides, in
4 electronic form or nonelectronic form, the informational packet
5 made available to the school district, intermediate school
6 district, public school academy, or nonpublic school under
7 subsection (1) to each pupil enrolled in any of grades 8 to 12 in
8 the school district, intermediate school district, public school
9 academy, or nonpublic school.

10 (4) Each other department or agency of this state shall assist
11 the department in compiling any information that is necessary for
12 the implementation of this section.
