A bill to make, supplement, and adjust appropriations for various state departments and agencies for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022; to provide for certain conditions on appropriations; and to provide for the expenditure of the appropriations.

PART 2

PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

GENERAL SECTIONS

25 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
26 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state sources under
27 part 1 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022 is
28 \$197,750,000.00 and total state spending from state sources to be
29 paid to local units of government is \$161,550,000.00.



1 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
2 under this part and part 1 and the departments, commissions,
3 boards, offices, and programs for which appropriations are made
4 under this part and part 1 are subject to the management and budget
5 act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101 to 18.1594.

6 Sec. 203. If the state administrative board, acting under
7 section 3 of 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.3, transfers funds from an amount
8 appropriated under this act, the legislature may, by a concurrent
9 resolution adopted by a majority of the members elected to and
10 serving in each house, inter-transfer funds within this act for the
11 particular department, board, commission, office, or institution.

12 Sec. 204. Funds appropriated in part 1 are subject to
13 applicable federal audit and reporting requirements. Prompt action
14 shall be taken if instances of noncompliance are identified,
15 including noncompliance identified in an audit finding. If any
16 instance of noncompliance is identified, including noncompliance
17 identified in an audit finding, the state budget director shall
18 take necessary and immediate action to rectify it. The state budget
19 director shall notify the senate and house appropriations
20 committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies when an
21 instance of noncompliance is identified.

22 Sec. 205. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 from the federal
23 American rescue plan act of 2021, Public Law 117-2, must be
24 allocated and expended in a manner consistent with federal rules
25 and regulations.

26 (2) Rules and regulations include, but are not limited to, the
27 following categorical recipient limitations for funding
28 eligibility:

29 (a) Individuals who experienced economic harm or negative



1 economic impacts as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

2 (b) Communities that experienced an increase in violence as a
3 result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

4 (c) Communities that experienced an increase in gun violence
5 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

6 (d) Communities that experienced increased difficulty in
7 accessing or providing services to respond to or mitigate the
8 effects of violence resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

9 (3) Rules and regulations generally limit awards granted from
10 funds appropriated in part 1 to amounts that are related and
11 reasonably proportional to the extent and type of harm experienced
12 as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

13 Sec. 206. The state budget director shall report on the status
14 of funds appropriated in part 1, and all funds appropriated related
15 to the coronavirus relief effort, to the senate and house
16 appropriations committees and the senate and house fiscal agencies
17 on a monthly basis until all funds are exhausted.

19 **DEPARTMENT OF ATTORNEY GENERAL**

20 Sec. 251. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for PAAM -
21 extradition grant fund must be used to create a fund to be
22 administered by PAAM that can be used to reimburse local units for
23 expenses incurred for extradition of offenders that flee this state
24 to avoid prosecution.

25 (2) From the funds appropriated in part 1, PAAM must report
26 detailed expenditure data quarterly to the senate and house
27 appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
28 and the state budget office.

29 (3) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for PAAM -



1 extradition grant fund are designated as a work project
 2 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at
 3 the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures
 4 under this section until the project has been completed. The
 5 following is in compliance with section 451a of the management and
 6 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

7 (a) The purpose of the project is to reimburse local units for
 8 expenses incurred for extradition of offenders that flee this state
 9 to avoid prosecution.

10 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
 11 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

12 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$1,000,000.00.

13 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

14 (4) As used in this section, "PAAM" means the Prosecuting
 15 Attorneys Association of Michigan.

16
 17 **DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS**

18 Sec. 301. (1) It is the intent of the legislature that the
 19 funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP - corrections officer college
 20 be used by the department of corrections to pay for up to 15
 21 college credit hours for current corrections officers and new hires
 22 that have not completed college coursework required for employment
 23 with the department. The civil service commission must approve a
 24 letter of understanding between the office of the state employer
 25 and the Michigan corrections organization that specifies the terms
 26 of the agreement to pay for up to 15 college credit hours for new
 27 and current corrections officers.

28 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP -
 29 corrections officer college are designated as a work project



1 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at
2 the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures
3 under this section until the project has been completed. The
4 following is in compliance with section 451a of the management and
5 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

6 (a) The purpose of the project is to pay for up to 15 college
7 credit hours for current corrections officers and new hires that
8 have not completed college coursework required for employment with
9 the department.

10 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
11 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

12 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$5,000,000.00.

13 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

14 Sec. 302. (1) It is the intent of the legislature that the
15 funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP - corrections officer signing
16 bonuses be used by the department of corrections to grant up to
17 \$5,000.00 signing bonuses for new corrections officers. The
18 department must expend a minimum of 50% of the signing bonuses in
19 the first month of employment. The remaining percentage must be
20 paid if the corrections officer continues employment with the
21 department for at least 12 months. The civil service commission
22 must approve a letter of understanding between the office of the
23 state employer and the Michigan corrections organization that
24 specifies the terms of the agreement to grant signing bonuses for
25 new corrections officers.

26 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP -
27 corrections officer signing bonuses are designated as a work
28 project appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not
29 lapse at the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for



1 expenditures under this section until the project has been
2 completed. The following is in compliance with section 451a of the
3 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

4 (a) The purpose of the project is to grant signing bonuses for
5 new corrections officers.

6 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
7 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

8 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$2,500,000.00.

9 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

10 Sec. 303. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for absconder
11 tracking must be used by the department of corrections to create a
12 fund that can be used by the department for expenses incurred for
13 investigating, locating, and arresting prisoner escapees and parole
14 and probation violators.

15 (2) From the funds appropriated in part 1, the department must
16 report detailed expenditure data quarterly to the senate and house
17 appropriations committees, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
18 and the state budget office.

19 (3) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for absconder
20 tracking are designated as a work project appropriation.

21 Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at the end of the
22 fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures under this
23 section until the project has been completed. The following is in
24 compliance with section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984
25 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

26 (a) The purpose of the project is for the department to cover
27 expenses incurred for investigating, locating, and arresting
28 prisoner escapees and parole and probation violators.

29 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state



1 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

2 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$1,000,000.00.

3 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

4 Sec. 304. (1) It is the intent of the legislature that the
5 funds appropriated in part 1 for corrections officer retention
6 bonuses be used by the department of corrections to grant up to
7 \$5,000.00 retention bonuses for current corrections officers. The
8 civil service commission must approve a letter of understanding
9 between the office of the state employer and the Michigan
10 corrections organization that specifies the terms of the agreement
11 to grant retention bonuses for current corrections officers.

12 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for
13 corrections officer retention bonuses are designated as a work
14 project appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not
15 lapse at the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for
16 expenditures under this section until the project has been
17 completed. The following is in compliance with section 451a of the
18 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

19 (a) The purpose of the project is to grant retention bonuses
20 for current corrections officers.

21 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
22 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

23 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$2,500,000.00.

24 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

25 Sec. 305. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for specialized
26 electronic monitoring pilot program must be administered by a
27 county sheriff's department and chair of the board of commissioners
28 in conjunction with an electronic monitoring solutions company that
29 has at least 10 years of experience in the industry, provides 24



1 hours a day monitoring, has a service and monitor center located in
 2 this state, uses the same GPS tethers as the Michigan department of
 3 corrections, and can provide the necessary software and training in
 4 a county with a population of between 420,000 and 430,000 according
 5 to the 2010 federal decennial census.

6 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for
 7 specialized electronic monitoring pilot program are designated as a
 8 work project appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall
 9 not lapse at the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for
 10 expenditures under this section until the project has been
 11 completed. The following is in compliance with section 451a of the
 12 management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

13 (a) The purpose of the project is to pilot a new electronic
 14 monitoring program in a county with a population of between 420,000
 15 and 430,000 according to the 2010 federal decennial census.

16 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
 17 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

18 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$2,000,000.00.

19 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

20 Sec. 306. From the funds appropriated in part 1, it is the
 21 intent of the legislature that the department of corrections credit
 22 80 hours of leave time to corrections officers that worked for the
 23 department from March 18, 2020 to September 30, 2021. The civil
 24 service commission must approve a letter of understanding between
 25 the office of the state employer and the Michigan corrections
 26 organization that specifies the terms of the agreement to credit 80
 27 hours of leave time to corrections officers.

29 **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**



1 Sec. 351. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP - first
2 responder and public safety staff mental health must be used by the
3 department of health and human services for a grant program and
4 must be allocated to behavioral health providers for supporting
5 firefighters, police officers, emergency medical services
6 personnel, dispatchers, local correctional officers, and those
7 working on special teams such as internet sex crimes, sexual crimes
8 against children, or traffic fatalities. Funding must be used to
9 ensure that first responder and public safety staff who are dealing
10 with post-traumatic stress syndrome and other mental health
11 conditions have access to enhanced mental health services.

12 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP -
13 first responder and public safety staff mental health are
14 designated as a work project appropriation. Unencumbered or
15 unallotted funds shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year and
16 shall be available for expenditures under this section until the
17 project has been completed. The following is in compliance with
18 section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
19 18.1451a:

20 (a) The purpose of the project is to ensure that first
21 responder and public safety staff who are dealing with post-
22 traumatic stress syndrome and other mental health conditions have
23 access to enhanced mental health services.

24 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
25 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

26 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$7,500,000.00.

27 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

28

29 **DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE**



1 Sec. 401. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP - body-worn
2 camera programs must be distributed by the Michigan commission on
3 law enforcement standards to local public safety departments,
4 through a competitive grant process, to assist with funding
5 equipment and personnel necessary to implement and maintain body-
6 worn camera programs. From the funds appropriated, \$3,500,000.00
7 must be allocated to a city with a population between 700,000 and
8 720,000 according to the 2010 federal decennial census.

9 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP -
10 body-worn camera programs are designated as a work project
11 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at
12 the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures
13 under this section until the project has been completed. The
14 following is in compliance with section 451a of the management and
15 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

16 (a) The purpose of the project is to assist with funding
17 equipment and personnel necessary to implement and maintain body-
18 worn camera programs.

19 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
20 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

21 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$7,250,000.00.

22 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

23 Sec. 402. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP - community
24 policing programs must be distributed by the Michigan commission on
25 law enforcement standards to local public safety departments,
26 through a competitive grant program, to be used to create or expand
27 community policing programs. The grant application must be on a
28 form created by the department of state police and must require
29 that any program receiving support under this section create or



1 expand law enforcement officer positions dedicated to maintaining a
2 community presence and building neighborhood relationships. Funds
3 appropriated in part 1 for ARP - community policing programs must
4 be reserved for local public safety departments and only local
5 public safety departments may apply for grant awards.

6 (2) The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP -
7 community policing programs are designated as a work project
8 appropriation. Unencumbered or unallotted funds shall not lapse at
9 the end of the fiscal year and shall be available for expenditures
10 under this section until the project has been completed. The
11 following is in compliance with section 451a of the management and
12 budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

13 (a) The purpose of the project is to create or expand
14 community policing programs.

15 (b) The project will be accomplished by utilizing state
16 employees, contracts with vendors, or local partners.

17 (c) The estimated cost of the project is \$5,000,000.00.

18 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2026.

19 Sec. 403. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for ARP - gun case
20 backlog must be used in a county with a population of between
