SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 6119

A bill to amend 1986 PA 268, entitled "Legislative council act,"

(MCL 4.1101 to 4.1901) by adding section 115.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 115. (1) Under the Michigan legislative state medal program established under section 113, the legislature may award the Michigan legislative medal of honor.
 - (2) The Michigan legislative medal of honor is the highest legislatively issued military award of this state. All of the following apply to the awarding of the medal:
 - (a) The medal may be awarded to a living or deceased service member who satisfies any of the following requirements:
- 9 (i) Was born in this state.

- 1 (ii) Was a resident of this state when the service member 2 entered military service.
- 3 (iii) Died in this state.
- 4 (b) The medal must be awarded to a service member who
- 5 voluntarily performs a deed of personal bravery or self-sacrifice
- 6 involving risk of life that is so conspicuous as to clearly
- 7 distinguish the service member for gallantry and intrepidity above
- 8 the service member's comrades. Awarding of the medal must be
- 9 determined in accordance with the standard of extraordinary merit.
- 10 The medal may be awarded only on incontestable proof of performance
- 11 of the deed.

- 12 (c) The legislature may award the medal by concurrent
- 13 resolution. The legislature shall not, during a single regular
- 14 session, award the medal to more than the following 2 individuals:
- 15 (i) One service member who served between January 1, 1836 and
- 16 December 31, 1955.
 - (ii) One service member who served on or after January 1, 1956.
- 18 (d) Upon passage of the concurrent resolution described in
- 19 subdivision (c), the speaker of the house of representatives and
- 20 the senate majority leader shall award the medal in the presence of
- 21 the legislator or legislators who sponsored the concurrent
- 22 resolution and the representative and senator of the district where
- 23 the individual being awarded the medal resides or last resided.
- 24 (e) If the legislature determines that a recommendation does
- 25 not meet the standards for awarding the medal, the legislature may
- 26 determine that the recommendation meets the standards for the
- 27 Michigan legislative medal of valor under section 116.
- 28 (3) The council administrator, or his or her designee, shall
- 29 determine the design of the medal consistent with this subsection.

- 1 The design of the medal must meet all of the following
- 2 requirements:
- 3 (a) Be able to be worn around the neck.
- 4 (b) Be a circle that is 5 inches in diameter and 0.04 inches
- 5 thick.
- 6 (c) Be made of sterling silver and be plated with not less
- 7 than 18-karat gold.
- 8 (d) The front side of the medal must include all of the
- 9 following, arranged in the following order from the top of the
- 10 medal to the bottom:
- 11 (i) "Michigan Legislative Medal of Honor" printed in an arch.
- 12 (ii) A raised print of the eastern facade of the State Capitol
- 13 Building, including the State Capitol Building's dome, northern
- 14 chamber and steps, and southern chamber and steps.
- 15 (iii) The name of the medal recipient.
- 16 (iv) The year the medal was presented.
- 17 (e) The back side of the medal must include all of the
- 18 following, arranged in the following order from the top of the
- 19 medal to the bottom:
- 20 (i) "Michigan Legislative Medal of Honor" printed in an arch.
- 21 (ii) The name of the medal recipient.
- 22 (iii) A raised print of the flag of the branch of the United
- 23 States Armed Forces that the medal recipient served in crossed with
- 24 this state's flag.
- 25 (iv) The phrase "The State of Michigan".
- 26 (v) The year that the deed for which the medal was awarded was
- 27 performed.
- 28 (4) As used in this section:
- 29 (a) "Medal" means the Michigan legislative medal of honor



- 1 described in subsection (1).
- 2 (b) "Service member" means a member or former member of the
- 3 state military establishment, another state's military
- 4 establishment, or the United States Armed Forces.
- 5 (c) "United States Armed Forces" means the United States Army,
- 6 Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Space Force, or Coast Guard,
- 7 including the reserve components.
- 8 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 9 unless all of the following bills of the 101st Legislature are
- 10 enacted into law:
- 11 (a) House Bill No. 6118.
- 12 (b) House Bill No. 6120.
