- 1 isolated, de minimis deviation from strict compliance with such
- 2 statutes, rules, regulations, executive orders, and agency orders
- 3 unrelated to the employee's exposure to COVID-19 does not deny an

- 6 (a) Create, recognize, or ratify a claim or cause of action of7 any kind.
- 8 (b) Eliminate a required element of a claim of any kind
