June 22, 2022, Introduced by Reps. Brixie and Howell and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 388, entitled "Michigan campaign finance act,"

by amending sections 5 and 7 (MCL 169.205 and 169.207), section 5 as amended by 2019 PA 93 and section 7 as amended by 2001 PA 250.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 5. (1) "Domestic dependent sovereign" means an Indian
- 2 tribe that has been acknowledged, recognized, restored, or
- 3 reaffirmed as an Indian tribe by the secretary of the interior
- 4 pursuant to the Indian reorganization act, 25 USC 5101 to 5144,

- 1 commonly referred to as the Indian reorganization act, or has
- 2 otherwise been acknowledged by the United States government as an

- 4 (2) "Election" means a primary, general, special, or millage
- 5 election held in this state or a convention or caucus of a
- 6 political party held in this state to nominate a candidate.
- 7 Election includes a recall vote.
- **8** (3) "Election cycle" means 1 of the following:
- **9** (a) For a general election, the period beginning the day
- 10 following the last general election in which the office appeared on
- 11 the ballot and ending on the day of the general election in which
- 12 the office next appears on the ballot.
- 13 (b) For a special election, the period beginning the day a
- 14 special general election is called or the date the office becomes
- 15 vacant, whichever is earlier, and ending on the day of the special
- 16 general election.
- 17 (4) "Elected official" means an individual who holds an
- 18 elective office in this state.
- 19 (5) (4) "Elective office" means a public office filled by an
- 20 election. An individual who is appointed to fill a vacancy in a
- 21 public office that is ordinarily elective holds an elective office.
- 22 Elective office does not include the office of precinct delegate.
- 23 Except for the purposes of sections 47, 54, and 55, elective office
- 24 does not include a school board member in a school district that
- 25 has a pupil membership of 2,400 or less enrolled on the most recent
- 26 pupil membership count day. However, elective office includes a

- 1 district receives an amount in excess of \$1,000.00 or expends an

- 4 Sec. 7. (1) "Filed" means the receipt by the appropriate
- 5 filing official of a statement or report required to be filed under
- 6 this act.
- 7 (2) "Filer" means a person required to file a statement or
- 8 report under this act.
- 9 (3) "Filing official" means the official designated under this
- 10 act to receive required statements and reports.
- 11 (4) "501(c)(4) organization" means a separate account
- 12 maintained by a committee or a person that is not a committee, in
- 13 which that person or committee on behalf of that separate account
- 14 claims tax-exempt status under section 501(c)(4) of the internal
- 15 revenue code, 26 USC 501, if that person or committee is connected
- 16 to any elected official by any of the following:
- 17 (a) An elected official or an individual subordinate to an

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- 23 (5) "527 organization" means a separate account maintained by

- 27 USC 527, if that person or committee is connected to any elected
- 28 official by any of the following:
 - (a) An elected official or an individual subordinate to an

- 1 elected official organizes the person or committee.
- 2 (b) An elected official or an individual subordinate to an 3 elected official raises money for the person or committee.
 - (c) An elected official receives money from the person or committee.
- 6 (6) (4)—"Fund raising event" means an event such as a dinner,
 7 reception, testimonial, rally, auction, or similar affair through
 8 which contributions are solicited or received by purchase of a
 9 ticket, payment of an attendance fee, making a donation, or
 10 purchase of goods or services.
- 11 (7) (5)—"Gift" means a payment, subscription, advance,
 12 forbearance, rendering, or deposit of money, services, or anything
 13 of value, unless consideration of equal or greater value is given
 14 in exchange.
- 15 (8) (6)—"Honorarium" means a payment of money to a person
 16 holding elective office as consideration for an appearance, a
 17 speech, an article, or any activity related to or associated with
 18 the performance of duties as an elected official. An honorarium
 19 does not include any of the following:
- 20 (a) Reimbursement for the cost of transportation,21 accommodations, or meals for the person.
- (b) Wages, salaries, other employee compensation, and expenses
 authorized to be paid by this state or a political subdivision of
 this state to the person holding elective office.
- (c) An award.
