

**SUBSTITUTE FOR
HOUSE BILL NO. 4970**

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled
"The revised school code,"
(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1179c.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 1179c. (1) Beginning with the 2022-2023 school year, the
2 board of a school district or intermediate school district or board
3 of directors of a public school academy shall require that all
4 school personnel employed by, or assigned to work at, a school
5 operated by the school district, intermediate school district, or
6 public school academy successfully complete seizure recognition and
7 seizure first aid response training on a biennial basis. The
8 seizure recognition and seizure first aid response training
9 described in this subsection must include, but is not limited to,



1 all of the following:

2 (a) Instruction on common seizure types.

3 (b) Seizure first aid steps to assist a pupil who is having a
4 seizure.

5 (c) Information on key factors that make a seizure a medical
6 emergency.

7 (d) Guidance for ways to support pupils living with epilepsy.

8 (2) The board of a school district or intermediate school
9 district or board of directors of a public school academy shall
10 require that all school nurses or school personnel designated to
11 administer medications who are employed by, or assigned to work at,
12 the school district, intermediate school district, or public school
13 academy complete seizure recognition and seizure first aid response
14 training that includes training on medication administration. The
15 seizure recognition and seizure first aid response training
16 described in this subsection must include, but is not limited to,
17 all of the following:

18 (a) Information on common seizure types and potential triggers
19 and risk factors for seizures and emergencies.

20 (b) Guidance on ways in which treatment of epilepsy may affect
21 a pupil's health, safety, or learning.

22 (c) Instruction on seizure first aid to assist a pupil during
23 and after a seizure.

24 (d) Education on seizure action plans for pupils with epilepsy
25 and using safe practices for medication administration and
26 delegation.

27 (3) The department shall develop guidelines regarding the
28 trainings described in subsections (1) and (2). The guidelines
29 described in this subsection and the trainings described in



1 subsections (1) and (2) must be consistent with guidelines
2 developed by a national nonprofit organization dedicated to
3 epilepsy and seizures.

4 (4) For each pupil who is being treated for a seizure
5 disorder, the board of the school district or intermediate school
6 district or board of directors of the public school academy in
7 which the pupil is enrolled shall ensure that a seizure action plan
8 submitted by the pupil's parent or legal guardian is made a part of
9 the pupil's school record. A seizure action plan described in this
10 subsection must include at least all of the following:

11 (a) The pupil's full name.

12 (b) The name and purpose of any medication that the pupil is
13 prescribed.

14 (c) The dosage of the prescription described in subdivision
15 (b).

16 (d) The route of administration of the prescription described
17 in subdivision (b).

18 (e) The frequency with which the medication described in
19 subdivision (b) may be administered.

20 (f) The circumstances under which the medication described in
21 subdivision (b) may be administered.

22 (5) The board of a school district or intermediate school
23 district or board of directors of a public school academy shall
24 ensure that a seizure action plan described in subsection (4) is
25 made accessible to all school personnel who are responsible for the
26 pupil to whom the plan applies.

27 (6) Notwithstanding any school, school district, or
28 intermediate school district policy to the contrary, upon written
29 permission by a pupil's parent or legal guardian, the board of the



1 school district or intermediate school district or board of
2 directors of the public school academy in which the pupil is
3 enrolled shall ensure that at least 1 employee of the pupil's
4 school is designated by the school administrator to administer
5 seizure medication to the pupil in compliance with the instructions
6 of a physician if the pupil has a prescription for the medication
7 on file at the school. The board or board of directors shall ensure
8 that its local policy concerning the administration of medications
9 to pupils at school is modified, as needed, to comply with this
10 subsection. The department shall identify, develop, and adopt
11 appropriate revisions to any medication administration guidelines
12 issued by the department including, but not limited to, those
13 relating to the training needs and requirements for the
14 administration and maintenance of seizure medication, as needed, to
15 comply with this subsection. Any medication administered under this
16 subsection must be approved by the United States Food and Drug
17 Administration.

18 (7) Subject to section 1178, a school district, intermediate
19 school district, public school academy, school district board
20 member, intermediate school board member, board of directors member
21 of a public school academy, or employee of a school district,
22 intermediate school district, or public school academy who in good
23 faith carries out an act to comply with this section in accordance
24 with this section is not liable for civil damages or subject to
25 criminal prosecution as a result of that act, except for an act or
26 omission amounting to gross negligence. As used in this subsection,
27 "gross negligence" means that term as defined in section 7 of 1964
28 PA 170, MCL 691.1407. This subsection does not eliminate, limit, or
29 reduce any other immunity or defense that a school district,



1 intermediate school district, public school academy, member of a
2 school district board, member of an intermediate school board,
3 board of directors member of a public school academy, or employee
4 of a school district, intermediate school district, or public
5 school academy may have under other state law.

6 (8) As used in this section, "school personnel" means a school
7 administrator, guidance counselor, teacher, or other relevant
8 school employee with direct contact and supervision of pupils,
9 including, but not limited to, bus drivers and classroom aides.
